



1. Smriti Mandhana reclaims No. 1 spot in ICC Women's ODI batting rankings

• Reclaiming the Top Spot: Smriti Mandhana has regained her position as the No. 1 ranked batter in ODI cricket, a feat she last achieved in 2019. She now holds 735 rating points, surpassing England's Nat Sciver-Brunt by four points.



- Recent Performance: Mandhana's recent performances contributed to her rise to the top. She scored a 58 against Australia, which earned her seven additional rating points, and previously scored 51 against South Africa and 116 against Sri Lanka in a tri-series final.
- Surpassing Laura Wolvaardt: Mandhana leapfrogged South Africa's Laura Wolvaardt, who slipped to second place with 717 rating points, tied with Nat Sciver-Brunt. Wolvaardt's recent scores of 27 and 28 in ODIs against the West Indies led to a loss of 19 rating points.
- **Current Rankings**: In the bowling rankings, England's Sophie Ecclestone continues to dominate, while in the all-rounders category, Australia's Ashleigh Gardner remains on top.

2. Carlos Felipe Jaramillo appointed as World Bank VP for EAP

• **New Role**: Carlos Felipe Jaramillo has been appointed as the Vice President for East Asia and Pacific at the World Bank,





- effective September 15, 2025. He will oversee the Bank's relations with 23 countries in the region and manage a portfolio of over \$32 billion.

3. Dr. Sima Sami Bahous reappointed as Executive Director of UN Women

achievement surpasses major urban centers like Bengaluru, Jaipur, and Lucknow.



10. Sarada Hoffman, Kalakshetra Bharatanatyam Guru passed away



- **Life and Legacy**: Sarada Hoffman, a renowned Bharatanatyam dancer and guru, passed away at the age of 96. She was a pivotal figure in codifying and refining the Kalakshetra style of Bharatanatyam.
- Association with Kalakshetra: Hoffman was closely associated with Kalakshetra Foundation, one of India's most prestigious dance institutions, where she trained under Rukmini Devi Arundale.



- **Notable Students**: Hoffman trained many prominent dancers, including Yamini Krishnamurthy, C.V. Chandrasekhar, V.P. Dhananjayan, and Shanta Dhananjayan. Her teachings continue to influence Bharatanatyam stages worldwide.
- Awards and Recognition: Hoffman received several prestigious awards, including the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award in 1996 and the Rukmini Devi Medal for Excellence in the Arts. These honors acknowledge her contributions as a performer, teacher, and guardian of the classical tradition.
