#### 1. CREEPY (adjective) - डरावना

Pronunciation: kree · pee
Meaning: causing an unpleasant feeling of fear or unease
Synonyms: frightening, scaring, spooky, terrifying, chilling, petrifying, horrible
Antonyms: relaxing, pleasant
Usage: It feels a bit <u>creepy</u> in here.

### 2. HILARITY (noun) - प्रफुल्लता, उल्लास

Pronunciation: huh·la·ruh·tee
Meaning: extreme amusement, especially when expressed by laughter
Synonyms: amusement, mirth, laughter, merriment, levity, fun, humour
Antonyms: seriousness
Usage: The announcement was greeted with great <u>hilarity</u>.

### 3. RECEPTIVE (adjective) - ग्रहणशील

Pronunciation: ruh·sep·tuhv
Meaning: willing to consider or accept new suggestions and ideas
Synonyms: open, responsive, amenable, sympathetic, interested, attuned
Antonyms: resistant, unresponsive
Usage: Children are more receptive to new experiences if their parents prepare them ahead of time.

### 4. FURTIVE (adjective) – गुप्त

Pronunciation: fuh·tuhv
Meaning: marked by quiet, caution, and secrecy
Synonyms: secretive, secret, surreptitious, sly, sneaky, wily, underhand
Antonyms: open, overt



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Usage: Crissy walked outside in a furtive manner so that her parents would not see her.

#### 5. SOAR (verb) – ऊंची उड़ान भरना

Pronunciation: sawMeaning: fly or rise high in the airSynonyms: wing, take off, ascend, climb, rise, mountAntonyms: plummetUsage: She watched the dove <u>soar</u> above the chestnut trees.



### 6. CEASELESS (adjective) - निरंतर

Pronunciation: see·sluhs
Meaning: constant and unending
Synonyms: continual, constant, continuous, incessant, unceasing, unending
Antonyms: intermittent, brief
Usage: The <u>ceaseless</u> rain is bad for the crops.

### 7. FORLORN (adjective) - निराश

Pronunciation: fuh·lawn
Meaning: pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely
Synonyms: unhappy, sad, miserable, sorrowful, dejected, despondent, disconsolate
Antonyms: happy, contented, merry
Usage: Jake was <u>forlorn</u> after his girlfriend moved out without any warning.



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#### 8. ERRATIC (adjective) – अनियमित

**Pronunciation**: uh·ra·tuhk

Meaning: not even or regular in pattern or movement

Synonyms: unpredictable, inconsistent, changeable, variable, inconstant, uncertain, irregular

Antonyms: predictable, consistent

**Usage**: Over the past few weeks, the weather has been <u>erratic</u> making it quite difficult for us to plan outdoor events.

#### 9. OBESE (adjective) - मोटा

Pronunciation: ow bees
Meaning: grossly fat or overweight
Synonyms: fat, overweight, corpulent, gross, stout, fleshy, outsize
Antonyms: thin, skinny, emaciated
Usage: Being <u>obese</u> and lazy is dangerous to health.

### 10. RESONANT (adjective) – गुंजयमान

Pronunciation: reh·zuh·nuhnt
Meaning: deep, clear, and continuing to sound or reverberate
Synonyms: deep, sonorous, vibrant, rich, clear, ringing, orotund
Antonyms: faint, thin, weak
Usage: The resonant sound in the amphitheater travels to every seat in the house.



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
