1. DELINQUENCY (noun) : अपराध

Pronunciation: duh·ling·kvuhn·see

Meaning: minor crime, especially that committed by young people.

Synonyms: crime, wrongdoing, criminality Antonyms: compliance, goodness, morality

Sentence: There is a high rate of juvenile <u>delinquency</u> in this area.

2. STOICAL (adj.): अडिग

Pronunciation: stoh.uhk.uhl

Meaning: enduring pain and hardship without showing one's feelings or complaining.

Synonyms: uncomplaining, patient, forbearing **Antonyms:** complaining, fed up, impatient

Sentence: His great-grandfather had been a dedicated and <u>stoical</u> traveler.

3. BESEECH (verb) : प्रार्थना करना

Pronunciation: buh-seech

Meaning: ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat.

Synonyms: implore, beg, entreat **Antonyms:** refuse, reject, dismiss

Sentence: I <u>beseech</u> you to forgive me.

4. REDACT (verb) : संपादन करना

Pronunciation: ruh dakt

Meaning: edit (text) for publication. **Synonyms:** redraft, revamp, revise **Antonyms:** add, allow, expand

Sentence: You can <u>redact</u> a word simply by selecting it with your mouse cursor.

5. BENIGHTED (adj.): अनाड़ी

Pronunciation: buh·nite·uhd

Meaning: in a state of pitiful or contemptible intellectual or moral ignorance, typically

owing to a lack of opportunity.

Synonyms: unenlightened, uneducated, illiterate

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Antonyms: educated, knowledgeable, literate

Sentence: They saw themselves as bringers of culture to poor <u>benighted</u> peoples.

6. INFER (verb) : तर्क करना

Pronunciation: uhn-fuh

Meaning: deduce or conclude (information) from evidence and reasoning rather than from

explicit statements.

Synonyms: deduce, reason, conclude **Antonyms:** abstain, disbelieve, neglect

Sentence: What do you infer from her refusal?

7. ARIDITY (noun) : सूखेपन

Pronunciation: Aridity

Meaning: as in dehydration, dryness

Synonyms: dehumidification, dehydration, dryness

Antonyms: dampness, humidity, moisture

Sentence: Due to the high elevation and <u>aridity</u>, temperatures drop sharply after sunset.

8. FLIMSY (adj.) : कमज़ोर

Pronunciation: flim·zee

Meaning: comparatively light and insubstantial; easily damaged.

Synonyms: insubstantial, slight, light

Antonyms: sturdy, substantial

Sentence: The storm flattened the <u>flimsy</u> wooden huts that the villagers lived in.

9. PANDEMONIUM (noun) : विप्लव

Pronunciation: pan·duh·moh·nee·uhm

Meaning: wild and noisy disorder or confusion; uproar.

Synonyms: bedlam, chaos, mayhem

Antonyms: calm, hush, peace

Sentence: There was <u>pandemonium</u> when the news was announced.

10. KITH (noun) : स्वजन

Pronunciation: kith

Meaning: one's friends, acquaintances, and relations.


Synonyms: family, kin, relations

Antonyms: stranger, antagonist, unfamiliar people

Sentence: I had a reunion today with all my <u>kith</u> and kin.

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
