

## 1. MACHIAVELLIAN (ADJECTIVE): कपटपूर्ण

Pronunciation: ma·kee·uh·veh·lee·uhn

Meaning: describes actions or individuals who are scheming, manipulative, and often

willing to deceive to achieve their goals. **Synonyms:** Cunning, scheming, devious

Antonyms: Honest, straightforward

Sentence: The CEO's Machiavellian management style alienated many employees who

valued transparency and integrity.

#### 2. THITHER (ADVERB): उधर

Pronunciation: dhi dhuh

**Meaning:** to that place; in that direction.

**Synonyms:** There, Yonder **Antonyms:** Hither, Here

**Sentence:** The map showed the way to the enchanted forest; they followed the trail thither.

## 3. CONVENE (VERB): ब्लाना

Pronunciation: kuhn·veen

Meaning: to gather, assemble, or bring people or things together for a specific purpose,

meeting, or activity.

**Synonyms:** Gather, Summon **Antonyms:** Disband, Separate

**Sentence:** The board of directors convenes annually to review the company's performance.

### 4. LINGER (VERB): ठहराना

Pronunciation: ling·guh

Meaning: to continue to exist, endure, or be felt for a longer time than usual.

**Synonyms:** Loiter, Hover **Antonyms:** Depart, Hasten

Sentence: The scent of flowers lingered in the air, filling the garden with a delightful

fragrance.

## 5. IMPENDING (ADJECTIVE):आसन्न

Pronunciation: im·pen·ding

Meaning: imminent or about to happen, often used to describe something threatening or

significant that is expected to occur in the near future.

Synonyms: Looming, Approaching

**Antonyms:** Distant, Remote

**Sentence:** She had a sense of unease due to the impending job interview.

### 6. METICULOUS (ADJECTIVE): सूक्ष्म

Pronunciation: meh·ti·kyoo·luhs

Meaning: showing great attention to detail, thoroughness, and precision in work or

actions.

**Synonyms:** Careful, Diligent **Antonyms:** Sloppy, Negligent

Sentence: The artist was known for her meticulous attention to every brushstroke, creating

intricate and lifelike paintings.

### 7. REVERIE (NOUN): मनकीलहर

Pronunciation: reh·vuh·ree

**Meaning:** a state of being lost in thought, often characterized by daydreaming,

contemplation, or pleasant fantasies.

**Synonyms:** Fantasy, Reflection

**Antonyms:** Reality, Focus

Sentence: The sound of the waves crashing against the shore often lured him into a state of

reverie.

## 8. GROPED (VERB): टटोलना या ढूंढना

**Pronunciation:** gropet

Meaning: to search or feel around with one's hands in an uncertain or clumsy manner.

**Synonyms:** Scrabble, Fumble **Antonyms:** Discern, Visualize

**Sentence**: The hiker groped through the dense forest, using his hands to guide him as the

moonlight barely penetrated the canopy.

## 9. FLOCKING (VERB): एकत्र होना

Pronunciation: flawk·uhng

Meaning: the act of gathering or coming together in a group or crowd, often used to

describe the movement of birds or animals in a collective manner.

**Synonyms:** Congregating, Swarming **Antonyms:** Scattering, Disbanding

**Sentence:** Shoppers were flocking to the newly opened store to take advantage of the grand opening sales.

#### 10. JEERS (NOUN AND VERB): मज़ाक

**Pronunciation: jeeuhz** 

Meaning: derisive or mocking shouts, laughter, or comments meant to ridicule, scorn, or

criticize someone or something. **Synonyms:** Sneers, Scoffing

Antonyms: Praise, Acclaim

**Sentence:** As the politician tried to speak, the crowd responded with jeers and boos.
