#### 1.SOLITUDE (noun): अकेलापन

**Pronunciation:** saw·luh·chood **Meaning:** the state or situation of being alone. **Synonyms:** loneliness, solitariness, remoteness **Antonyms:** camaraderie, companionship, company **Sentence:** She savored her few hours of freedom and <u>solitude</u>.

#### 2.RETRIBUTION (noun) : प्रतिदण्ड

Pronunciation: reh·truh·byoo·shn
Meaning: punishment inflicted on someone as vengeance for a wrong or criminal act.
Synonyms: punishment, penalty
Antonyms: clemency, mercy, leniency
Sentence: They fled because they feared retribution for the genocide.

# 3.DIFFUSELY (adv.) : विस्तारपूर्वक

Pronunciation: diffusely
Meaning: in a detailed way.
Synonyms: verbosely, wordily, redundantly
Antonyms: briefly, compactly, concisely
Sentence: As a result, they diffract X-rays <u>diffusely</u>.

#### 4.DISCERNMENT (noun) : सूझ-बूझ

**Pronunciation:** duh·suhn·muhnt **Meaning:** the ability to judge well. **Synonyms:** judgment, refinement, perception **Antonyms:** foolishness, idiocy, imbecility **Sentence:** It's clear that you are a person of <u>discernment</u>.

#### 5.REPENTANCE (noun) : पछतावा

**Pronunciation:** ruh·pent·uhns **Meaning:** the action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse. **Synonyms:** remorse, contrition, contriteness **Antonyms:** impenitence, remorselessness



Sentence: Confession is the first step to repentance.

#### 6.DIATRIBE (noun) : अभियोगात्मक भाषण

Pronunciation: dai·uh·tribe
Meaning: a forceful and bitter verbal attack against someone or something.
Synonyms: tirade, harangue, verbal onslaught
Antonyms: encomium, eulogy, panegyric
Sentence: The book is a <u>diatribe</u> against the academic left.

#### 7.OBSTINATE (adj.) : जिद्दी

Pronunciation: awb·stuh·nuht
Meaning: stubbornly refusing to change one's opinion or chosen course of action, despite attempts to persuade one to do so.
Synonyms: stubborn, headstrong, intransigent
Antonyms: acquiescent, agreeable, amenable
Sentence: He was the most obstinate man I've ever met.

#### 8.GULLIBLE (adj.) : भोला

**Pronunciation:** guh·luh·bl **Meaning:** easily persuaded to believe something; credulous. **Synonyms:** credulous, over-trusting, easily deceived **Antonyms:** cynical, sophisticated **Sentence:** He's so <u>gullible</u> he'll believe anything.

# 9.EPHEMERAL (adj.) : अल्पकालिक

Pronunciation: uh·feh·muh·ruhl
Meaning: lasting for a very short time.
Synonyms: transitory, transient, fleeting
Antonyms: eternal, everlasting, endless
Sentence: Most newspapers are of <u>ephemeral</u> interest.

# 10.DIAPHANOUS (adj.) : पारदर्शक

Pronunciation: dai·a·fuh·nuhs
Meaning: (especially of fabric) light, delicate, and translucent.
Synonyms: sheer, fine, ultra-fine
Antonyms: opaque, cloudy, foggy
Sentence: The little light fades the immense and <u>diaphanous</u> shadows.

## 11.WHIPLASH (noun): मोच आना



#### **Pronunciation:** vip·lash

Meaning: jerk or jolt (someone or something) suddenly, typically so as to cause injury. Synonyms: injury, damage Antonyms: uninjured, undamaged Sentence: She was suffering from <u>whiplash</u> injuries received in a car crash.

# 12. JAUNTY (adj) : ख़ुशदिल

Pronunciation: jaun·ty
Meaning: having or expressing a lively, cheerful, and self-confident manner.
Synonyms: cheerful, cheery, happy,
Antonyms: depressed, serious, sedate
Sentence: Her nature is jaunty.

#### 13.SLEAZE (noun) : अनैतिक

Pronunciation: sleez
Meaning: a person of low moral character
Synonyms: sleazebag, corrupt
Antonyms: gentleman, idol
Sentence: Some <u>sleaze</u> will try to make a buck off of this tragedy.

