NATIONAL NEWS

1.PM Modi Inaugurates State-of-the-Art Medical Facility in Thimphu

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Bhutanese counterpart Tshering Tobgay jointly inaugurated a modern hospital in the Bhutanese capital, Thimphu. The Gyaltsuen Jetsun Pema Wangchuk Mother and Child Hospital is a shining example of the strong development cooperation between India and Bhutan.
- The hospital is a state-of-the-art 150-bedded facility that has been built with Indian assistance. The construction was carried out in two phases, with the first phase costing ₹22 crore and becoming operational in 2019. The second phase, completed recently, was undertaken as part of Bhutan's 12th Five Year Plan at a cost of ₹119 crore.

2.ASI Begins Excavation in Madhya Pradesh To Find India's Oldest Temple

- The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) is conducting excavations at two mounds in Nachne village, located in the Panna district of Madhya Pradesh. The goal of these excavations is to uncover what could potentially be the oldest temple in India.
- The excavation sites are situated just 30 meters away from two ancient temples – a Gupta-era Parvati temple and the Chaumukh Nath temple built by the Kalachuri dynasty. These temples, known as the Nachna Hindu temples, are among the earliest surviving stone temples in central India, alongside those found in Bhumara and Deogarh.

3.Allahabad High Court Strikes Down Madrasa Education Act

- The Allahabad High Court's Lucknow bench has declared the UP Board of Madarsa Education Act of 2004 as unconstitutional. The court ruled that the act violated the principle of secularism, as well as several articles of the Constitution, including Articles 14, 21, and 21-A. Additionally, the court found that the act also contravened Section 22 of the University Grants Commission Act of 1956.
- The court has directed the Uttar Pradesh government to provide regular school education to students enrolled in madarasas (Islamic seminaries). The ruling states that these students should be accommodated in primary, high school, and intermediate education boards of the state.

4.Gujarat State Education Minister Launches Shiksha Reform

- Gujarat's Minister of State for Education, Praful Pansheriya, launched the online learning platform Shiksha Reform in Surat. The event was attended by noted educationist Deepak Rajguru, trustees, principals, Kimmo

Nikkanen from Finland's Kajaani University of Applied Sciences, and educationist Antti Isovita.

- Shiksha Reform is a collaborative effort with Microsoft and a leading Finnish university. It aims to deliver high-quality courses by experienced and highly qualified teachers to revolutionize education, particularly in technology.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

1.6 new sites of Madhya Pradesh have been included in the temporary list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites in March 2024

- Madhya Pradesh an offbeat destination of first choice is poised to get global recognition and tourism boost with UNESCO including six destinations of Madhya Pradesh in its tentative world heritage list. These are Gwalior Fort, the Historical Group of Dhanmar, Bhojeshwar, Mahadev temple of Bhojpur, Rock Art sites of Chambal valley, Khooni Bhandara of Buhranpur & Gond Memorial of Mandla.
- This is in addition to the 3 UNESCO World Heritage sites in the permanent list. These include The Khajuraho Group of Monuments (1986), Buddhist Monuments of Sanchi (1989), and The Rock Shelters of Bhimbetka (2003) which are major attractions especially for international tourists.

2. Iconic Indian Brand Amul Launches Fresh Milk in the US

- In a significant move, the Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF), the organization behind the iconic Amul brand, is set to launch its fresh milk products in the United States for the first time. This expansion marks a major milestone for the brand, as it aims to cater to the Indian diaspora and Asian population in the US.
- Within a week, GCMMF will introduce four variants of fresh milk in the US market. The milk collection and processing will be handled by MMPA, while GCMMF will be responsible for the marketing and branding of Amul fresh milk.

3. Mumbai overtakes Beijing to become Asia's billionaire capital for the first time

- Mumbai has pipped Beijing to become Asia's billionaire capital for the first time. Indian billionaires' cumulative wealth reached US\$1 trillion, surpassing China's average wealth per billionaire (US\$3.2 billion vs US\$3.8 billion), according to the 2024 Hurun Global Rich List.
- This phenomenal rise is mirrored by India's addition of 94 new billionaires in a single year, surpassing China's 55 and solidifying India's position as the second-largest contributor to the global billionaire population.

4.ICG Ship Samudra Paheredar Reaches Manila Bay,Philippines

- In a significant move aimed at showcasing India's commitment to maritime cooperation and environmental stewardship, the Indian Coast Guard ship 'Samudra Paheredar' has docked at Manila Bay, Philippines, on a three-day visit.
- The arrival of this specialized Pollution Control Vessel marks a pivotal moment in India's engagement with ASEAN countries, emphasizing shared concerns regarding marine pollution and bolstering bilateral ties with the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG).

