




# DAILY VOCAB DOSE

#### 1. DOMINEERING (adj.) : अत्याचारी

Pronunciat0ion: daw·muh·neeuh·ruhng

Meaning: asserting one's will over another in an arrogant way.

**Synonyms:** browbeat, bully, intimidate **Antonyms:** humble, meek, modest

**Sentence:** Many of her women friends also had domineering husbands.

#### 2. DEVIOUS (adj.) : चालाक

**Pronunciation:** Devious

**Meaning:** showing a skillful use of underhanded tactics to achieve goals.

**Synonyms:** underhand, underhand, deceptive **Antonyms:** guileless, ingenuous, innocent

**Sentence:** You have to be a bit devious if you're going to succeed in business.

#### 3. OPTOMETRIST (noun): चिकित्सक

**Pronunciation:** awp·taw·muh·truhst

**Meaning:** a person who practices optometry.

**Synonyms:** doctor, medic, physician **Antonyms:** nondoctor, nonphysician

Sentence: A swollen optic nerve found by her optometrist led to the discovery of the

tumor.

# 4. DESICCATE (verb) : सूखना

Pronunciation: deh·suh·kayt

**Meaning:** remove the moisture from (something); cause it to become completely dry.

Synonyms: dried, dried up, dehydrated

Antonyms: hydrate, wash, water

**Sentence:** The bricks were <u>desiccated</u> by the sun.

# 5. RIPOSTE (verb) : जवाबी हमला

**Pronunciation:** ruh·pawst

Meaning: make a quick, clever reply to an insult or criticism.

Synonyms: retort, counter, hurl back

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**Antonyms:** outgo, take, disappearance.

**Sentence:** The US delivered an early <u>riposte</u> to the air attack.

## 6. TRIVIAL (adj.) : तुच्छ

**Pronunciation:** tri·vee·uhl

**Meaning:** of little value or importance.

Synonyms: unimportant, insignificant, inconsequential

**Antonyms:** consequential, important, major

**Sentence:** He could remember every <u>trivial</u> incident in great detail.

#### 7. SLEUTH (noun) : जासूस

**Pronunciation:** slooth

**Meaning:** a person who investigates crimes; a detective. **Synonyms:** private detective, detective, private investigator

Antonyms: Ignore, miss, neglect

**Sentence:** The trusty Dr. Watson narrates the stories of his adventures with the sleuth of

Baker Street.

#### 8. QUIBBLE (noun) : वक्रोक्ति

**Pronunciation:** kvi·bl

**Meaning:** a slight objection or criticism about a trivial matter. **Synonyms:** minor criticism, trivial objection, trivial complaint

Antonyms: applaud, commend, compliment

**Sentence:** The only <u>quibble</u> about this book is the lack of color illustrations.

# 9. BEREAVE (verb) : वंचित करना

**Pronunciation:** buh-reev

Meaning: be deprived of a loved one through a profound absence, especially due to the

loved one's death.

**Synonyms:** deprive, dispossess, strip **Antonyms:** cheerful, glad, happy

**Sentence:** The plane crash <u>bereaved</u> her of her husband.

# 10. SYMPOSIUM (noun) : संगोष्ठी

**Pronunciation:** suhm·poze·ee·uhm


Meaning: a conference or meeting to discuss a particular subject.

**Synonyms:** assembly, conclave, congregation **Antonyms:** division, lawlessness, fractionation

**Sentence:** He had been taking part in an international <u>symposium</u> on population.

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