#### 14.AVARICE (noun) : लोभ

**Pronunciation:** a·vuh·ruhs **Meaning:** extreme greed for wealth or material gain. **Synonyms:** greed, acquisitiveness, cupidity **Antonyms:** contentment, satisfaction, selflessness **Sentence:** <u>Avarice</u> blinds our eyes.

# 15.CHAGRIN (verb) : चिढ़ाना

Pronunciation: sha·gruhnMeaning: feel distressed or humiliated.Synonyms: annoyed, irritated, irkedAntonyms: delight, gladnessSentence: He was <u>chagrined</u> when his friend poured scorn on him.

#### 16.CONSONANCE (noun) : समझौता

Pronunciation: kawn·suh·nuhnsMeaning: agreement or compatibility between opinions or actions.Synonyms: agreement, concord, accordAntonyms: discordance, conflict, disagreement



Sentence: This type of democracy is in <u>consonance</u> with our own African heritage.

#### 17.THAW (verb) : पिघलना

Pronunciation: thaw
Meaning: (of ice, snow, or another frozen substance, such as food) become liquid or soft due to warming.
Synonyms: liquefy, melt, fuse
Antonyms: harden, set, solidify
Sentence: The snow started to thaw as the temperature kept up.

#### 18.CONTEMN (verb) : नफ़रत करना

Pronunciation: kuhn tem
Meaning: treat or regard with contempt.
Synonyms: despise, disdain, treat with contempt
Antonyms: honor, respect, value
Sentence: Arrogant critics who <u>contemn</u> the general public's taste in art.



#### 19. DISDAIN(noun) : तिरस्कार

Pronunciation: dis.dainMeaning: the feeling that someone or something is unworthy of one's consideration or respect; contempt.Synonyms: contempt, scorn, scornfulness

Antonyms: admiration, respect

Sentence: She had never been treated with such disdain.

#### 20.EDACIOUS (adj.) : लोभी

Pronunciation: eda.cious
Meaning: having a huge appetite
Synonyms: esurient, gluttonous, greedy
Antonyms: content, glutted, sated
Sentence: Thinking of nothing special, why not have meals to satisfy the edacious

stomach?



# 21 CASCADE (verb): गिरना

Pronunciation: cas.cade
Meaning: pour downward rapidly and in large quantities.
Synonyms: pour, gush, surge
Antonyms: drip, rise
Sentence: Water was <u>cascading</u> down the stairs

#### 22.CEDE (verb) : सौंपना

Pronunciation: cedeMeaning: give up (power or territory).Synonyms: surrender, concede, relinquishAntonyms: keep, gainSentence: He ceded control of the company to his brother.

# 23.DIFFUSELY (adv.) : विस्तारपूर्वक

Pronunciation: diffusely
Meaning: in a detailed way.
Synonyms: verbosely, wordily, redundantly
Antonyms: briefly, compactly, concisely
Sentence: As a result, they diffract X-rays <u>diffusely</u>.

# 24.GUTSY (adj) : साहसी

Pronunciation: guts y
Meaning: showing courage, determination, and spirit.
Synonyms: courageous, brave, mettlesome
Antonyms: gutless
Sentence: She gave a gutsy performance in the tennis tournament.

#### 25. ADMANTINE (adj) : कड़ा

**Pronunciation:** ad · a · man · tine **Meaning:** unbreakable. **Synonyms:** indestructible, imperishable **Antonyms:** breakable, destructible **Sentence:** He bowed to her <u>adamantine</u> will.

# 26.BEWITCH (verb) : मोहित करना

**Pronunciation:** be witch **Meaning:** enchant and delight (someone).



**Synonyms:** captivate, enchant, entrance **Antonyms:** repel, repulse **Sentence:** They both were <u>bewitched</u> by the country and its culture.

# 27.EXCULTANT (adj.) : ख़ुशियां मनानेवाला

Pronunciation: ex·ult·antMeaning: triumphantly happy.Synonyms: jubilant, thrilled, triumphantAntonyms: sorrowing, gloomySentence: She felt exultant and powerful.

#### 28.PRECOCIOUS (adj.) : असामयिक

Pronunciation: pre·co·cious
Meaning: having developed certain abilities or proclivities at an earlier age than usual.
Synonyms: advanced, gifted, talented
Antonyms: backward, slow
Sentence: He was a precocious, solitary boy.