NEW APPOINTMENTS AND PERSON IN NEWS

1.Simon harris has become the youngest Prime Minister of Ireland

- Simon Harris is set to become Ireland's youngest prime minister after he was appointed as the new leader of the governing Fine Gael party. Harris, 37, the higher education minister, was the only candidate when nominations closed at 1pm on Sunday, but he will not become taoiseach until 9 April when the Irish parliament, the Dáil, resumes after its Easter break.
- He outlined his leadership priorities on Sunday at a selection convention in Athlone, County Westmeath, to choose party candidates for the European parliament elections in June.8.Girija Subramaniam has been elected CMD of new India Assurance Company

2.Govind Dholakia was appointed the new chairman of Surat Diamond Bourse

- Diamond Baron Govind Dholakia has been appointed as the new chairman of Surat Diamond Bourse (SDB) --- India's second diamond trading hub that was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, three months ago.The move to appoint a new head of SDB was necessitated after Vallabh Lakhani stepped down from the post earlier this week.
- When asked the reason for Lakhani to step down three months after the inauguration of SDB, a committee member told businessline, "Vallabh Lakhani had earlier indicated that he will hand hold the project only till its

completion and handover. He had expressed his inability to continue taking responsibility”.

3.Abhay Thakur appointed as India’s next ambassador to Myanmar

- Senior Indian diplomat Abhay Thakur has been appointed as the country’s next ambassador or top envoy to Myanmar. This was announced by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on March 26. Abhay Thakur is a 1992-batch officer of the Indian Foreign Service (IFS). He is currently working as an Officer on Special Duty in the Ministry of External Affairs.
- Thakur’s appointment as India’s envoy to Myanmar comes at a crucial juncture or important time. Myanmar has been witnessing widespread violent protests demanding the restoration of democracy since the military seized power in a coup on February 1, 2021.

4.Hansha Mishra Appointed as Director in UPSC

- Hansha Mishra, an officer of the Indian Audit and Accounts Service (IA&AS) from the 2010 batch, has been appointed as Director in the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), Delhi. Her appointment comes after she was recommended for central deputation by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India.
- According to an order issued by the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) on 21.03.2024, the central government has approved Mishra’s appointment to the post under the central staffing scheme. Her tenure as Director in the UPSC will be for a period of five years or until further orders, whichever is earlier.

5. Neeraj Chopra Named Eveready’s new Brand Ambassador

- Eveready Industries India (EIL), a leading battery brand, has announced a partnership with Neeraj Chopra, the reigning Olympic gold medalist and World no. 1 in men’s javelin throw, as its new brand ambassador.
- Through this collaboration, Eveready aims to strengthen its commitment to excellence and innovation by launching the new Ultima Alkaline battery series. The brand hopes to enhance its connection with the youth by offering long-lasting and value-for-money solutions for high-drain devices used by the new-age generation in India.

6.Bassirou Diomaye Faye Named as Senegal’s next President

- Bassirou Diomaye Faye, a previously little-known tax inspector freed from jail two weeks ago, looks likely to become Senegal’s next president after a vote that observers say is proof of the country’s democratic resilience.
- While the electoral commission is expected to announce final results in the coming days, early tallies showed Faye winning an outright majority in

election. His main rival, ruling party candidate Amadou Ba, conceded defeat late. And outgoing President Macky Sall congratulated the 44-year-old on the results.

BANKING AND FINANCE

1.India will host the India Mobile Congress and the World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly in the year 2024

- Minister of Communications Ashwini Vaishnaw today launched the Curtain Raiser of World Telecom Standardization Assembly Delhi 2024 (WTSA 2024) and India Mobile Congress (IMC 2024). The International Telecommunication Unions' (ITU) prestigious WTSA event will be held from 15-24 Oct 2024 preceded by Global Standards Symposium (GSS 2024) on 14 Oct 2024 and eighth edition of Asia's premier digital technology exhibition, IMC 2024 from 15-19 Oct 2024 at Pragati Maidan in New Delhi.
- While emphasising the importance of collaboration and cooperation among stakeholders to propel the sector forward, the Telecommunications Minister announced telecom reforms and reiterated the government's commitment to driving reforms in the telecom sector to create a conducive environment for investment and innovation. During the event, he also unveiled the policy on Spectrum Regulatory Sandbox that holds the potential of advancing India's telecommunications landscape and fostering global collaboration in the field. Minister also announced a complete abolition of Wireless Operating License (WOL) that further simplifies the licensing processes in telecom.

