

#### 1.UNLEASHED:(Verb) आजाद करना

Pronunciation: un·leashDefinition: To release or set free.Synonyms: Unshackled, Unfettered, Unlocked, Unbound.Antonyms: Restrained, Controlled, Tamed, Suppressed.Sentence: The storm unleashed its fury on the coastal town.

### 2. CASUALTIES:(Noun) जनहानि

Pronunciation: cas·u·al·ty
Definition: The people who are killed, injured or harmed in a specific event.
Synonyms: Fatalities, Damages, Losses, Injuries.
Antonyms: Survivors, Unharmed, Escaped, Intact.
Sentence: The earthquake caused many casualties in the city.

# 3. VULNERABLE:(Adj.) असुरक्षित

Pronunciation: vul·ner·a·ble
Definition: Someone or something that is susceptible to being harmed.
Synonyms: Weak, Fragile, Sensitive, Exposed.
Antonyms: Resilient, Immune, Protected, Shielded.
Sentence: She felt vulnerable after sharing her deepest secrets with him.

# 4. CEASEFIRE:(Noun) युद्ध विराम

Pronunciation: cease fireDefinition: A temporary halt in fighting.Synonyms: Truce, Armistice, Suspension, Cessation.Sentence: The ceasefire brought a temporary relief to the war-torn region.

# 5. RELENTLESSLY: (adverb)लगातार

Pronunciation: re·lent·less·ly
Definition: Continuously and without stopping.
Synonyms: Persistently, Incessantly, Resolutely, Steadfastly.
Antonyms: Sporadically, Periodically, Erratically.
Sentence: The detective pursued the suspect relentlessly through the crowded streets.



# 6. RETALIATION: (Noun) प्रतिशोध लेना

Pronunciation: re·tal·i·a·tion
Definition: Seeking revenge for a perceived wrongdoing.
Synonyms: Retribution, Reprisal, Counterattack, Vengeance.
Antonyms: Reconciliation, Forgiveness, Resolution, Peacemaking.
Sentence: He feared retaliation if he spoke out against the injustice.

#### 7. PREACHES: (Verb)उपदेश देना

Pronunciation: preachDefinition: Delivering a speech especially with a moral or religious message.Synonyms: Lectures, Teaches, Sermonizes, Exhorts.Antonyms: Conceal.Sentence: She preaches environmental conservation through her artwork.

#### 8. MOUNTING: (Verb)बढ़ते

Pronunciation: mount ing
Definition: Becoming more intense over time.
Synonyms: Escalating, Intensifying, Augmenting, Surging.
Antonyms: Diminishing, Waning, Ebbing, Receding.
Sentence: The mounting evidence pointed towards his innocence.

#### 9. DISTRESSING: (Verb)परेशान

Pronunciation: dis.tress.ing
Definition: Causing anxiety or discomfort.
Synonyms: Troubling, Upsetting, Agonizing, Perturbing.
Antonyms: Pleasant, Delightful, Comforting, Uplifting.
Sentence: The news of the accident was distressing for everyone involved.

#### 10. EMBOLDENS: (Verb)प्रोत्साहित करना

Pronunciation: em·bold·en
Definition: To give someone the courage to do something bold.
Synonyms: Encourages, Strengthens, Spurs, Galvanizes.
Antonyms: Deters, Disheartens, Deflates, Undermines.
Sentence: The supportive comments from her friends emboldened her to pursue her dreams.
