**1.PROLIFERATE (verb):** संख्या में बढ़ना

**Pronunciation:** pro·lif·er·ate

**Meaning:** increase rapidly in numbers; multiply.

**Synonyms:** increase rapidly, grow rapidly, multiply

**Antonyms:** decrease, dwindle

**Sentence:** These are the science fiction magazines that proliferated in the 1920s.

**2.REPUDIATED (verb) :** को अस्वीकार नहीं किया

**Pronunciation:** ruh·pyoo·dee·ayt·uhd

**Meaning:** refuse to accept or be associated with.

**Synonyms:** reject, renounce, abandon

**Antonyms:** accepted, adopted, embraced

**Sentence:** Socialism had been repudiated at the polls.

**3.DIURNAL (adj.) :** प्रतिदिन

**Pronunciation:** dai·uh·nuhl

**Meaning:** occurring, done, produced, or appearing every day

**Synonyms:** daily, day-to-day, quotidian

**Antonyms:** monthly, weekly, yearly

**Sentence:** A love as constant and certain as the diurnal tides.

**4.RECALCITRANT (adj.) :** आज्ञा न माननेवाला

**Pronunciation:** ruh·kal·suh·truhnt

**Meaning:** having an obstinately uncooperative attitude toward authority or discipline.

**Synonyms:** uncooperative, obstinately disobedient, intractable

**Antonyms:** amenable, biddable, compliant

**Sentence:** The University suspended the most recalcitrant students.

**5.INCENDIARY (adj.) :** आग लगाने वाला

**Pronunciation:** uhn·sen·deeu·ree

**Meaning:** (of a device or attack) designed to cause fires.

**Synonyms:** combustible, flammable, inflammable

**Antonyms:** loyal, peacemaking

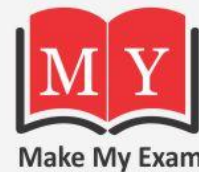
**Sentence:** Five incendiary devices were found in her house.

**6.NAUGHT (noun) :** शून्य**Pronunciation:** nawt**Meaning:** the numerical symbol 0 or the absence of number or quantity represented by it**Synonyms:** nil, nothing, zero**Antonyms:** everything**Sentence:** He's naught but a worthless fool.**7.EMPYREAN (adj.) :** स्वर्ग**Pronunciation:** em·py·re·a**Meaning:** relating to heaven or the sky.**Synonyms:** heavenly, celestial, ethereal**Antonyms:** hellish, infernal**Sentence:** Movie scenes set in heaven often suggest that harps are the favored instruments for empyrean music.**8.OBSEQUIIOUS (adj.) :** चापलूस**Pronunciation:** uhb•see•kvee•uhs**Meaning:** obedient or attentive to an excessive or servile degree.**Synonyms:** servile, ingratiating, unctuous**Antonyms:** insurgent, mutinous, mulish**Sentence:** The salesman's obsequious manner was beginning to irritate me.**9.SEDATE (adj.) :** गंभीर**Pronunciation:** suh•dayt**Meaning:** calm, dignified, and unhurried.**Synonyms:** calm, tranquil, placid**Antonyms:** facetious, kittenish, ludic**Sentence:** The wedding was rather a sedate occasion.**10.PERPETUITY (noun) :** अनंत काल**Pronunciation:** puh•puh•tyoo•uh•tee**Meaning:** the state or quality of lasting forever.**Synonyms:** eternity, everlasting, limitlessness**Antonyms:** ephemerality, impermanence, temporariness**Sentence:** These lands were granted to our family in perpetuity.

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
