1. SOPORIFIC (noun) - निद्रादायक

Pronunciation: so·puh·ri·fuhk

Meaning: a drug or other substance that induces drowsiness or sleep **Synonyms**: sedative, calmative, tranquillizer, narcotic, opiate, hypnotic

Antonyms: stimulant, refresher

Usage: Because of the medicine's soporific properties, the doctor told me to only take it at

bedtime.

2. QUIESCENT (adjective) - मौन, स्थिर

Pronunciation: kwee·eh·snt

Meaning: in a state or period of inactivity or dormancy

Synonyms: inactive, inert, latent, fallow, passive, idle, inoperative

Antonyms: active

Usage: While the bees are quiescent early in the morning and in the evening, they are

overactive in the middle of the day.

3. SUMPTUOUS (adjective) - वैभवशाली

Pronunciation: suhmp·tyoo·uhs

Meaning: splendid and expensive-looking

Synonyms: lavish, luxurious, splendid, deluxe, opulent, magnificent, resplendent

Antonyms: humble, plain, cheap

Usage: The restaurant's <u>sumptuous</u> buffet had some of the finest foods from all over the

world.

4. ILLUSTRIOUS (adjective) - प्रसिद्ध

Pronunciation: uh·luh·stree·uhs

Meaning: well known, respected, and admired for past achievements



Synonyms: eminent, distinguished, acclaimed, noted, notable, prominent

Antonyms: unknown, obscure

Usage: He enjoyed a long and <u>illustrious</u> career as a radio producer.

5. EXAGGERATE (verb) – अतिशयोक्ति करना

Pronunciation: uhg·za·juh·reit

Meaning: represent something as being larger, better, or worse than it really is **Synonyms**: overstate, overemphasize, overstress, overvalue, magnify, amplify

Antonyms: understate, downplay, underrate **Usage**: He tends to <u>exaggerate</u> the difficulties.



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6. CODDLE (verb) – लाड़ प्यार करना

Pronunciation: ko·dl

Meaning: treat someone in an indulgent or overprotective way

Synonyms: pamper, cosset, mollycoddle, spoil, indulge, overparent

Antonyms: neglect, abandon, forsake

Usage: Many people <u>coddle</u> their children too much.

7. DESULTORY (adjective) - अनियमित, असंबद्ध



Pronunciation: deh·suhl·tuh·ree

Meaning: lacking a plan, purpose, or enthusiasm

Synonyms: casual, lukewarm, cursory, superficial, token, perfunctory, passing

Antonyms: keen, systematic, lasting

Usage: The committee meetings are desultory in practice because they generally have no

real purpose other than as a social gathering.

8. INCURSION (noun) - आक्रमण

Pronunciation: uhng·kuh·shn

Meaning: an invasion or attack, especially a sudden or brief one

Synonyms: attack, raid, foray, infiltration, inroad, intrusion, penetration

Antonyms: retreat, withdraw

Usage: When the troops made an incursion across the border, they ruined any chance for

peace between the two countries.

9. FATUOUS (adjective) – मूर्खतापूर्ण

Pronunciation: fa·choo·uhs **Meaning**: silly and pointless

Synonyms: silly, foolish, stupid, inane, nonsensical, childish, puerile

Antonyms: intelligent, sensible

Usage: It was a fatuous choice to carry so many glass cups at once.

10. PARSIMONIOUS (adjective) – कंजूस

Pronunciation: paa·suh·mow·nee·uhs

Meaning: very unwilling to spend money or use resources

Synonyms: mean, miserly, niggardly, ungenerous, penurious, illiberal, stinting

Antonyms: generous, extravagant, lavish

Usage: To save money, the <u>parsimonious</u> old man always bought used clothes.
