




# DAILY VOCAB DOSE

#### 1.LAMBASTE (verb): आलोचना करना

Pronunciation: lam-baste

**Meaning:** criticize (someone or something) harshly.

Synonyms: criticize, castigate, chastise

Antonyms: acclaim, commend, compliment

**Sentence:** The professor <u>lambasted</u> me for my careless mistake.

#### 2.SYMPOSIUM (noun): संगोष्ठी

Pronunciation: suhm poze ee uhm

**Meaning:** a conference or meeting to discuss a particular subject.

**Synonyms:** assembly, conclave, congregation **Antonyms:** division, lawlessness, fractionation

**Sentence:** He had been taking part in an international <u>symposium</u> on population.

#### 3.ETHNICITY (noun): जातीयता

Pronunciation: eth nuh suh tee

Meaning: the fact or state of belonging to a social group that has a common national or

cultural tradition.

Synonyms: clan, nation

Antonyms: split, separation, severance, division

**Sentence:** Ethnicity has a strong influence on community status relations.

### 4.ABNEGATION (noun): अस्वीकार

**Pronunciation:** ab·nuh·gay·shn

**Meaning:** the act of renouncing or rejecting something.

Synonyms: renunciation, rejection, refusal

Antonyms: indulgence, self-indulgence, acceptance

Sentence: The couple's sudden abnegation of life in the fast lane for work as missionaries

stunned everyone.

## 5.INSURRECTION (noun) : विद्रोह

**Pronunciation:** in suh rek shn

Meaning: a violent uprising against an authority or government.

**Synonyms:** rebellion, revolt, uprising

**Antonyms:** law, peace, order

**Sentence:** The insurrection was savagely put down.

6.DOUR (adj.): कठोर

Pronunciation: doh·uh

**Meaning:** relentlessly severe, stern, or gloomy in manner or appearance.

**Synonyms:** stern, unsmiling, unfriendly **Antonyms:** benign, friendly, gentle

**Sentence:** No wonder he looked so <u>dour</u>.

7.THRONGED (verb) : भीड़

**Pronunciation:** thrawngd

**Meaning:** (of a crowd) fill or be present in (a place or area).

**Synonyms:** mob, jostle, pack (into) **Antonyms:** deserted, empty, imprecise

**Sentence:** Fans thronged the field to celebrate the win.

8.CORDONED (verb): घेराबंदी कर दी

Pronunciation: kaw-dnd

Meaning: prevent access to or from an area or building by surrounding it with police or

other guards.

**Synonyms:** close off, seal off, tape off **Antonyms:** combine, desegregate, free

**Sentence:** Police <u>cordoned</u> off part of the city centre.

9.TANTAMOUNT (adj.): समान

**Pronunciation:** tan·tuh·mawnt

**Meaning:** equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as.

**Synonyms:** equivalent to, equal to, amounting to **Antonyms:** disparate, distinct, distinguishable

**Sentence:** This invasion is <u>tantamount</u> to a declaration of war.

10.TICKLISH (adj.): मुश्किल

**Pronunciation:** ti·kuhl·uhsh


Meaning: (of a situation or problem) difficult to deal with; requiring careful handling.

**Synonyms:** problematic, tricky, delicate **Antonyms:** easy, simple, uncomplicated

**Sentence:** Handling awkward neighbours can be a <u>ticklish</u> business.
