1. ADHERENCE (NOUN) : अनुपालन

Pronunciation: uhd·heeuh·ruhns

Meaning: the fact of someone behaving exactly according to rules, beliefs, etc.

Synonyms: compliance, obedience, accordance.

Antonyms: breach, infringement, violation.

Sentence: The teacher demanded the students' adherence to the rules while in her classroom.

2. EMBLEMATIC (ADJECTIVE): प्रतीकात्मक

Pronunciation: em·bluhm·a·tuhk

Meaning: serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept; symbolic.

Synonyms: symbolic, representative, metaphoric

Antonyms: realistic, actual, literal.

Sentence: The killing in Pensacola is emblematic of a lot of the violence that is happening around the world.

3. PLURALISM (NOUN): बहुलवाद

Pronunciation: ploo·ruh·li·zm

Meaning: the existence of different types of people, who have different beliefs and opinions, within the same society.

Synonyms: diversity, heterogeneity, multiplicity

Antonyms: uniformity, similarity, consistency

Sentence: We know it's not easy to maintain the pluralism.

4. ETCH (ADJECTIVE) : खोदना

Pronunciation: ech

Meaning: engrave (metal, glass, or stone) by coating it with a protective layer, drawing on it with a needle.

Synonyms: engrave, carve, inscribe

Antonyms: erase, obliterate, expunge

Sentence: He etched his name on a piece of glass.

5. AMALGAMATION (NOUN) : मिश्रण

Pronunciation:uh·mal·guh·ay·shn

Meaning: the action, process, or result of combining or uniting.

Synonyms: combination, union, fusion

Antonyms: division, separation, split

Sentence: I think it's this amalgamation of fact, fiction, and potential which made it such a great story.

6. IMPERIALISM (NOUN) : साम्राज्यवाद

Pronunciation:im·peeuh·ree·uh·li·zm

Meaning: a policy of extending a country's power and influence through colonization, use of military force, or other means.

Synonyms: colonialism, domination, expansionism.

Antonyms: antimilitarism, pacifism, antiaggression

Sentence: It has been said that the deepest impulse of British imperialism has been to extend English ways of thought throughout the world.

7. VIGIL (NOUN) : जलूस

Pronunciation:vi·jl

Meaning: a period of keeping awake during the time usually spent asleep, especially to keep watch or pray.

Synonyms: watch, surveillance, lookout

Antonyms: ignorance, indifference, neglect.

Sentence: Eva and Paul kept a constant vigil by their daughter's hospital bedside.

8. PRUDENCE (NOUN) : सावधानी

Pronunciation:proo·dns

Meaning: behavior that is careful and avoids risks.

Synonyms: caution, circumspection, care

Antonyms: recklessness, brashness, carelessness

Sentence: The captain said we ought to shorten sail anyway, out of common prudence.

9. VOCIFEROUS (ADJECTIVE) : मुखर

Pronunciation:vuh·si·fuh·ruhs

Meaning: expressing or characterized by vehement opinions; loud and forceful.

Synonyms: outspoken, vocal, blatant

Antonyms: silent, quiet, still

Sentence: The protestors were vociferous as they screamed outside of the government building.


10. ABSOLVE (VERB): दोषमुक्त करना**Pronunciation:**uhb•zawlv**Meaning:** to say formally that somebody does not have to take responsibility for something.**Synonyms:** discharge, acquit, release**Antonyms:** blame, charge, arraign**Sentence:** The pardon absolved them of all the crimes.

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
