

VOCABULARY

1. ARCHAIC (ADJECTIVE): प्राचीन

Pronunciation: aa•kay•uhk

Meaning: belonging to an earlier time; no longer in common use; ancient or old-fashioned.

Synonyms: antiquated, outdated, obsolete, old-fashioned

Antonyms: modern, current, contemporary, up-to-date

Sentence: The language used in the ancient text is considered *archaic* and is not spoken today.

2. PATRIARCHAL (ADJECTIVE): पुरुषप्रधान

Pronunciation: pay•tree•aak•uhl

Meaning: relating to or characteristic of a system of society or govt. controlled by men

Synonyms: male-dominated, male-centric, paternalistic, fatherly

Antonyms: egalitarian, gender-neutral, unisex

Sentence: The *patriarchal* society was marked by traditional gender roles, with men holding positions of power and authority.

3. ABYSMAL (ADJECTIVE): अत्यंत

Pronunciation: uh•biz•muhl

Meaning: extremely bad or of very low quality; exceptionally poor or dismal.

Synonyms: appalling, dreadful, terrible, atrocious

Antonyms: excellent, outstanding, Wonderful, superb

Sentence: The team's performance in last match was *abysmal*, errors and lack of coordination.

4. DISENTITLEMENT (NOUN): अधिकारहीनता

Pronunciation: dis-in-ti-tle-ment

Meaning: the act or state of being deprived of entitlement or rights; the loss or removal of the right to receive certain benefits, privileges, or considerations.

Synonyms: deprivation, loss of rights, divestment, Dispossession

Antonyms: entitlement, privilege, right, Authorization

Sentence: The *disenfranchisement* of the employee was a consequence of violating company policies.

5. ENABLER (NOUN): समर्थक

Pronunciation: uhn•ay•buhl•uh

Meaning: someone who helps another person continue a destructive or unhealthy pattern.

Synonyms: facilitator, supporter, accomplice, abettor

Antonyms: deterrent, Hindrance, Preventer, inhibitor

Sentence: An *enabler* may financially support addiction, unintentionally harmful behavior.

6. FURORE (NOUN): हंगामा

Pronunciation: fyoo•raw•ree

Meaning: a state of intense excitement, anger, or controversy.

Synonyms: outrage, Uproar, craze, rage

Antonyms: Calm, Peace, Quiet, Silence

Sentence: The sudden increase in prices of essential goods led to a *furore* among consumers, prompting calls for government intervention.

7. VEXATIOUS (ADJECTIVE): अफ़सोसनाक

Pronunciation: veks•ay•shuhs

Meaning: causing annoyance, frustration, or distress, often persistently or repeatedly.

Synonyms: annoying, Irritating, vexing

Antonyms: pleasant, soothing, comfortable

Sentence: Dealing with faulty internet connection on a daily basis was a *vexatious* issue for remote workers.

8. EXPULSION (NOUN): निष्कासन

Pronunciation: uhk•spuhl•zhn

Meaning: the act of forcing someone to leave a place, or group, often as a disciplinary action.

Synonyms: ejection, Eviction, exclusion, dismissal

Antonyms: admission, Acceptance, Welcoming

Sentence: The company announced the *expulsion* of the employee who was found guilty of leaking confidential information.

9. ASTOUNDING (ADJECTIVE): चकित करने वाला

Pronunciation: uh•stawnd•uhng

Meaning: extremely surprising or shocking.

Synonyms: incredible, Stunning, Amazing

Antonyms: Predictable, Expected, Ordinary

Sentence: The transformation of old building into luxurious hotel was nothing short of *astounding*.

10. SIPHONED (VERB): निकाल लिया

Pronunciation: sai•fnd

Meaning: the unauthorized or secret transfer of funds or resources.

Synonyms: funneled, Extracted, Pumped

Antonyms: Infused, Contributed, Inserted

Sentence: The hackers managed to *siphon* confidential data from the company's database, leading to a major security breach.
