

1. DETRIMENTAL (adj.): हानिकारक

Pronunciation: deh·truh·ment·uhl **Meaning:** tending to cause harm.

Synonyms: harmful, damaging, noxious **Antonyms:** harmless, hurtless, innocent

Sentence: Moving her could have a <u>detrimental</u> effect on her health.

2. DISGRUNTLED (adj.) : असंतुष्ट

Pronunciation: duhs · gruhn · tld **Meaning:** angry or dissatisfied.

Synonyms: dissatisfied, discontent, aggrieved

Antonyms: content, pleased, satisfied

Sentence: <u>Disgruntled</u> employees recently called for his resignation.

3. PIETY (noun) : धर्मनिष्ठा

Pronunciation: pai·uh·tee

Meaning: the quality of being religious or reverent.

Synonyms: devoutness, devotion, piousness **Antonyms:** atheism, godlessness, unholiness **Sentence:** This is clearly a work of filial piety.

4. VALOROUS (adj.) : वीरतापूर्ण

Pronunciation: va·luh·ruhs

Meaning: showing great courage in the face of danger, especially in battle.

Synonyms: bold, brave, courageous **Antonyms:** coward, ungallant, unheroic

Sentence: The warriors were very <u>valorous</u> in the battle.

5. COROLLARY (noun) : परिणाम

Pronunciation: kuh·raw·luh·ree

Meaning: a proposition that follows from (and is often appended to) one already proved.

Synonyms: conclusion, after-effect, consequence

Antonyms: cause, occasion, reason

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Sentence: The huge increases in unemployment were the <u>corollary</u> of expenditure cuts.

6. PERVERSITY (noun) : प्रतिकूलता

Pronunciation: puh·vuhs·uh·tee

Meaning: a deliberate desire to behave in an unreasonable or unacceptable way;

contrariness.

Synonyms: contrariness, perverseness, awkwardness

Antonyms: amiability, serenity

Sentence: She's marrying him out of sheer <u>perversity</u>.

7. RAPACIOUS (adj.) : लालची

Pronunciation: ruh·pay·shuhs

Meaning: aggressively greedy or grasping. Synonyms: grasping, greedy, avaricious Antonyms: satisfied, stuffed, generous

Sentence: Hawks and other <u>rapacious</u> birds prey on a variety of small animals.

8. LAGGARD (noun) : सुस्त

Pronunciation: lag·uhd

Meaning: a person who makes slow progress and falls behind others.

Synonyms: straggler, loiterer, sluggard **Antonyms:** expeditious, scrambler

Sentence: Bhutan has been a laggard in securing alternative energy resources overseas.

9. EERIE (adj.) : भयानक

Pronunciation: eerie

Meaning: strange and frightening. **Synonyms:** uncanny, sinister, ghostly **Antonyms:** normal, ordinary, usual

Sentence: I walked down the <u>eerie</u> dark path.

10. RECTITUDE (noun) : इंसाफ

Pronunciation: rek·tuh·chood


Meaning: morally correct behavior or thinking; righteousness.

Synonyms: righteousness, goodness, virtue

Antonyms: evil, immorality, iniquity **Sentence:** Maddie is a model of <u>rectitude</u>.

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
