



1. Dr. Navin Ramgoolam become Prime Minister of Mauritius

In a major political shift, Mauritius' opposition appears set for victory in the recent legislative elections, as Prime Minister Pravind Jugnauth conceded defeat on November 11. Opposition leader Dr. Navin Ramgoolam has taken office as prime minister for a third time, leading his Alliance of Change coalition. Mauritius conducted its 12th parliamentary elections since gaining independence.

- The opposition, led by Dr. Navin Ramgoolam and the Alliance of Change coalition, is set for a major victory in Mauritius' recent election.
- Incumbent Prime Minister Pravind Jugnauth conceded, acknowledging the Alliance Lepep's significant defeat and wishing the new government well.

- India and Mauritius have a strong, historically rooted relationship, marked by shared cultural and demographic ties.

2. Shigeru Ishiba Re-Elected as PM of Japan

Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba has secured his position after winning a run-off vote in parliament, following a setback in last month's election that saw his coalition lose its majority in the lower house. Ishiba, 67, assumed the role of prime minister from Fumio Kishida, who resigned in September amid a series of scandals that undermined public trust in the Liberal Democratic Party (LDP). In a special parliamentary session on Monday, Ishiba



triumphed over Yoshihiko Noda, leader of the opposition Constitutional Democratic Party of Japan. Going forward, Ishiba will face challenges, including internal party divisions, economic difficulties, and a shifting international landscape.

Foot Notes:

- Ishiba, as leader of a minority government, faces the challenge of gaining opposition support for future bills and budgets, raising concerns of political gridlock.
- A former defence minister, Ishiba earned a reputation for openly criticizing party figures like Kishida and Abe, gaining voter support but causing friction within the LDP.
- He became LDP leader and prime minister on October 1, following a close race among candidates.
- The LDP, Japan's long-ruling party, is increasingly unpopular due to economic issues like inflation, a sluggish economy, and a weak yen.
- Ishiba has promised LDP reforms, economic revival, and increased defence spending.
- He has supported socially liberal policies like marriage equality and separate surnames for couples, though he now seeks more discussion to align with the LDP's conservative views.

3. GM Aravindh Chithambaram won the Chennai Grand Masters title



Aravindh Chithambaram, who initially aimed to avoid finishing last, stunned everyone including himself by clinching the title at the second edition of the Chennai Grandmasters classical chess tournament. He triumphed over Levon Aronian (USA) with a 2-0 victory in a blitz tie-breaker on Monday at the Anna Centenary Library auditorium.

- Aravindh surged into title contention by winning his second consecutive game.
- He defeated GM Parham Maghsoodloo in the final round with black pieces, playing the Queen's Gambit Declined and securing a crucial victory to force a three-way tie at the top.
- Aronian and Arjun faced off in a two-game blitz play-off, with both winning with black pieces to set up a sudden-death decider.
- In the title match, Aravindh capitalized on a late mistake by Aronian to win the first blitz game, and then held firm with black to clinch the title.
- All three players tied on 4.5 points after 7 rounds took home Rs 11 lakh each.

4. India achieved Sixth rank globally in WIPO Patent Filing 2023

India has achieved a significant milestone in intellectual property (IP) rights, now ranking among the top 10 countries globally for patents, trademarks, and industrial designs, according to the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO)'s 2024 World Intellectual Property Indicators (WIPI). This accomplishment highlights India's progress in innovation, driven by consistent growth across various IP sectors and government efforts to foster IP development.



Foot notes:

- India's industrial design applications grew by 36.4% in 2023, with sectors like Textiles, Tools, and Health contributing to nearly half of the filings.
- Between 2018 and 2023, patent and design filings in India more than doubled, reflecting a rise in design innovation and manufacturing.
- India ranked fourth globally in trademark filings, with a 6.1% increase in 2023. Nearly 90% of these filings were from residents, with Health, Agriculture, and Clothing sectors leading.
- India now holds over 3.2 million active trademark registrations, the second-highest globally, strengthening brand protection efforts.
- Global patent applications reached a record 3.55 million in 2023, driven by Asian countries, including India, which saw its patent filings grow significantly.



- Asia's share of global patent filings rose from 58.4% in 2013 to 68.7% in 2023.
- India's patent-to-GDP ratio increased from 144 to 381 over the last decade, reflecting growth in IP alongside economic expansion.
- The government's IP policies and investments in innovation are positioning India as a key global IP hub.

5. Donald Trump appointed Pete Hegseth as defense secretary

Pete Hegseth, a veteran of the U.S. Army National Guard, has been praised by Donald Trump for using his platform to "fight for our Military and Veterans." Trump commended Hegseth's advocacy for military personnel and veterans, recognizing his lifelong dedication as a "Warrior for the Troops" and for the country. On Tuesday, Trump announced that he had chosen Hegseth as his Secretary of Defense, describing him as tough, smart, and a strong supporter of the "America First" agenda.

- Pete Hegseth is a Princeton and Harvard graduate and an Army Combat Veteran, having served in Guantanamo Bay, Iraq, and Afghanistan.
- He was awarded two Bronze Stars and a Combat Infantryman's Badge for his battlefield actions.
- Trump praised Hegseth for using his Fox News platform to advocate for military personnel and veterans.
- Hegseth's book, The War on Warriors, highlights the leftwing betrayal of military personnel and advocates for a return to a merit-based, accountable military.
- He has led two Veterans Advocacy organizations, fighting for troops and veterans.
- Trump emphasized that Hegseth would be a strong, patriotic champion of the "Peace through Strength" policy.