2.Income Tax Department Levies Rs 103.63 Crore Penalty on Tata Chemicals

- The Income Tax Department has imposed a penalty of Rs 103.63 crore on Tata Chemicals for violation related to disallowance of interest. The penalty has been imposed under Section 270A of the Income Tax Act for disallowance of interest under section 36(1)(iii) of the Act.
- Based on the merits of the matter, prevailing law and the advice of the counsel, Tata Chemicals said it is planning to appeal against this order before the National Faceless Appeal Centre (appellate authorities).

3.Modi Government Allocates Rs 6212.03 Crore for Strengthening Regional Rural Banks

- The Modi government has allocated Rs 6212.03 crore to Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) as part of the recapitalization scheme on March 6. RRBs, established in 1975 and owned by the Indian government, function at the regional level across various states. They were set up with the objective of offering fundamental banking and financial services to rural regions,

specifically targeting small and marginal farmers, agricultural laborers, artisans, and small entrepreneurs.

- Consolidated Capital to Risk-weighted Assets Ratio (CRAR) reached an all-time high of 13.83 percent by December 31, 2023, indicating strengthened financial position.

4. Asset Reconstruction Companies Secure 55% of KSK Mahanadi Power's ₹29,330 Crore Debt

- Six asset reconstruction companies (ARCs), including Aditya Birla and Kotak Mahindra-backed ARCs, have accumulated 55% of KSK Mahanadi Power's ₹29,330-crore debt from lenders in separate transactions.
- Purpose of Acquisition: The ARCs acquired the debt with the expectation of potential demand for thermal power companies, anticipating a significant upside. This acquisition occurred due to lenders' exit from the company after facing over a four-year delay in its debt resolution process.

5.Private Banks Expand ATM Network While PSU Banks Decrease

- In the 12 months ending January 2024, public sector banks (PSUs) reduced their Automated teller machine (ATM) network by 1,343 machines to 1,36,173 ATMs. In contrast, private banks expanded their ATM network by adding 3,502 ATMs, bringing their total to 79,225 machines. This highlights the diverging strategies between PSU and private banks regarding ATM deployment and network expansion.
- PSBs have primarily reduced their offsite ATM deployment, which decreased to 93,381 from 96,243 a year ago and 87,160 two years ago. This reduction may be attributed to factors such as profitability concerns due to capped charges and uncertainty surrounding new regulations that could increase operational costs.

SCIENCE TECH

1.AgniKul Cosmos postpones maiden rocket launch due to 'technical issue'


- Agnikul Cosmos, the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT)-Madras incubated startup, has postponed its maiden rocket launch due to a 'technical issue'. The Chennai-headquartered company had initially scheduled the launch of the mission 'Agnibaan SOrTeD' (Sub Orbital Technology Demonstrator) for March 22, 2024.
- The launch was planned to take place from its private launch pad located within the campus of ISRO at Sriharikota in Andhra Pradesh, approximately 100 km from Chennai. The Agnibaan SOrTeD mission is described as an innovative, single-stage Sub-Orbital Technology Demonstrator.

2.Government notifies PIB's Fact Check Unit under IT Rules 2021

- The government has notified the ‘Fact Check Unit’ (FCU) under the Press Information Bureau (PIB) of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, as the fact check unit of the Centre.
- The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) notified the PIB FCU under the provisions of the sub-clause (v) of sub-rule (1) of rule 3 of the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021.

3. IAU approves ‘Statio Shiv Shakti’ as name for Chandrayaan-3 landing site

- Nearly seven months after Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced that Chandrayaan-3’s landing site will be called “Shiva Shakti”, International Astronomical Union (IAU) approved the name on March 19.
- According to the Gazetteer of Planetary Nomenclature, planetary nomenclature, like terrestrial nomenclature, is used to uniquely identify a feature on the surface of a planet or satellite so that it can be easily located, described, and discussed.

4. Scientists uncover Milky Way’s ancient building blocks, Shakti and Shiva

- Astronomers have identified two ancient streams of stars - named after the Hindu deities Shakti and Shiva - that appear to be among the Milky Way's earliest building blocks, offering new insight into how our galaxy came together long ago.
- Shakti and Shiva are comprised of stars with similar chemical compositions that formed 12-13 billion years ago, the researchers said. Each of the structures has a mass about 10 million times greater than our sun.

5. Election Commission Keeps Close Eye On Election Process Through The ‘CVIGIL’ App

- The Election Commission is keeping a close eye on the election process through the cVIGIL app. It is a single app for recording, reporting and resolving violations of model code of conduct. Through this app, online complaints regarding violations of model code of conduct can be made by capturing photos, videos etc.

