1. ANTITHESIS (noun) – विलोम

Pronunciation: an·ti·thuh·suhs **Meaning:** a person or thing that is the direct opposite of someone or something else **Synonyms:** converse, reverse, reversal, inverse, obverse **Antonyms:** identity, sameness, coalescence **Usage:** Slavery is the <u>antithesis</u> of freedom.

2. APPREHENSION (noun) – डर, शंका

Pronunciation: a.pruh.hen.shn **Meaning:** anxiety or fear that something bad or unpleasant will happen **Synonyms:** anxiety, worry, restlessness, panic, dread, fear, shock, horror **Antonyms:** in apprehension, confidence **Usage:** She felt a shiver of <u>apprehension</u>.

3. DISCONCERT (verb) - व्याकुल करना

Pronunciation: di·skuhn·suht **Meaning:** disturb the composure of **Synonyms:** unsettle, nonplus, discomfit, unnerve, disorient, perturb, disturb **Antonyms:** reassure, encourage, comfort **Usage:** John would <u>disconcert</u> his parents by not coming home after school.

4. COURTESY (noun) - शिष्टाचार

Pronunciation: kuh·tuh·see
Meaning: the showing of politeness in one's attitude and behaviour towards others
Synonyms: politeness, civility, respect, chivalry, gentility
Antonyms: discourtesy, rudeness
Usage: He did not have the common <u>courtesy</u> to ask permission.

5. RENOUNCE (verb) - त्याग

Pronunciation: ruh nawns **Meaning:** formally declare one's abandonment of a claim, right, or possession



Synonyms: reject, repudiate, give up, relinquish, abandon, resign

Antonyms: accept, assert, reassert

Usage: If the prince chooses to <u>renounce</u> his throne, he will not be king when his father dies.

6. HUMBUG (noun) – छल-कपट

Pronunciation: huhm·buhg
Meaning: deceptive actions or words
Synonyms: hypocrisy, deceit, dishonesty, falsity, sham, deception, trickery
Antonyms: honesty, truthfulness
Usage: Because the voters were not fooled by the politician's <u>humbug</u>, they gave their support to his opponent.

7. DELVE (verb) – खोजना

Pronunciation: delvMeaning: to search thoroughly and carefullySynonyms: inquire, explore, investigate, search, examineAntonyms: find, ignore, neglectUsage: We need to <u>delve</u> more deeply into this matter.

8. ACCOLADE (noun) – सम्मान

Pronunciation: a·kuh·leid
Meaning: an award or privilege granted as a special honour or as an acknowledgement of merit
Synonyms: honor, recognition, privilege, award, title, prize
Antonyms: discouragement, disapprobation
Usage: The Nobel Prize has become the ultimate <u>accolade</u> in the sciences.

9. VISCOUS (adjective) - चिपचिपा

Pronunciation: vi·skuhs

Meaning: having a thick, sticky consistency between solid and liquid; having a high viscosity

Synonyms: sticky, gummy, gluey, adhesive, tacky, adhering, viscid

Antonyms: dry, unsticky, watery

Usage: Because honey is a <u>viscous</u> substance, it takes a great deal of work to remove it from a jar.

10. BEHEST (noun) – आज्ञा

Pronunciation: buh·hest



Meaning: a person's orders or command Synonyms: mandate, command, order, instruction, injunction, edict Antonym: question Usage: They arrested him at the King's <u>behest</u>.
