

1.CAVALIER (adj.): अभिमानपूर्ण

Pronunciation: ka·vuh·leeuh

Meaning: showing a lack of proper concern; offhand.

Synonyms: arrogant, assumptive, bumptious

Antonyms: humble, lowly, modest

Sentence: The club's owner showed a cavalier attitude to the licensing laws.

2.DEARTH (noun): कमी

Pronunciation: duhth

Meaning: a scarcity or lack of something.

Synonyms: lack, scarcity, shortage

Antonyms: abundance, adequacy, opulence

Sentence: There seems to be a <u>dearth</u> of good young players at the moment.

3.SCRUPLE (noun) : संदेह

Pronunciation: skroo · pl

Meaning: a feeling of doubt or hesitation with regard to the morality or propriety of a

course of action.

Synonyms: qualms, compunction, hesitation **Antonyms**: assurance, certitude, confidence

Sentence: The villain made no <u>scruple</u> of committing murder.

4.QUANDARY (noun) : व्याकुलता

Pronunciation: kvawn·duh·ree

Meaning: a state of perplexity or uncertainty over what to do in a difficult situation.

Synonyms: dilemma, plight, predicament

Antonyms: isorganize, disorganise, injudiciousness, corner

Sentence: The government appears to be in a quandary about what to do with so many

people.

5.ABNEGATE (verb): अस्वीकार करना

Pronunciation: ab·nuh·gayt

Meaning: renounce or reject (something desired or valuable).

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Synonyms: renounce, reject, refuse **Antonyms**: adhere, accept, admit

Sentence: He attempts to <u>abnegate</u> personal responsibility.

6.THROES (noun) : पीड़ा

Pronunciation: throze

Meaning: intense or violent pain and struggle, especially accompanying birth, death, or

great change.

Synonyms: agony, pain, paroxysm

Antonyms: comfort, peace

Sentence: The country is presently in the throes of the worst recession since the second

world war.

7.DELIVERANCE (noun) : मुक्ति

Pronunciation: duh·li·vuh·ruhns

Meaning: the action of being rescued or set free.

Synonyms: liberation, release, freeing

Antonyms: damnation, destruction, downfall, condemnation

Sentence: We pray for <u>deliverance</u> from our sins.

8.PERFIDY (noun): विश्वासघात

Pronunciation: **puh**·fuh·dee

Meaning: deceitfulness; untrustworthiness. Synonyms: treachery, duplicity, deceit

Antonyms: allegiance, constancy, devotedness

Sentence: As devotion unites lovers, so <u>perfidy</u> estranges friends.

9.CATACLYSMIC (adj.) : दुर्घटना

Pronunciation: ka·tuh·kliz·muhk

Meaning: relating to or denoting a violent natural event.

Synonyms: disastrous, catastrophic, calamitous

Antonyms: non-destructive, protective

Sentence: These countries are on the brink of <u>cataclysmic</u> famine.

10.SLIPSHOD (adj.): असावधानीपूर्ण

Pronunciation: slip·shawd

Meaning: (typically of a person or method of work) characterized by a lack of care,

thought, or organization.

Synonyms: careless, lackadaisical, slapdash

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Antonyms: attentive, careful, conscientious

Sentence: He'd caused many problems with his <u>slipshod</u> management.



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
