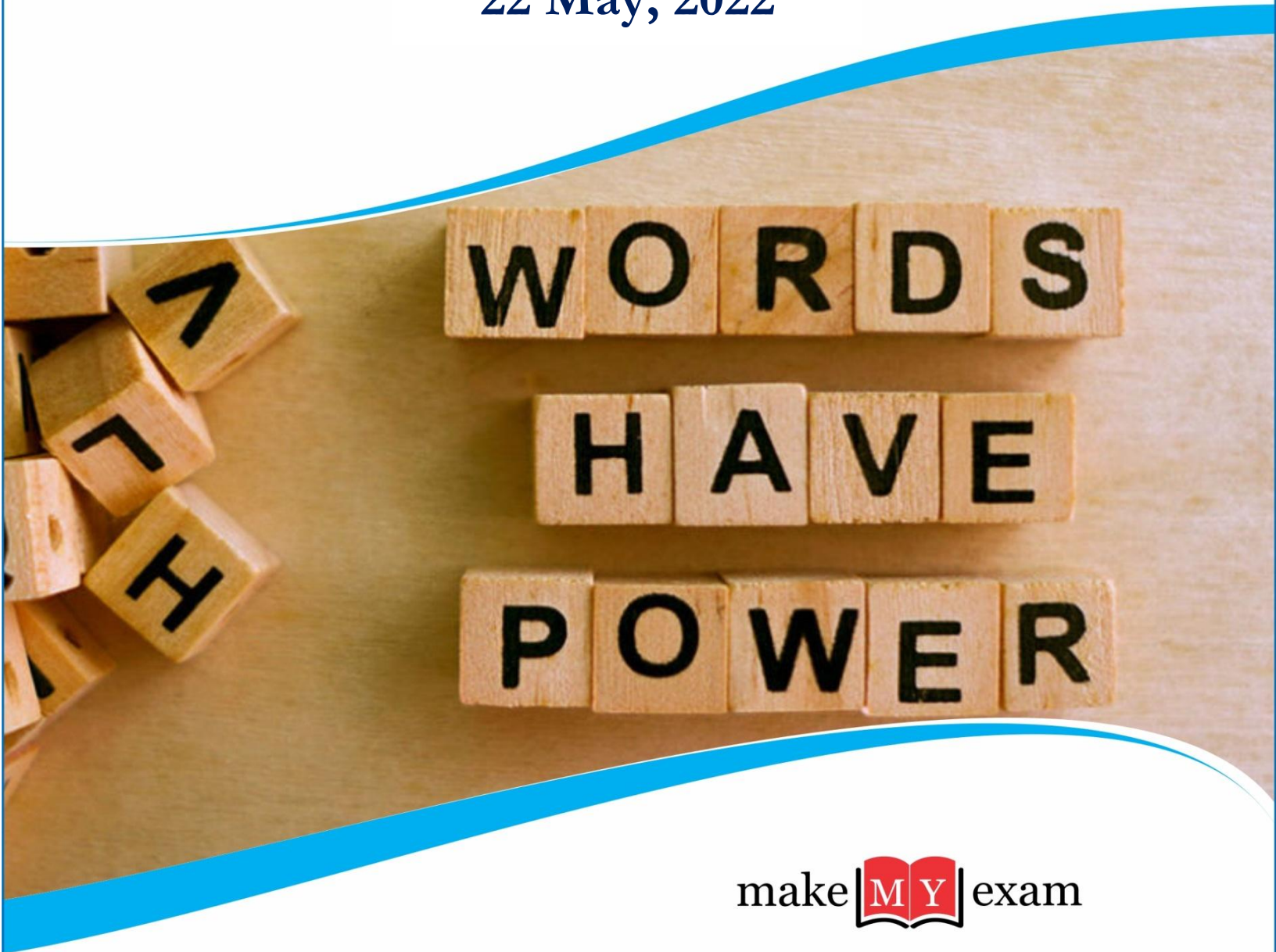

### **1. HANKER (verb) : लालायित होना**

**Pronunciation:** hang·kuh

**Meaning:** feel a strong desire for or to do something.

**Synonyms:** yearn, crave, desire

**Antonyms:** abhor, abominate, despise

**Sentence:** What did you hanker after most when you were in prison?

### **2. ASCRIBING (verb) : वर्णन करना**

**Pronunciation:** uh·skribe·uhng

**Meaning:** attribute something to (a cause).

**Synonyms:** attribute, assign, put down

**Antonyms:** fail, reject, disapprove

**Sentence:** To what do you ascribe your phenomenal success?

### **3. INDEFENSIBLE (adj.) : असमर्थनीय**

**Pronunciation:** in·duh·fens·uh·bl

**Meaning:** not justifiable by argument.

**Synonyms:** inexcusable, unjustifiable, unjustified

**Antonyms:** defensible, excusable, forgivable

**Sentence:** The war is morally indefensible.

### **4. BURNISH (verb) : चमकना**

**Pronunciation:** buh·nuhsh

**Meaning:** polish (something, especially metal) by rubbing.

**Synonyms:** polish (up), shine, brighten

**Antonyms:** rough (up), roughen, ruffle

**Sentence:** She wished her to dust the furniture, burnish the coal-scuttle, and clean the windows.

### **5. ALLUSION (noun) : संकेत**

**Pronunciation:** uh·loo·zhn

**Meaning:** an expression designed to call something to mind without mentioning it explicitly; an indirect or passing reference.

**Synonyms:** reference to, mention of, comment on

**Antonyms:** ignorance, disregard, ignoring

**Sentence:** The committee made no allusion to the former President in its report.

### **6. MERCURIAL (adj.) : अस्थिर**

**Pronunciation:** muh·kyoo·ree·uhl

**Meaning:** (of a person) subject to sudden or unpredictable changes of mood or mind.

**Synonyms:** volatile, capricious, temperamental

**Antonyms:** certain, changeless, constant

**Sentence:** Advertising is a mercurial business.

### **7. ENCUMBER (verb) : उलझाना**

**Pronunciation:** uhn·kuhm·buh

**Meaning:** restrict or burden (someone or something) in such a way that free action or movement is difficult.

**Synonyms:** hamper, hinder, obstruct

**Antonyms:** aid, assist, facilitate

**Sentence:** I don't want to encumber myself with unnecessary luggage.

### **8. MORIBUND (adj.) : मरणासन्न**

**Pronunciation:** maw·ruh·buhnd

**Meaning:** (of a person) at the point of death.

**Synonyms:** dying, near death, near the end

**Antonyms:** thriving, recovering, alive, animate

**Sentence:** The patient was moribund by the time the doctor arrived.

### **9. GUBERNATORIAL (adj.) : गवर्नर संबंधी**

**Pronunciation:** gyoo·buh·nuh·taw·ree·uhl

**Meaning:** relating to a state governor or the office of the state governor.

**Synonyms:** administrative, dominant, guiding

**Antonyms:** inferior, powerless, subordinate

**Sentence:** Four heavyside men stood in the gubernatorial anteroom.

### **10. MINUTIAE (noun) : सूक्ष्म**

**Pronunciation:** muh·nyoo·shai

**Meaning:** the small, precise, or trivial details of something.

**Synonyms:** details, niceties, subtleties

**Antonym:** big picture

**Sentence:** He had memorized the many minutiae of the legal code.

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
