

1. PANORAMIC (adjective) – व्यापक

Pronunciation: pa·nuh·ra·muhk

Meaning: with a wide view surrounding the observer

Synonyms: sweeping, wide, extensive, scenic, commanding, broad, overall

Antonyms: restricted, narrow, limited

Usage: As I stood on top of the mountain, I could spot seven different states from this panoramic view.

2. INVIGORATE (verb) – जान डालना

Pronunciation: uhn·vi·guh·reit

Meaning: give strength or energy to

Synonyms: revitalize, energize, refresh, revive, vivify, brace, rejuvenate

Antonyms: tire, dishearten, enervate

Usage: As soon as the water hits the roots of the dehydrated plant, it will invigorate it.

3. TRANSGRESS (verb) – उल्लंघन करना

Pronunciation: tranz·gres

Meaning: go beyond the limits of what is morally, socially, or legally acceptable



Synonyms: misbehave, lapse, degenerate, trespass, disobey, defy

Antonyms: obey, heed

Usage: People who transgress the boundaries of social etiquette will be politely turned

away at the door.



4. HUMANITARIAN (adjective) – मानवीय

Pronunciation: hyoo·ma·nuh·teuh·ree·uhn

Meaning: concerned with or seeking to promote human welfare

Synonyms: compassionate, humane, unselfish, altruistic, generous, magnanimous,

benevolent

Antonyms: selfish, egocentric, unsympathetic

Usage: He was a <u>humanitarian</u> whose focus was eliminating homelessness.

5.IMPERTURBABLE (adjective) – अविचलित

Pronunciation: im·puh·tuh·buh·bl



Meaning: unable to be upset or excited

Synonyms: composed, collected, calm, cool, poised, tranquil, serene

Antonyms: edgy, excitable

Usage: She was one of those imperturbable people who never get angry or upset.

6. SEDULOUS (adjective) - परिश्रमी

Pronunciation: seh · joo · luhs

Meaning: showing dedication and diligence

Synonyms: diligent, careful, meticulous, thorough, assiduous, attentive

Antonyms: nonchalant, unconcerned

Usage: Harrison is constantly boasting about his sedulous assistant who keeps the office

running smoothly.

7. OPULENCE (noun) – बहुतायत

Pronunciation: o·pyoo·luhns

Meaning: great wealth or luxuriousness

Synonyms: richness, luxury, magnificence, grandeur, grandiosity, wealth

Antonyms: dearth, deficiency, lack

Usage: His eyes had never beheld such <u>opulence</u>.

8. PUNCTILIOUS (adjective) – सूक्ष्मताप्रिय

Pronunciation: puhngk·ti·lee·uhs

Meaning: showing great attention to detail or correct behavior



Synonyms: meticulous, conscientious, careful, diligent, attentive, scrupulous, painstaking

Antonyms: careless, slapdash, uncaring

Usage: Margaret's tendency to be <u>punctilious</u> makes her a great accountant.

9. IMPAIR (verb) – खराब करना

Pronunciation: uhm-peuh

Meaning: weaken or damage

Synonyms: damage, harm, diminish, reduce, weaken, lessen, decrease

Antonyms: improve, enhance

Usage: Alcohol can greatly impair your judgment.

10. RECTIFY (verb) – सुधारना, ठीक करना

Pronunciation: rek·tuh·fai

Meaning: to correct an issue

Synonyms: correct, amend, fix, debug, repair, troubleshoot

Antonyms: ruin, worsen, damage

Usage: The software engineers worked quickly to rectify the bug that was deleting user

accounts.