- The cVIGIL app of Election Commission has become an effective tool in the hands of people to flag election code violations. The citizens can report Model Code of Conduct and expenditure violations through this app. Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv kumar said that the cVIGIL empowers citizens to report model code of conduct violations and assured action within 100 minutes.

6. Bharat Biotech Starts Clinical Trials Of Tuberculosis Vaccine MTBVAC In India

- Bharat Biotech has begun clinical trials of the Spanish anti- tuberculosis vaccine among adults in India, the Hyderabad-based pharmaceutical company announced. The vaccine candidate called MTBVAC is the first live attenuated vaccine of mycobacterium tuberculosis isolated from a human.
- BCG (Bacillus, Calmette and Guérin), is an attenuated variant of the bovine TB pathogen. It is at least a 100 years old and has a limited effect on pulmonary tuberculosis, which is responsible for the transmission of the disease.

7. ISRO's POEM-3 mission accomplishes zero orbital debris mission

- The PSLV-C58 Mission was accomplished on January 1, 2024. After completing the primary mission of injecting all satellites into their desired orbits, the terminal stage of PSLV was transformed into a 3-axis stabilized platform, the POEM-3. The stage was de-orbited from 650 km to 350 km, which facilitated its early re-entry, and was passivated to remove residual propellants to minimize any accidental break-up risks.
- POEM-3 was configured with a total of 9 different experimental payloads to carry out technology demonstrations and scientific experiments on the newly developed indigenous systems. Out of these, 6 payloads were delivered by NGEs through IN-SPACe. The mission objectives of these payloads were met in a month.

8. IIT Guwahati Transfers Pioneering Swine Fever Vaccine Technology to BioMed Pvt

- The Indian Institute of Technology-Guwahati (IIT-G) has transferred a first-of-its-kind vaccine technology to BioMed Pvt. Ltd., a company specializing in vaccine manufacturing. This revolutionary technology involves a recombinant vector vaccine specifically designed to combat the classical swine fever virus in pigs and wild boars. It fills a significant gap in India's vaccine landscape.
- The vaccine utilizes a reverse genetic platform pioneered and refined at IIT-G, according to a statement from the institute on March 26. Classical swine

fever is a highly contagious disease among pigs, posing a severe threat with a very high mortality rate, although it does not affect humans.

BOOKS

1.Phool Bahadur, The First Magahi Novel in English

- The Dibrugarh University International Literary Festival held on 19-21 March 2024 witnessed the launch of a remarkable literary work – the English translation of the first Magahi novel, ‘Phool Bahadur’. The translation was done by Abhay K, a renowned writer from Nalanda, Bihar.
- ‘Phool Bahadur’ was originally written by Jayanath Pati and published in 1928. Despite being the first Magahi novel, it failed to gain much popularity among readers initially. However, it has now been rediscovered and is gaining fame thanks to Abhay K’s English translation. The translator stumbled upon this literary gem while editing ‘The Book of Bihari Literature’.

AWARDS

1.Beena Aggarwal and James Boyce were honored with the Global Inequality Research Award

- Bina Agarwal and James Boyce have been awarded the first “Global Inequality Research Award” for their significant contributions to understanding global inequalities, specifically in the areas of social and environmental inequalities. The laureates will be invited to receive their awards and present an overview of their work at conferences in Paris in the fall and spring of 2024.
- These conferences will be organized in conjunction with Sciences Po’s Social-Ecological Transitions (SET) initiative. The University of Manchester’s Global Development Institute (GDI) for Bina Agarwal. The University of Massachusetts Amherst’s Political Economy Research Institute (PERI) for James Boyce.

2.Carlos Sainz wins Formula One Australian Grand Prix

- Lying in bed just nine days ago with the wound from his appendectomy still tender, Carlos Sainz had held no expectation of even competing in the Australian Grand Prix. Yet there was the Spaniard in Melbourne afternoon, roared on by an appreciative crowd when he climbed from his car after a victory as unlikely as it was valiant.
- An achievement with doubtless special resonance for Sainz, the driver who had comeback from surgery and helped return Ferrari’s first one-two since 2022 as world champion Max Verstappen’s dominant run of victories came

to an explosive end, but who, as yet, does not have a Formula One drive for next season.

3. Michel Talagrand Awarded the 2024 Abel Prize

- Michel Talagrand receives the prize for his work in probability theory and stochastic processes. From the outset, the development of probability theory was motivated by problems that arose in the context of gambling or assessing risks.
- The common theme in Michel Talagrand's groundbreaking discoveries is working with and understanding the random processes we see all around us. It has now become apparent that a thorough understanding of random phenomena is essential in today's world. For example, random algorithms underpin our weather forecasting and large language models.

