

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Exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. Go through these words and read the usages to learn how to use them in sentences. After this, take the quiz based on the vocabulary to check how much you learnt. 1.RIVETING (adj.): दिलचस्प

Pronunciation: ri·vuh·tuhng

Meaning: completely engrossing; compelling. **Synonyms:** enthralling, fascinating, gripping

Antonyms: boring, drab, dull

Sentence: His story makes <u>riveting</u> listening.

2.REPUDIATED (verb): को अस्वीकार नहीं किया

Pronunciation: ruh.pyoo.dee.ayt.uhd

Meaning: refuse to accept or be associated with.

Synonyms: reject, renounce, abandon **Antonyms:** accepted, adopted, embraced

Sentence: Socialism had been <u>repudiated</u> at the polls.

3.AVID (adj.) : उत्स्क

Pronunciation: ay vuhd

Meaning: having or showing a keen interest in or enthusiasm for something.

Synonyms: keen, eager, enthusiastic

Antonyms: apathetic, indifferent, unenthusiastic **Sentence:** She's an avid reader of historical novels.

4.RISIBLE (adj.) : हास्यास्पद

Pronunciation: ri·zuh·bl

Meaning: such as to provoke laughter.
Synonyms: laughable, comedic, comic
Antonyms: humorless, lame, unamusing

Sentence: A <u>risible</u> comment that made the whole class laugh.

5.ENTICE (verb) : लुभाने

Pronunciation: uhn tise

Meaning: attract or tempt by offering pleasure or advantage.

Synonyms: tempt, allure, lure

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Antonyms: drive (away or off), repulse

Sentence: The adverts <u>entice</u> the customer into buying things they don't really want.

6.DISRELISH (verb) : नापसंद करना

Pronunciation: dis•rel•ish

Meaning: regard (something) with dislike or distaste.

Synonyms: aversion, disfavor, dislike **Antonyms:** appetite, affection, fondness

Sentence: I <u>disrelish</u> the thought of sitting through endless meetings on the matter

7.THY (article) : तेरा

Pronunciation: *thy*

Meaning: archaic or dialect form of yours.

Synonyms: thine, thee, yours

Antonyms: hers, his , its

Sentence: Hide nothing from thy physician.

8.DUNCE (noun) : मूर्ख

Pronunciation: duhns

Meaning: a person who is slow at learning; a stupid person.

Synonyms: fool, idiot, stupid person **Antonyms:** brainy, genius, intellect

Sentence: It is very impolite to call others a <u>dunce</u>.

9.HOLLER (verb) : चिल्लाई

Pronunciation: haw·luh

Meaning: (of a person) give a loud shout or cry.

Synonyms: shout, yell, cry

Antonyms: murmur, mutter, whisper

Sentence: There's no need to <u>holler</u>, I'm in the next room.

10.HAGGLE (verb) : सौदेबाज़ी करना

Pronunciation: ha·gl

Meaning: dispute or bargain persistently, especially over the cost of something.

Synonyms: barter, bargain, negotiate **Antonyms:** agree, concur, comply

Sentence: Ella taught her how to <u>haggle</u> with used furniture dealers.
