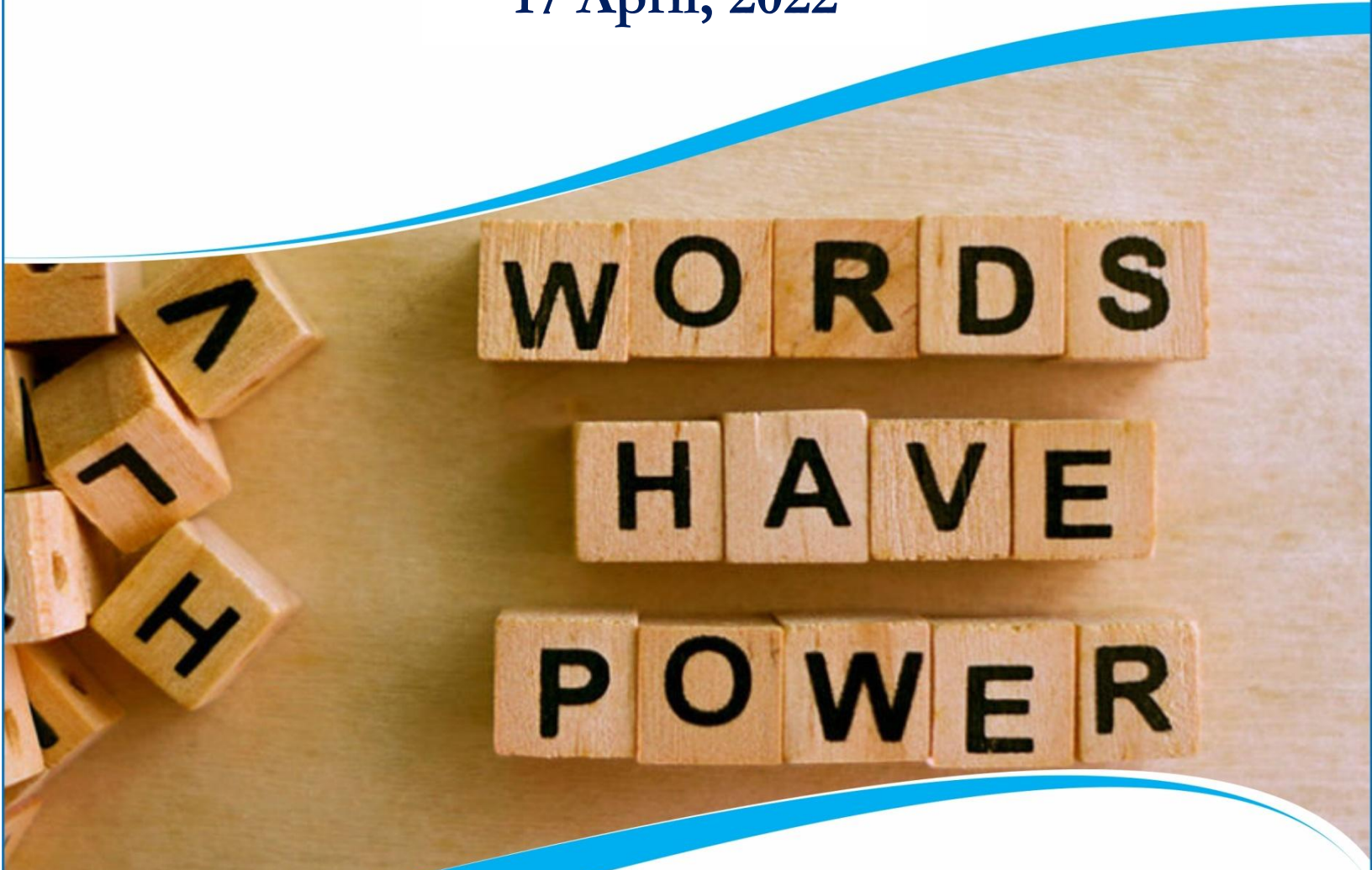


1. TRAIPISE (verb) : धीरे-धीरे चलना

Pronunciation: trayps

Meaning: walk or move wearily or reluctantly.

Synonyms: trudge, trek, tramp

Antonyms: go direct, run, tiptoe

Sentence: I spent the day traipsing around the shops but found nothing suitable for her.

2. ETHOS (noun) : प्रकृति

Pronunciation: ee·thaws

Meaning: the characteristic spirit of a culture, era, or community as manifested in its beliefs and aspirations.

Synonyms: spirit, character, tenor

Antonyms: body, flesh

Sentence: The revolution in the ethos of agriculture must also involve the farmers' unions.

3. PORTENTOUS (adj.) : अमंगल

Pronunciation: paw·tent·uhs

Meaning: of or like a portent.

Synonyms: ominous, warning, foreshadowing

Antonyms: unthreatening, auspicious, benign

Sentence: There was nothing portentous or solemn about him.

4. ABSURDITY (noun) : मूर्खता

Pronunciation: uhb·suhd·uh·tee

Meaning: the quality or state of being ridiculous or wildly unreasonable.

Synonyms: preposterousness, ridiculousness, ludicrousness

Antonyms: prudence, sagacity, wisdom

Sentence: The absurdity of the situation made everyone laugh.

5. LINGER (verb) : दीर्घ काल तक रहना

Pronunciation: ling·guh

Meaning: stay in a place longer than necessary because of a reluctance to leave.

Synonyms: wait around, stay, remain

Antonym: leave

Sentence: Unfortunately, the tax will linger until April.

6. POIGNANT (adj.) : मार्मिक

Pronunciation: poy·nynt

Meaning: evoking a keen sense of sadness or regret.

Synonyms: touching, pitiful, sad

Antonyms: unaffected, unemotional, unimpressive

Sentence: I found his speech deeply poignant.

7. ENRAPTURED (verb) : मंत्रमुग्ध

Pronunciation: uhn·rap·chuhd

Meaning: give intense pleasure or joy to.

Synonyms: delight, give great pleasure to, give joy to

Antonyms: depressed, discouraged, disheartened

Sentence: The audience was enraptured by her beautiful voice.

8. GLUTTONOUS (adj.) : लोभी

Pronunciation: glut·ton·ous

Meaning: excessively greedy.

Synonyms: greedy, gourmandizing, voracious

Antonyms: satiated, satisfied, stuffed

Sentence: He is a selfish, gluttonous, and lazy person.

9. ACCRUE (verb) : उपाजित होना

Pronunciation: uh·kroo

Meaning: (of sums of money or benefits) be received by someone in regular or increasing amounts over time.

Synonyms: result, arise, follow

Antonyms: abate, decline, diminish

Sentence: A penny-pincher who is accruing a fortune by spending next to nothing.

10. PIDDLING (adj.) : क्षुद्र

Pronunciation: pi·duhl·uhng

Meaning: pathetically trivial; trifling.

Synonyms: trivial, trifling, petty

Antonyms: consequential, considerable, important

Sentence: I don't want to hear all the piddling little details!
