3. Oscar Piastri Wins 2025 Saudi Arabian Grand Prix

Oscar Piastri made history at the 2025 Saudi Arabian Grand Prix by claiming his first-ever Formula 1 victory. The McLaren driver executed a flawless race, managing tire degradation and strategic pit stops to fend off challenges from rivals. In a tense final laps showdown, Piastri held off a fast-charging Max Verstappen, whose late push fell just



short. The win marks a significant milestone for both Piastri and McLaren, showcasing their progress and growth throughout the season. The race in Jeddah provided thrilling action, with several on-track battles and dramatic moments, but Piastri's composure under pressure set him apart. His triumph was celebrated by his team and fans alike, propelling him into the spotlight as one of F1's rising stars.

4. Indian Chess Grandmaster Koneru Humpy Won FIDE Women's Grand Prix

This victory further solidifies her position as one of the top female chess players in the world. 5. Vithya, Yashas Won 400 M Hurdles Titles In National Federation Senior Athletics Competition 2025

Vithya and Yashas emerged victorious in the 400m hurdles titles at the National Federation Senior Athletics Competition 2025. Both athletes delivered outstanding performances, showcasing speed, endurance, and flawless technique. Their wins highlight their dedication and rigorous training leading up to the event. the women's category, while Yashas impressed with a commanding run in the men's event. These victories mark significant milestones in their athletic careers and bring

6. Klaus Schwab Resigns as Chairman of World Economic Forum

Klaus Schwab, the 87-year-old founder of the World Economic Forum (WEF), has resigned as chairman, ending over five decades at the helm of the influential organization. Schwab, who established the WEF in 1971, announced his immediate departure during an extraordinary board meeting on April 20, 2025. His



resignation comes amid an independent investigation into allegations of financial and ethical misconduct involving Schwab and his wife, Hilde, including misuse of WEF funds and resources . Both have denied the accusations and are pursuing legal action against the whistleblower. The WEF board has appointed former Nestlé CEO Peter Brabeck-Letmathe as interim chairman while initiating a search for a permanent successor .

10. Former Australian opener Keith Stackpole, passed away

Former Australian Test opener Keith Stackpole has passed away at the age of 84, reportedly due to a suspected heart attack. Stackpole was a prominent figure in Australian cricket during the 1960s and 1970s, earning recognition for his aggressive batting style. He played 43 Test matches





for Australia between 1966 and 1974, amassing 2,807 runs at an average of 37.42, including seven centuries. Notably, he scored a double century against England during the 1970-71 Ashes series, showcasing his prowess as an opening batsman. Beyond his playing career, Stackpole contributed to the sport as a mentor and commentator, influencing future generations of cricketers. He is survived by his wife, Pat, and their children, Peter, Tony, and Angela.

- Career Highlights: Stackpole played 43 Test matches and 6 One Day Internationals for Australia between 1966 and 1974. He was known for his aggressive batting style and formed a potent opening partnership with Bill Lawry, with whom he averaged 44.89 runs together in Tests.
- Awards and Recognition: Stackpole was awarded an MBE in 1974 for his services to cricket. He was also named a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1973, recognizing his outstanding performance in the 1972 Ashes series.
- Commentary Career: After retiring from cricket, Stackpole became a renowned radio and TV commentator, working with the Nine and Seven Networks, and the ABC. He mentored several Victorian players, including Dean Jones and Brad Hodge, and retired from commentary in 2005.

Cricket Australia chair Mike Baird praised him as a great contributor to the game, citing his passion and influence in the sport. Cricket Victoria chair Ross Hepburn described him as a giant of the game and a true statesman of Victorian cricket.
