




DAILY VOCAB DOSE

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Exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. 1. ORATORICAL (adjective) – भाषण-संबंधी

Pronunciation: o·ruh·to·ruh·kl

Meaning: relating to the art or practice of public speaking

Synonyms: rhetorical, grandiloquent, magniloquent, sonorous, lofty, orotund, bombastic

Antonyms: simple, unadorned

Usage: Never had his oratorical skill been exhibited to better advantage.

2. UTOPIAN (adjective) – काल्पनिक

Pronunciation: yoo·tow·pee·uhn

Meaning: modeled on or aiming for a state in which everything is perfect **Synonyms**: unworldly, immaterial, progressive, reforming, socialist, ideal

Antonyms: materialistic, realistic, practicable

Usage: He was pursuing a <u>utopian</u> dream of world prosperity.

3. HOSPITALITY (noun) – सत्कार

Pronunciation: ho·spuh·ta·luh·tee

Meaning: friendly and generous reception of guests

Synonyms: friendliness, welcome, helpfulness, warmth, kindness, geniality, sociability

Antonyms: aloofness, unhappiness, inhospitality

Usage: A good host exhibits hospitality by making sure their guests are comfortable and

well-fed in their home.

4. SORE (adjective) - पीड़ादायक

Pronunciation: saw

Meaning: painfully uncomfortable

Synonyms: painful, hurting, hurt, aching, throbbing, smarting, stinging

Antonyms: painless, insensitive, pleasant



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Usage: Several rounds of basketball left the players legs sore and aching.

5. JAGGED (adjective) - कंटीला

Pronunciation: jag.id

Meaning: with rough and sharp points

Synonyms: spiky, spiked, barbed, nicked, pointed, ragged

Antonyms: smooth, flat, level

Usage: Peering up at the jagged peak, the mountain climber prepared himself for the

uneven climb up.



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6. GRUMPY (adjective) – क्रोधी

Pronunciation: gruhm·pee

Meaning: bad-tempered and irritable

Synonyms: irritable, crotchety, crabby, crabbed, tetchy, testy, waspish

Antonyms: cheerful, happy, nice

Usage: My next door neighbor is a grumpy old man.

7. SAVVY (noun) – बुद्धिमत्ता, समझ-बूझ

Pronunciation: savee

Meaning: shrewdness and practical knowledge

Synonyms: shrewdness, sharpness, acumen, acuity, intelligence, wit, insight



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Antonyms: inexperience, ignorance

Usage: The corporate finance bankers lacked the necessary political <u>savvy</u>.

8. PERPETUAL (adjective) – लगातार

Pronunciation: puh·peh·choo·uhl **Meaning**: never ending or changing

Synonyms: everlasting, eternal, permanent, unending, endless, lasting

Antonyms: transitory, temporary, intermittent

Usage: I am a perpetual truth seeker, forever investigating life's secrets.

9. DAMP (verb) – नम करना

Pronunciation: damp

Meaning: make something slightly wet

Synonyms: moisten, wet, dew, water, irrigate, humidify, bedew

Antonyms: dry, drench

Usage: You should <u>damp</u> down the ground and then sweep it.

10. PERPLEX (verb) – उलझाना

Pronunciation: puh·pleks

Meaning: make someone feel completely baffled

Synonyms: puzzle, baffle, mystify, bemuse, bewilder, confound, confuse

Antonyms: aid, assist, clarify, enlighten

Usage: The illusion seemed to <u>perplex</u> everyone in the audience.



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
