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Some exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. Go through these words and read their usages to learn how to use them in sentences. This will really help you boost up your learning.

### 1. INTOXICATED (adjective) - नशे में च्र

Pronunciation: in-tok-si-kei-tid

Meaning: affected by alcohol or drugs especially to the point where physical and mental control is diminished

Synonyms: drunkenness, inebriation, insobriety

Antonym: sobriety

Usage: He was intoxicated with wine.

### 2. ADJUDICATE (verb) – निर्णय करना

Pronunciation: ud-joo-di-keit

Meaning: make a formal judgement on a disputed matter; act as a judge in a competition

**Synonyms:** judge, adjudge, try, hear, examine, arbitrate **Usage:** We asked him to adjudicate at the local flower show.

### 3. BROOD (verb) - चिंतन करना

**Pronunciation:** brood

Meaning: think deeply about something that makes one unhappy, angry, or worried

Synonyms: ponder, contemplate

Usage: She had brooded over the subject a thousand times.

### 4. REPROOF (noun) - फटकार

**Pronunciation:** ri-proof

Meaning: an expression of blame or disapproval

Synonyms: rebuke, reprimand, reproach, admonishment, admonition

Antonyms: approval, praise

**Usage:** She received a mild <u>reproof</u> from the teacher.

### 5. REPRIEVE (verb, noun) – दण्डविराम

**Pronunciation:** rip-reev

Meaning: cancel or postpone the punishment of someone, especially someone condemned to death

**Synonyms:** pardon, spare, acquit **Antonyms:** charge, punish

**Usage:** Shoppers will get a temporary <u>reprieve</u> from the new sales tax.

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### 6. PEEVE (verb) - खिझाना

**Pronunciation:** peev

Meaning: make (someone) rather annoyed

**Synonyms:** irritate, annoy, anger, vex, bother, provoke

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Antonym: please

**Usage:** He was <u>peeved</u> at not being selected in the team.

### 7. GALVANIZE (verb) – उत्तेजित करना

**Pronunciation:** gal-vanaiz

**Meaning:** shock or excite (someone) into taking action **Synonyms:** jolt, shock, startle, impel, stir, spur, prod, urge

Antonym: demotivate

Usage: We have to galvanize people into action.

### 8. INCREDULITY (noun) – अविश्वास

Pronunciation: in-krud-yoo-luti

**Meaning:** the state of being unwilling or unable to believe something **Synonyms:** disbelief, incredulousness, unbelief, doubt, doubtfulness, dubiety

**Antonyms:** credulity, belief

Usage: He stared down the street in incredulity.

### 9. PROGNOSTICATION (noun) - भविष्यवाणी

Pronunciation: prog-nosti-kei-shun

Meaning: a judgment or the act of making a judgment about what is likely to happen in the future

Synonyms: prediction, forecast, prophecy, divination, prognosis

**Usage:** His gloomy <u>prognostications</u> proved to be false.

### 10. OSTRACIZE (verb) - निष्कासित करना

Pronunciation: ostrus-aiz

**Meaning:** exclude from a society or group **Synonyms:** exclude, shun, spurn, cold-shoulder **Antonyms:** welcome, accept, befriend, include

**Usage**: She was declared a witch and <u>ostracized</u> by the villagers.



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
