



1. Kirti Patel won big against Dhairya Yadav at All India Chess Masters

Kirti Patel secured a remarkable victory against Dhairya Yadav at the All India Chess Masters. Displaying sharp tactics and strategic depth, Kirti dominated the board from the early stages. Her opening play put Dhairya on the defensive, forcing several inaccuracies. Midgame pressure and positional mastery led to a significant material advantage. Despite a resilient defense by Dhairya, Kirti



converted her lead confidently. This win marks a major highlight in Kirti Patel's growing chess career.

2. World's first commercial scale e-methanol plant opens in Denmark

Denmark has inaugurated the world's first commercial-scale e-methanol plant in Kasso, marking a significant advancement in green fuel technology. Developed by European Energy in collaboration with Japan's Mitsui & Co., the $\ensuremath{\in} 150$ million facility is powered by the adjacent 304 MW Kasso Solar Park and utilizes captured biogenic CO_2 to produce up to 42,000 tonnes of e-methanol annually . Major



companies like Maersk, LEGO and Novo Nordisk have committed to using this green methanol to reduce their carbon footprints in shipping and manufacturing. The plant's excess heat will provide district heating for approximately 3,300 local households, enhancing its environmental benefits .

Foot notes:

- **Production Capacity**: The facility has the capacity to produce up to 42,000 tonnes of e-methanol annually, which will be used as a low-carbon fuel for shipping and as a raw material in the chemical industry.
- **Renewable Energy Source**: The plant uses renewable energy from a nearby 304 MW solar park to power its electrolysis process, which splits water into hydrogen and oxygen. The hydrogen is then combined with biogenic CO2 to produce e-methanol.
- **Off-Takers**: The e-methanol will be supplied to companies such as A.P. Moller-Maersk for use as a fuel, and LEGO Group and Novo Nordisk for use in producing lower-carbon plastics.
- Environmental Benefits: The plant will not only produce green fuel but also provide district heating for around 3,300 local households, showcasing a practical and scalable solution for decarbonizing industries.

3. Sussan Ley becomes first female opposition leader in Australia

Sussan Ley has made history by becoming the first woman to lead Australia's Liberal Party and serve as Leader of the Opposition. Elected on May 13, 2025, following Peter Dutton's electoral defeat, Ley narrowly defeated Angus Taylor in a 29–25 leadership ballot . A member of the party's moderate wing, she brings a diverse background as a former commercial pilot, farmer, and economist . Ley has pledged to



modernize the party, emphasizing inclusivity and a clear policy agenda that resonates with Australians .

4. Former Defence Secretary Ajay Kumar Takes Charge at UPSC

Dr. Ajay Kumar, a distinguished 1985-batch IAS officer and former Defence Secretary, has been appointed as the new Chairman of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), effective May 14, 2025. An alumnus of IIT Kanpur and holder of a Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota, Dr. Kumar brings a wealth of experience in governance, technology, and strategic policy-making to



his new role. During his tenure as Defence Secretary from 2019 to 2022, he spearheaded significant reforms, including the corporatization of the Ordnance Factory Board and the launch of the Agniveer recruitment scheme.

This victory marks a historic milestone, as he became the first athlete from Arunachal Pradesh to secure a gold medal in the senior national Pencak Silat competition. The championship featured participation



from over 30 states, highlighting the competitive nature of the event. Alongside Jeevan's achievement, fellow Arunachali athletes Meko Liyak and Atta Tayung earned bronze medals in the 60kg and 50kg categories, respectively.

India's U19 football team secured the top position in Group B of the 2025 SAFF U19 Championship with a commanding 4-0 victory over Nepal at the Golden Jubilee Stadium in Yupia, Arunachal Pradesh. Rohen Singh Chaphamayum led the charge with goals in the 28th and 76th minutes, while local talent Omang Dodum and Danny Meitei added to the tally in the 29th and 84th



minutes, respectively. The hosts dominated the match, scoring two goals in each half, and concluded the group stage with a perfect record of six points and a goal difference of +12. This victory highlights India's strong performance and sets the stage for an exciting semi-final clash.

7. LIC hikes stake in Bank Of India to 8.38

Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) has increased its stake in Bank of India (BoI) to 8.38% as of May 9, 2025, up from 6.35% in September 2021. This acquisition of an additional 2.026% stake over nearly four years reflects LIC's continued confidence in BoI's performance and growth prospects. Following the announcement, BoI shares rose by 2.27%, closing at 112.55 on the Bombay



Stock Exchange on May 13, 2025. The bank recently reported an 82.5% year-on-year increase in profit after tax for the March quarter, reaching 2,626 crore, alongside a 2.1% rise in net interest income to 6,063 crore. LIC's strategic investment underscores its role as a key institutional investor in India's public sector banking landscape.

8. Harvansh Chawla appointed as Chairman of BRICS CCCI

Harvansh Chawla, a distinguished senior lawyer and expert in international trade law, has been appointed as the Chairman of the BRICS Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BRICS CCI). With over three decades of experience, Chawla has served as a legal advisor to global corporations including Northrop Grumman, Singapore Airlines, Denso Corporation, and Alcatel . He holds a master's degree in International Law from Georgetown



University Law Center, USA. In his new role, Chawla aims to strengthen economic ties, promote sustainable growth, and create new opportunities for collaboration among BRICS and BRICS Plus nations. His leadership will focus on reducing trade barriers, fostering innovation, and enhancing the global competitiveness of BRICS economies.

Prior to this appointment, he served as Additional Secretary (Budget) in the Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) under the Ministry

of Finance, where he played a significant role in formulating and executing the Union Budget. He also contributed to civil service training as a faculty member at the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration from 2008 to 2012.

10. Padma Shri scientist Subbanna Ayyappan passed away

Dr. Subbanna Ayyappan, a distinguished aquaculture scientist and Padma Shri awardee, was found deceased in the Cauvery River near Srirangapatna, Karnataka, on May 10, 2025. At 70, he was the first non-crop scientist to lead the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), serving as its Director-General from 2010 to 2016. Ayyappan was instrumental in India's Blue Revolution,



significantly enhancing fish production through scientific aquaculture practices. Preliminary investigations suggest the possibility of suicide, though authorities have not ruled out other causes, and a post-mortem examination is underway .
