


1.PERFORATE (verb): छिद्रित

Pronunciation: puh . fuh . rayt . uhd

Meaning: pierce and make a hole or holes in.

Synonyms: pierce, penetrate, prick

Antonyms: fill, patch, seal

Sentence: The broken ribs perforated into his lung.

2.DEPREDATION (noun) : लूट-पाट

Pronunciation: deh·pruh·day·shn

Meaning: an act of attacking or plundering.

Synonyms: plunder, looting, pillaging

Antonyms: rescue, salvage, salvation

Sentence: The entire area has suffered the depredations of war.

3.ABJURED (verb) : परित्यक्त

Pronunciation: uhb·joo.uh

Meaning: solemnly renounce (a belief, cause, or claim).

Synonyms: renounce, relinquish, reject

Antonyms: adhere (to), admit, affirm

Sentence: The conqueror tried to make the natives abjure their religion.

4.HONE (verb) : तेज करना

Pronunciation: hone

Meaning: sharpen (a blade).

Synonyms: sharpen, make sharper

Antonyms: blunt, dull

Sentence: He was carefully honing the curved blade.

5.INFAMY (noun) : बदनामी

Pronunciation: in·fuh·mee

Meaning: the state of being well known for some bad quality or deed.

Synonyms: notoriety, disrepute, disreputableness

Antonyms: esteem, honor, respect

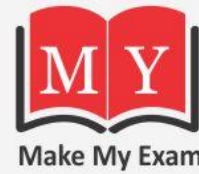
Sentence: Despite his eventual pardons, he could never completely free himself of the infamy of being named a war criminal.

6.ORDAIN (verb) : हुक्म देना**Pronunciation:** aw·dayn**Meaning:** order or decree (something) officially.**Synonyms:** decree, command, order**Antonyms:** ignore, refuse, veto**Sentence:** Equal punishment was ordained for the two crimes.**7.HABITUDE (noun) :** लगन**Pronunciation:** ha·buh·chood**Meaning:** a habitual tendency or way of behaving.**Synonyms:** affection, affinity, aptitude**Antonyms:** apathy, disfavor**Sentence:** They have a lifelong habitude of talking too much.**8.VANITY (noun) :** घमंड**Pronunciation:** van·uh·tee**Meaning:** excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance or achievements.**Synonyms:** conceit, conceitedness, self-admiration**Antonyms:** diffidence, self-doubt, self-disgust**Sentence:** His vanity was his downfall.**9.PHILIPPIC (noun) :** निंदापूर्ण वाक्य**Pronunciation:** philippic**Meaning:** a bitter attack or denunciation, especially a verbal one.**Synonyms:** tirade, diatribe, invective**Antonyms:** approval, blessing, commendation**Sentence:** The lecture was a tremendous philippic against our culture.**10.ASSEVERATION (noun) :** दृढ़ वचन**Pronunciation:** uh·seh·vuh·ray·shn**Meaning:** the solemn or emphatic declaration or statement of something.**Synonyms:** affirmation, assertion, avouchment**Antonyms:** disavowal, contradiction, denial**Sentence:** You can forget the asseveration of the past but want to remember your own sincerely.

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
