1.COMPENSATE (verb) - क्षतिपूर्ति करना

Pronunciation: kom·puhn·seit

Meaning: to give a form of payment for a good or service or as a means of making up for a misdeed

Synonyms: recompense, repay, reimburse, atone, indemnify

Antonyms: penalize, deprive, damage

Usage: To avoid jail time, the young man had to compensate his neighbor for the destruction of his fence by personally building a new border.

2.COLLABORATION (noun) - सहकार्यता

Pronunciation: kuh·la·buh·rei·shn

Meaning: the action of working with someone to produce something

Synonyms: cooperation, alliance, partnership, participation, combination

Antonym: resistance

Usage: The two playwrights worked in close collaboration on the script.

3.COMPENDIUM (noun) - संग्रह

Pronunciation: kuhm·pen·dee·uhm

Meaning: a collection of concise but detailed information about a particular subject, especially in a book or other publication

Synonyms: collection, compilation, anthology, treasury

Antonym: unabridgement

Usage: Jenna is in charge of editing the compendium of creativity that comprises the arts section of the newspaper.

4.UNTOWARD (adjective) - प्रतिकूल

Pronunciation: uhn·tuh·wawd

Meaning: unexpected and inappropriate

Synonyms: inappropriate, unexpected, unanticipated, unforeseen, unpredicted

Antonyms: expected, timely, appropriate

Usage: The animals did not show any untoward effect during the trial and post trial phases.

5.TREMBLE (verb) - कांपना

Pronunciation: trem·bl

Meaning: shake involuntarily, typically as a result of anxiety, excitement, or frailty

Synonyms: shake, quiver, twitch, palpitate, quaver, waver, tremor

Antonyms: steady, stabilize, calm

Usage: Isabella was trembling with excitement.

6.ENCOMPASS (verb) – सम्मिलित करना

Pronunciation: uhn·kuhm·puhs

Meaning: to include or contain

Synonyms: include, contain, comprise, embrace, incorporate

Antonyms: exclude, remove, evict

Usage: Our trip around the world will encompass all of the places we have always wanted to visit.

7.CANDOR (noun) – स्पष्टवादिता, निष्कपटता

Pronunciation: kan·der

Meaning: the quality of being open and honest

Synonyms: frankness, openness, honesty, sincerity, forthrightness, directness

Antonyms: deceit, dishonesty, unfairness

Usage: She spoke with remarkable candor about her experiences.

8.HURTLE (verb) – जल्दी चलना

Pronunciation: huh·tl

Meaning: move at a rapid pace in a wild manner

Synonyms: speed, rush, race, chase, bolt

Antonyms: dawdle, amble, laze

Usage: His motorboat hurtled along the river.

9.EXOTIC (adjective) – विदेशी

Pronunciation: uhg·zo·tuhk

Meaning: originating in or characteristic of a distant foreign country

Synonyms: foreign, tropical, alien, imported, introduced, faraway

Antonyms: native, nearby

Usage: If you would like to buy exotic spices, you need to go to an international market.

10.MUNIFICENT (adjective) – उदार

Pronunciation: myoo·ni·fuh·snt

Meaning: characterized by or displaying great generosity

Synonyms: generous, bountiful, magnanimous, philanthropic, princely, charitable

Antonyms: mean, miserly

Usage: The munificent man is a well-known philanthropist who funds many university scholarships.

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