1. India's Sathiyam Gnanasekaran Clinches Men's Singles Title At World Table Tennis Feeder

- In Table Tennis, India's Sathiyam Gnanasekaran has clinched the Men's Singles title at WTT Feeder Beirut tournament in Lebanon yesterday. World Number 103 Sathiyam defeated compatriot and World Number 74 Manav Vikas Thakkar, 3-1 (6-11, 11-7, 11-7, 11-4) victory over compatriot Manav Vikas Thakkar in the final yesterday. Earlier, Sathiyam overpowered World Number 39 Chinese Taipei's Chuang Chih-yuan in the semi-finals.
- However, Manav had a heartbreaking day as he missed out on any gold medal despite making it in all three finals. He lost 1-3 to a Cuban pair in the men's doubles final, partnering Manush Utpal Shah. Earlier, he lost in the mixed doubles final to another Indian pair of Diya Chitale and Manush Shah.

2. Nagaland was the third edition of North East Games 2024 launched

- In Nagaland, the 3rd edition of North East Games 2024 kick-started with a glittering opening ceremony at Regional Centre for Sporting Excellence,

Sovima last evening. Nagaland Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio officially declared open the 3rd North East Games 2024.

- Akashvani's correspondent reports, that more than 3000 athletes from eight North Eastern states are competing in 15 disciplines being held in 12 venues across three districts Chumoukedima, Dimapur and Kohima. Highlights of today's event include Archery, Athletics, Badminton Basketball, Boxing, football, lawn tennis, Pencak Silat, S, Table Tennis, Taekwondo, Volleyball, And Wushu.

3.Sharath Kamal to be India's flag-bearer at the 2024 Paris Olympics

- Ranked World No. 88, Kamal has won the national table tennis championship a record 10 times. He has also claimed 13 medals at the Commonwealth Games (CWG), including seven golds, and has earned two medals at the Asian Games. The legendary player is a three-time bronze medalist at the World Championships.
- Joining Kamal in the spotlight is MC Mary Kom, who has been named as the chef de mission for the Paris 2024 Summer Games. Mary Kom is the first female boxer in history to have captured six world titles.

4.Historic Day-Night Women's Ashes Test at MCG

- In a historic move, the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG) will host a day-night Test match between the Australian and English women's cricket teams. This will be the first time a pink-ball Test is played at the iconic venue. The four-day match is scheduled from January 30 to February 2, 2025.
- The Test match holds special significance as it will mark the 90th anniversary of the first-ever women's Test, played in December 1934. Additionally, it will be the first time the Australian women's team plays a Test at the MCG since 1949.

OBITUARY

1.Razia Baig of Qadir Ali Baig Foundation passed away at 73

- Razia Baig, chairperson of Qadir Ali Baig Theatre Foundation and wife of the late Qadir Ali Baig, passed away. She was 73. She co-founded Qadir Ali Baig Theatre Foundation with her son Mohammad Ali Baig.
- Remembered for her husband's 'New Theatre Hyderabad' adaptations, she also shared her love for Hyderabad cuisine through newspaper columns. Surrounded by family and theatre luminaries, she left an indelible mark on the theatre fraternity. Her son Mohammad Ali Baig hailed her as a guiding light and mentor.

2.Karnataka writer Gurulinga Kapse passes away

- Former chairman of Karnataka Sahtya Academy and writer Professor Gurulinga Kapse died after prolonged illness. He was 96 and is survived by two sons and as many daughters.
- Born in B K Loni village of Indi taluk in Vijayapura district, Kapse had written a thesis on the life and works of litterateur Madhura Channa. He has also written on philosophy, sprituality and Kannada prose and poetry besides editing several felicitation volumes.

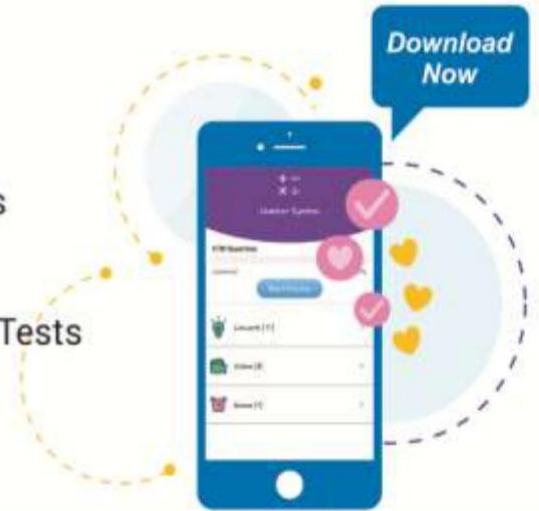
