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Exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. 1. PROVISIONAL (adjective) – अनंतिम

Pronunciation: pruh·vi·zhuh·nuhl

Meaning: arranged or existing for the present, possibly to be changed later

Synonyms: interim, temporary, transitional, changeover, stopgap, tentative, provisionary

Antonyms: permanent, definite

Usage: The provisional committee was selected to serve until a formal committee could be

chosen.

2. FRENETIC (adjective) – 3ਜਮਨ

Pronunciation: fruh·neh·tuhk

Meaning: fast and energetic in a rather wild and uncontrolled way

Synonyms: wild, frenzied, hectic, fraught, feverish, fevered

Antonyms: calm, peaceful, balanced

Usage: After two hours of <u>frenetic</u> frolic, the puppies finally curled up in a ball for a nap.

3. ASCETIC (adjective) – संयमी

Pronunciation: uh·seh·tuhk

Meaning: leading a life of self-denial

Synonyms: austere, abstinent, abstemious, frugal, simple, rigorous, strict

Antonyms: sybaritic, luxurious, extravagant

Usage: The minister encouraged his church members to pursue ascetic lives without

earthly pleasures.

4. IMMINENT (adjective) – अभी होने वाला

Pronunciation: i·muh·nuhnt **Meaning**: about to happen

Synonyms: impending, close, near, approaching, coming, forthcoming

Antonyms: distant, later, remote

Usage: When the Secret Service arrived, everyone knew the president's arrival was

imminent.

5. PIED (adjective) – बहुरंगा

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Pronunciation: paid

Meaning: having two or more different colors

Synonyms: multicolored, variegated, particoloured, tabby, skewbald, dappled, brindled

Antonyms: monochrome

Usage: Although the father's coat was pure solid brown, the mother's was pied.



6. ENTITY (noun) – अस्तित्व

Pronunciation: en·tuh·tee

Meaning: something that exists independently

Synonyms: body, existence, individual, article, being, creature

Antonyms: nonentity, abstract

Usage: Wanting to build his own entity, the man left his job and started his own company.

7. EXPEDIENT (adjective) – उचित

Pronunciation: uhk·spee·dee·uhnt **Meaning**: suitable to the circumstances

Synonyms: appropriate, advantageous, suitable, desirable, feasible, practical, effective

Antonyms: disadvantageous, impossible, inappropriate **Usage**: It is expedient to reduce unnecessary expenditure.

8. PROBITY (noun) - ईमानदारी

Pronunciation: prow·buh·tee

Meaning: the quality of a person who is completely honest

Synonyms: honesty, integrity, morality, rectitude, sincerity, righteousness

Antonyms: corruption, dishonesty, unfairness

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Usage: Because Jared was known as a person of <u>probity</u>, people were not afraid to trust him with their money.

9. FREAKY (adjective) - असामान्य

Pronunciation: free kee

Meaning: grossly unconventional or unusual

Synonyms: bizarre, grotesque, odd, outlandish, strange, weird, peculiar

Antonyms: common, familiar, normal **Usage**: The movie was really <u>freaky</u>.

10. SHORTCOMING (noun) - कमी

Pronunciation: shawt·kuh·muhng **Meaning**: a deficiency or failing

Synonyms: defect, fault, drawback, flaw, weakness, imperfection, deficiency

Antonyms: advantage, strength, benefit

Usage: He is so forthright about his shortcomings that it's hard to chastise him.



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
