1. MORIBUND (ADJECTIVE): मरणासन्न

Pronunciation: maw.ruh.buhndMeaning : in a very bad condition; dyingSynonyms: expiring, at death's door, fallenAntonyms: thriving, alive, beingSentence: On examination she was moribund and dehydrated.

2. VEHEMENT (ADJECTIVE): उत्साही

Pronunciation: vee.uh.muhntMeaning : showing very strong (often negative) feelings, especially anger.Synonyms: forceful, ardent, urgentAntonyms: mild, weak, hesitantSentence: Her voice was low but vehement.

3. THRIFT (NOUN): मितव्ययिती

Pronunciation: thriftMeaning : the quality of being careful not to spend too much money.Synonyms: prudence, economy, savingAntonyms: profligacy, lavishness, prodigalitySentence: We have been raised with the the values of thrift and self-reliance.

4. RESCIND (VERB): रद्द कर देना

Pronunciation: ruh.sindMeaning : to officially state that a law, contract, decision, etc. is no longer valid.Synonyms: repeal, cancel, reverseAntonyms: enforce, continue, keepSentence: The government was required to rescind all the unpleasant measures.

5. TORTUOUS (ADJECTIVE): टेढ़ा-मेढ़ापन

Pronunciation: taw.choo.uhs
Meaning : (used about a road, etc.) with many bends.
Synonyms: winding, curving, twisting
Antonyms: straight, linear, direct



Sentence: The route is remote and tortuous.

6. OPACITY (NOUN): अस्पष्टता

Pronunciation: oh.pa.suh.teeMeaning : the quality of being difficult to understand; the fact of being opaque.Synonyms: uncertainty, mystery, darknessAntonyms: clarity, brightness, plainnessSentence: One has to face a lot of difficulty and opacity in Shakespeare's texts.

7. DULCET (ADJECTIVE) : आनंदकर

Pronunciation: duhl.suhtMeaning: (especially of sound) sweet and soothing.Synonyms: Melodious, Harmonious, LyricalAntonyms: Harsh, Jarring, GratingSentences: Her dulcet voice calmed the crying baby within seconds.

8. DISMAL (ADJECTIVE): शोकयुक्त

Pronunciation: diz.muhlMeaning: causing or showing sadness; depressing.Synonyms: desolate, grey, murkyAntonyms: cheerful, cheery, gaySentence: His dismal mood was not dispelled by finding the house empty.

9. VIGOROUS (ADJECTIVE): ज़ोरदार

Pronunciation: vi.guh.ruhsMeaning: in a way that is very forceful or energetic.Synonyms: powerful, potent, energeticAntonyms: weak, dull, torpidSentence: It is said that vigorous exercise increases oxygen consumption.

10. LABYRINTHINE (ADJECTIVE): जटिल

Pronunciation: la.buh.rin.thine
Meaning: (of a network) like a labyrinth; irregular and twisting.
Synonyms: intricate, complex, tangled
Antonyms: straightforward, simple, plain
Sentence: The film was filled with labyrinthine plots and counterplots.