#### 29.DESPONDENT (adj.) : हताश

**Pronunciation:** de·spond·ent **Meaning:** in low spirits from loss of hope or courage. **Synonyms:** disheartened, discouraged, dispirited **Antonyms:** hopeful, cheerful **Sentence:** She grew more and more <u>despondent</u>.

# 30.OBNOXIOUS (adj.) : अप्रिय

Pronunciation: ob·nox·ious
Meaning: extremely unpleasant.
Synonyms: unpleasant, disagreeable, nasty
Antonyms: delightful, pleasant, charming
Sentence: He found her son somewhat obnoxious.

# 31.AGONIZING (adj.) : अति पीड़ा देनेवाला

**Pronunciation:** ag·o·niz·ing **Meaning:** causing great physical or mental pain. **Synonyms:** excruciating, harrowing, racking **Antonyms:** gratifying, pleasing, sweet **Sentence:** This is a torturous, <u>agonizing</u> way to kill someone.



#### 32.ELAPSE (verb) : बीतना

Pronunciation: uh·laps
Meaning: (of time) pass or go by.
Synonyms: pass, go by/past, proceed
Antonyms: halt, hold, wait
Sentence: So a week or so may elapse between the first and the last eggs hatching.

#### 33.BEGUILE (verb) : मोहना

**Pronunciation:** buh⋅gile **Meaning:** charm or enchant (someone), sometimes in a deceptive way. **Synonyms:** charm, attract, enchant **Antonyms:** repel, unappealing, bore **Sentence:** The teacher used to <u>beguile</u> her pupils with fairy tales.



# 34.TENABLE (adj.) : रक्षा-शक्तिपूर्ण

Pronunciation: teh·nuh·bl
Meaning: able to be maintained or defended against attack or objection.
Synonyms: defensible, justifiable, defendable
Antonyms: indefensible, untenable, unjustifiable
Sentence: Such a simplistic approach is no longer <u>tenable</u>.

#### 35.GELID (adj.) : ठंढा

Pronunciation: gelid
Meaning: icy; extremely cold.
Synonyms: frozen, freezing, icy
Antonyms: ardent, blazing, boiling
Sentence: I can still recall that gelid winter morning, with the cold wind whistling around my ears

#### 36.SUMPTUOUS (adj.): वैभवशाली

**Pronunciation:** suhmp.tyoo.uhs



Meaning: splendid and expensive-looking. Synonyms: lavish, luxurious, deluxe Antonyms: economical, frugal, meager Sentence: The guests turned up dressed in <u>sumptuous</u> evening gowns.

#### 37.PELT (verb) : मारना

Pronunciation: peltMeaning: attack (someone) by repeatedly hurling things at them.Synonyms: bombard, shower, attackAntonyms: defendSentence: The children pelt each other with snowballs.

#### 38.AVERSE (adj.) : विरुद्ध

Pronunciation: uh vuhs
Meaning: having a strong dislike of or opposition to something.
Synonyms: opposed to, against, antipathetic to
Antonyms: friendly, sympathetic, keen
Sentence: We are <u>averse</u> to such noisy surroundings.

#### 39.APPEASEMENT (noun) : मनौती

Pronunciation: uh · peez · muhnt
Meaning: the action or process of appeasing.
Synonyms: conciliation, placation, pacification
Antonyms: discomfort, unrest, provocation
Sentence: Music is <u>appeasement</u> to shattered nerves.

#### 40.BOUNTIFUL (adj): प्रचुर

Pronunciation: boun·ti·ful Meaning: large in quantity; abundant. Synonyms: abundant, plentiful, ample Antonyms: meager Sentence: The ocean provided a <u>bountiful</u> supply of fresh food

#### 41. DRUDGERY (noun): कठिन परिश्रम

**Pronunciation:** druhj·uh·ree **Meaning:** hard menial or dull work. **Synonyms:** hard work, menial work, labor **Antonyms:** relaxation, fun **Sentence:** He spent his life in pointlessly tiresome <u>drudgery</u>.



# 42. ANATHEMA (noun) : अभिशाप

Pronunciation: uh·na·thuh·muh Meaning: Something or someone that one vehemently dislikes. Synonyms: abhorrent, hateful, odious Antonyms: joy, pleasure Sentence: His political views were <u>anathema</u> to me.

#### 43. STAUNCHLY (adv.) : दृढता से

Pronunciation: stawnch·leeMeaning: in a very loyal and committed manner.Synonyms: dedicated, devoted, devoutAntonyms: faltering, faithless, perfidiousSentence: She staunchly defended the new policy.

