




# DAILY VOCAB DOSE

# 1.COVENANT (NOUN): अनुबंध करना

Pronunciation: kuh·vuh·nuhnt

**Meaning:** a formal and binding agreement or contract between two or more parties.

**Synonyms:** agreement, contract, treaty **Antonyms:** disagreement, discord, denial

**Sentence:** They signed a covenant agreeing to share the profits equally.

### 2. REMORSEFUL (ADJECTIVE): पश्चातापी

Pronunciation: ruh·maws·ful

**Meaning:** feeling or expressing sincere regret or remorse.

**Synonyms:** repentant, regretful, sorry

Antonyms: unrepentant, impenitent, shameless

Sentence: After realizing the harm he had caused, he was remorseful and apologized to

those he had hurt.

### 3. STODGY (ADJECTIVE): फूला ह्आ

Pronunciation: stawj·ee

Meaning: dull and uninspired, lacking in excitement or originality; Food which is heavy

and difficult to digest.

Synonyms: Dull, boring, unexciting

Antonyms: Interesting, exciting, dynamic

Sentence: The novel was criticized for its stodgy prose and lack of narrativetension.

## 4. HANKER (VERB): लालायित होना

Pronunciation: hang·kuh

**Meaning:** to have a strong desire or longing for something.

Synonyms: Crave, Yearn, Long

Antonyms: Dislike, Abhor, Aversion

Sentence: I have always hankered for adventure and travel, so I decided to takea year off

and backpack across Europe.

## 5. DEPRAVED (ADJECTIVE):दुष्ट

Pronunciation: duh·prayvd

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Meaning: Morally corrupt, wicked.
Synonyms: Corrupt, immoral, vicious
Antonyms: Virtuous, moral, ethical

**Sentence**: The deprayed individual was found guilty of committing heinous crimes.

## 6. TRAVAIL (NOUN) :कड़ा परिश्रम

Pronunciation: tra·vayl

Meaning: painful or laborious effort, a physical or mental exertion.

**Synonyms**: distress, pain, torment **Antonyms**: ease, rest, leisure

**Sentence**: She went through much travail to become a doctor.

## 7.DESICCATED (ADJECTIVE): सुखाया हुआ

Pronunciation: deh·suh·kayt·uhd

**Meaning:** used about food dried in order to keep it for a long time.

Synonyms: dried up, dehydrated, lifeless

**Antonyms**: hydrated, moist, wet

Sentence: After sitting in the hot sun all day, the once lush green grass had

becomedesiccated and brown.

# 8. TACITURN (ADJECTIVE): अल्पभाषी

Pronunciation: ta·suh·tuhn

Meaning: reserved or uncommunicative in speech; tending not to speak much.

Synonyms: untalkative, uncommunicative, reticent

Antonyms: blabby, chatty, talkative

**Sentence:** John is a taciturn man who rarely speaks more than a few words at a time.

### 9. INTENT (NOUN/ADJECTIVE): इरादा

Pronunciation:uhn·tent

Meaning: having the mind or attention firmly fixed on something; (n) intention or

purpose.

Synonyms: aim, goal, objective

Antonyms: aimless, unfocused, distracted

Sentence: The athlete had an intent look on his face as he prepared for the

race.

## 10. CANARD (NOUN): झूठीखबर

Pronunciation: ka·naad

Meaning: an unfounded rumour or story.

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Synonyms: hoax, fabrication, myth

Antonyms: truth, fact, reality

Sentence The politician was known for spreading canards about his opponents togain an

advantage in the election.



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
