#### 1. CINCH (NOUN): आसान काम

**Pronunciation: sinch** 

**Meaning:** something that is very easy and is therefore certain to be a success.

**Synonyms:** breeze, snap, piece of cake **Antonyms:** tough, complicated, difficult

**Sentence:** The quiz was a cinch for the bright student.

#### 2. PREROGATIVE (NOUN): परमा धकार

Pronunciation: pruh·raw·guh·tuhv

**Meaning:** an exclusive right or privilege held by a person or group

**Synonyms:** Privilege, Right, Entitlement **Antonyms:** Prohibition, Ban, Restriction

Sentence: As a citizen, it is your prerogative to vote and participate in the democratic

process.

#### 3. SOLACE (NOUN): सात्वना

**Pronunciation:** saw·luhs

**Meaning:** comfort or consolation in a time of distress or sadness.

**Synonyms:** Comfort, Consolation, Relief **Antonyms:** Distress, Agony, Torment

**Sentence:** After the loss of her loved one, she found solace in the company of her friends.

# 4. INSINUATION (NOUN): अंदाज़ा, इशारा

Pronunciation: uhn· si·nyoo·ay·shn

Meaning: an unpleasant hint or suggestion of something bad (an indirect or subtle hint).

Synonyms: Inference, Suggestion, Hint, Indication, Omen

Antonyms: Explicit statement, Clear declaration, Direct assertion

**Sentence:** The insinuation in her tone suggested that she didn't trust him.

## 5. UNDERPIN (VERB): टेक लगाना

Pronunciation: uhn·duh·pin

Meaning: to support, strengthen, or provide a foundation for something.

Synonyms: Sustain, Bolster, Undergird

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**Antonyms:** hinder, Weaken, Oppose

**Sentence**: He presented the figures to underpin his argument.

#### 6. IMPINGE (VERB): प्रभा वत करना

Pronunciation: im·pinj

**Meaning:** to have an impact, effect, or influence, especially in a negative or intrusive way.

Synonyms: Affect, Influence, touch

Antonyms: faciliate

**Sentence:** The loud noise from the construction site impinged our ability to concentrate.

## 7. APPORTION (VERB): बांटना

Pronunciation: uh·paw·shn

**Meaning:** to divide or distribute something among different people or groups.

**Synonyms:** Allocate, Divide, Distribute **Antonyms:** Collect, Gather, Accumulate

**Sentence:** It is important to apportion resources fairly to ensure equal opportunities for

everyone.

#### 8. ALACRITY (NOUN): तत्परता

Pronunciation: uh·la·kruh·tee

Meaning: eagerness, readiness, or willingness to do something quickly and

enthusiastically.

Synonyms: Promptitude, Fervor, haste

**Antonyms:** Unwillingness, Reluctance, delay **Sentence:** I accepted the new job with alacrity.

# 9. PIVOTAL (ADJECTIVE): महत्वपूर्ण

Pronunciation: pi·vuh·tl

Meaning: of crucial importance in relation to the development or success of something

else. Being the central point or axis around which something revolves.

Synonyms: essential, important, central

Antonyms: insignificant, unimportant, minor

**Sentence:** The CEO's decision was pivotal to the company's success.

## 10. STOICAL (ADJECTIVE): सहनशील

Pronunciation: stoh·uhk·uhl

Meaning: enduring pain and hardship without showing one's feelings or complaining.

**Synonyms:** Resolute, Unemotional, Impassive **Antonyms:** Emotional, Sensitive, Reactive

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Sentence: Despite facing numerous setbacks, he remained stoical and persevered.



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
