1.INUNDATION (noun): सैलाब

Pronunciation: i·nuhn·day·shn

Meaning: a great flow of water or of something that overwhelms

Synonyms: overflow, deluge, torrent

Antonyms: drought, dribble, drip

Sentence: The family's shed was washed away in the last inundation.

2.GRIEVOUS (adj.) : क्षतिकर

Pronunciation: greev·uhs

Meaning: (of something bad) very severe or serious.

Synonyms: serious, severe, grave

Antonyms: gratifying, pleasing, comfortable

Sentence: The loss of his father was a grievous blow.

3.PRETENSE (noun) : दिखावा

Pronunciation: pruh·tens

Meaning: an attempt to make something that is not the case appear true.

Synonyms: make-believe, act, faking

Antonyms: sincerity, seriousness

Sentence: I'm just astounded by you and your pretense.

4.FRATERNIZE (verb) : भाईचारा

Pronunciation: fraternize

Meaning: associate or form a friendship with someone, especially when one is not supposed to.

Synonyms: associate, mix, socialize

Antonyms: dissociate, disunite, alienate

Sentence: Soldiers who fraternize with the enemy will be punished.

5.MORSEL (noun) : निवाला

Pronunciation: maw·sl

Meaning: a small piece or amount of food; a mouthful.

Synonyms: mouthful, bite, nibble

Antonyms: chunk, gob, hunk

Sentence: The prisoners ate every last morsel.

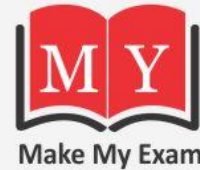
6.GARNER (verb) : इकट्ठा करना**Pronunciation:** gaa·nuhr**Meaning:** gather or collect (something, especially information or approval).**Synonyms:** gather, collect, accumulate**Antonyms:** disintegrate, dissolve, separate**Sentence:** A prisoner garnering food bit by bit and hiding it in his pillow.**7.CAVALIER (adj.) :** अभिमानपूर्ण**Pronunciation:** ka·vuh·leeuh**Meaning:** showing a lack of proper concern; offhand.**Synonyms:** arrogant, assumptive, bumptious**Antonyms:** humble, lowly, modest**Sentence:** The club's owner showed a cavalier attitude to the licensing laws.**8.ABNEGATE (verb) :** अस्वीकार करना**Pronunciation:** ab·nuh·gayt**Meaning:** renounce or reject (something desired or valuable).**Synonyms:** renounce, reject, refuse**Antonyms:** adhere, accept, admit**Sentence:** He attempts to abnegate personal responsibility.**9.DELIVERANCE (noun) :** मुक्ति**Pronunciation:** duh·li·vuh·ruhns**Meaning:** the action of being rescued or set free.**Synonyms:** liberation, release, freeing**Antonyms:** damnation, destruction, downfall**Sentence:** We pray for deliverance from our sins.**10.MULTIFARIOUS (adj.) :** विविध**Pronunciation:** muhl·tuh·feuh·ree·uhs**Meaning:** many and of various types.**Synonyms:** multiform, multiple, different**Antonyms:** monolithic, alike, identical**Sentence:** Spain is a composite of multifarious traditions and people.

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