#### 44. SEARING (adj) : जलाना

Pronunciation: sear ingMeaning: extremely hot or intense.Synonyms: scorching, blistering, flamingAntonyms: cold, icy, frozenSentence: The searing heat of the sun is troubling me.

#### 45. EMBEZZLEMENT (noun) : ग़बन

Pronunciation: uhm·beh·zuhl·muhnt
Meaning: theft or misappropriation of funds placed in one's trust or belonging to one's employer.
Synonyms: theft, stealing, robbing
Antonyms: give, sincerity, compensate
Sentence: They were arrested for <u>embezzlement</u> of company funds.

## 46. RABBLE-ROUSER (noun) : हंगामा करने वाला

Pronunciation: rab·ble-rous·er
Meaning: a person who speaks with the intention of inflaming the emotions of a crowd of people, typically for political reasons.
Synonyms: agitator, troublemaker, instigator
Antonyms: peacemaker, reconciler, uniter
Sentence: Rabble-rousers inciting hungry people on breadlines to demand social justice.

# 47. FEISTY (adj.) : उत्साही



#### **Pronunciation:** feist·y

Meaning: (of a person, typically one who is relatively small or weak) lively, determined, and courageous Synonyms: spirited, gutsy, gutty Antonyms: coward, gutless Sentence: She is a feisty heroine who's more than just a pretty face.

#### 48. FORFEITURE (noun) : ज़ब्ती

Pronunciation: for fei ture
Meaning: the loss or giving up of something as a penalty for wrongdoing.
Synonyms: confiscation, sequestration, loss
Antonyms: award, reward, return
Sentence: Refusal to sign meant <u>forfeiture</u> of property and exile.

#### 49. SCUFFLE (noun) : हाथापाई

**Pronunciation:** skuh·fl **Meaning:** a short, confused fight or struggle at close quarters. **Synonyms:** fight, struggle, tussle **Antonyms:** truce **Sentence:** He was involved in a <u>scuffle</u> with a photographer.

#### 50. PICKETS (noun) : पहरेदार

Pronunciation: pi·kuhtsMeaning: a person or group that watches over someone or somethingSynonyms: guards, keepers, lookoutsAntonyms: attacker, enemySentence: The <u>pickets</u> persuaded some drivers not to enter the factory.

# 51.DECRYING (verb): निंदा

Pronunciation: duh·krai·uhng
Meaning: publicly denounce.
Synonyms: denounce, condemn, criticize
Antonyms: acclaiming, applauding, praising
Sentence: The prophets weren't decrying the ritual of the temple.

# 52.FARCICAL (adj.) : बेतुका

**Pronunciation:** faas·uhk·uhl

**Meaning:** relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects.



**Synonyms:** ridiculous, preposterous, ludicrous **Antonyms:** serious, logical, believable **Sentence:** The whole situation has become <u>farcical</u>.

# 53.ORDEAL (noun) : अग्नि परीक्षा

**Pronunciation:** aw deel **Meaning:** a painful or horrific experience, especially a protracted one. **Synonyms:** nightmare, trauma, painful experience **Antonyms:** comfort, joy, peace **Sentence:** He was subjected to a terrible six-day ordeal.

#### 54.MERCURIAL (adj.) : अस्थिर

Pronunciation: muh·kyoo·ree·uhl
Meaning: (of a person) subject to sudden or unpredictable changes of mood or mind.
Synonyms: volatile, capricious, temperamental
Antonyms: changeless, constant, immutable
Sentence: The boss's mood is so mercurial that we never know how he's going to react to anything.

#### 55.REPUGNANT (adj.) : प्रतिकूल

Pronunciation: ruh·puhg·nuhnt
Meaning: extremely distasteful; unacceptable.
Synonyms: abhorrent, revolting, repulsive
Antonyms: innocuous, inoffensive, acceptable
Sentence: The thought of going back into the fog was repugnant to him.

#### 56.DAUNT (verb) : भयभीत करना

Pronunciation: dawntMeaning: make (someone) feel intimidated or apprehensive.Synonyms: intimidate, abash, ruffleAntonyms: embolden, encourage, strengthenSentence: The raging inferno didn't <u>daunt</u> the firefighters for a moment.

# 57.HALF-WIT (noun) : आधी बुद्धि

**Pronunciation:** half·wit **Meaning:** a foolish or stupid person. **Synonyms:** fool, idiot, blockhead **Antonyms:** genius, intelligent



**Sentence:** Worst of all were the halfwits in the background, guffawing at every pathetic gag.

#### 58.EMANCIPATION (noun) : मुक्ति

**Pronunciation:** uh·man·suh·pay·shn **Meaning:** the fact or process of being set free from legal, social, or political restrictions **Synonyms:** freeing, liberation, discharge **Antonyms:** enslavement, conquest, subjugation **Sentence:** The <u>Emancipation</u> Proclamation abolished slavery in the United States.

#### 59.INTERMITTENT (adj.) : रुक-रुक कर

**Pronunciation:** in tuh mi tnt **Meaning:** occurring at irregular intervals; not continuous or steady. **Synonyms:** sporadic, irregular, random **Antonyms:** constant, continuous, incessant **Sentence:** After three hours of intermittent rain, the game was abandoned.



#### 60.GAFFE (noun) : चूक

**Pronunciation:** gaf **Meaning:** an unintentional act or remark causing embarrassment to its originator; a blunder.

Synonyms: blunder, mistake, error

Antonyms: accuracy, correctness, perfection

**Sentence:** He didn't realize what a <u>gaffe</u> he'd made.

#### 61. CONFRONTATION (noun): आमना-सामना

Pronunciation: kawn•fruhnt•ay•shn
Meaning: a hostile or argumentative meeting or situation between opposing parties.
Synonyms: conflict, clash
Antonyms: concord, harmony, peace
Sentence: The government was dragged willy-nilly into the <u>confrontation</u>.



#### 62.CRUCIFY (verb) : आलोचना करना

Pronunciation: kroo•suh•fai
Meaning: criticize (someone) severely and unrelentingly.
Synonyms: condemn, criticize severely, denounce
Antonyms: commend, endorse
Sentence: He's going to crucify me when he finds out what I've done!

#### 63.ACCRUE (verb) : उपाजित होना

Pronunciation: uh•kroo
Meaning: (of sums of money or benefits) be received by someone in regular or increasing amounts over time.
Synonyms: result, arise, follow
Antonyms:: abate, decline, diminish
Sentence: A penny-pincher who is accruing a fortune by spending next to nothing.

#### 64.IRATE (adj.) : क्रुड

Pronunciation: ai•raytMeaning: feeling or characterized by great anger.Synonyms: angry, furious, infuriatedAntonyms: calm, delighted, pleasedSentence: We have received some <u>irate</u> phone calls from customers.

#### 65.PAUPER (noun) : कंगाल

Pronunciation: paw•puhMeaning: a very poor person.Synonyms: poor person, indigent, bankruptAntonyms: affluent, billionaire, tycoonSentence: He did die a pauper and is buried in an unmarked grave.

#### 66.HANKER (verb) : लालायित होना

**Pronunciation:** hank er **Meaning:** feel a strong desire for or to do something. **Synonyms:** yearn, long, desire **Antonyms:** be averse, aversion **Sentence:** She hankered to go back.

#### 67.INUNDATION (noun) : सैलाब

**Pronunciation:** i•nuhn•day•shn **Meaning:** a great flow of water or of something that overwhelms



**Synonyms:** overflow, deluge, torrent **Antonyms:** drought, dribble, drip **Sentence:** The family's shed was washed away in the last <u>inundation</u>.

#### 68.PRATTLING (verb) : बकवास

Pronunciation: pra•tuhl•uhngMeaning: talk at length in a foolish or inconsequential way.Synonyms: chatter, babble, prateAntonyms: articulating, enunciatingSentence: The villagers are prattling on about the village gossip.

#### 69.FAMISHED (adj.) : भूखों मरना

Pronunciation: fa•muhsht
Meaning: feeling a desire or need for food
Synonyms: empty, hungry, peckish
Antonyms: engorged, glutted, gorged
Sentence: After a full day of skiing, I was feeling absolutely <u>famished</u>.

#### 70.RETICENCE (noun) : अल्पभाषिता

**Pronunciation:** reh•tuh•sns **Meaning:** the quality of being reticent; reserve. **Synonyms:** reserve, introversion, restraint **Antonyms:** expansiveness **Sentence:** His <u>reticence</u> about his past made them very suspicious.
