### 1. ORNATE (adjective) – अलंकृत

Pronunciation: aw neit

Meaning: extravagantly adorned or worded

Synonyms: elaborate, flowery, florid, flamboyant, grandiose, pompous, pretentious

**Antonyms**: plain, austere, simple

Usage: The uneducated man could not understand the <u>ornate</u> speech made by the

professor.

#### 2. SUNDRY (adjective) - विविध

**Pronunciation**: suhn · dree **Meaning**: of various kinds

Synonyms: various, miscellaneous, assorted, diverse, different, several, many

Antonym: same, dissimilar, singular

**Usage**: This cream can be used to treat <u>sundry</u> minor injuries.

#### 3. VERISIMILITUDE (noun) – सत्याभास

**Pronunciation**: veh·ruh·suh·mi·luh·chood **Meaning**: the appearance of being true or real

Synonyms: authenticity, realism, genuineness, plausibility, resemblance

Antonym: unlikeness, falseness, difference

Usage: To add verisimilitude, the stage is covered with sand for the desert scenes.

#### 4. COMMODIOUS (adjective) – खुला

**Pronunciation**: kuh·mow·dee·uhs **Meaning**: roomy and comfortable

Synonyms: roomy, capacious, spacious, wide, large, spacey, ample

Antonyms: small, confined, cramped



**Usage**: The apartment is <u>commodious</u> enough for us.

#### 5. MOROSE (adjective) – उदास

**Pronunciation**: muh·rows **Meaning**: in a bad mood

Synonyms: sullen, sulky, gloomy, dour, surly, sour, glum

Antonyms: bright, cheerful, content

Usage: When her dog died, the little girl was morose for months.



#### 6. RANT (verb) - निंदा करना, दोषारोपण करना

**Pronunciation:** rant

**Meaning**: speak or shout at length in an angry, impassioned way

Synonyms: diatribe, harangue, oration, rhetoric, tirade, bluster, bombast

Antonyms: calm, quiet

Usage: In a tirade, the deranged stranger proceeded to <u>rant</u> about pharmaceutical

overcharges.

#### 7. BOOST (verb) - बढावा देना

**Pronunciation**: boost

Meaning: to help, stimulate, or encourage something to improve

Synonyms: improve, raise, uplift, increase, amplify, enhance, encourage

Antonyms: decrease, hinder, discourage



**Usage**: The movie helped to <u>boost</u> her screen career.

#### 8. ODIOUS (adjective) – घृणास्पद

**Pronunciation**: ow·dee·uhs **Meaning**: extremely unpleasant

Synonyms: revolting, repulsive, repellent, repugnant, disgusting, offensive, objectionable

Antonyms: delightful, pleasant, agreeable

Usage: The athlete got arrested for participating in the odious sport of dog fighting.

#### 9. AUGUST (adjective) – प्रतापी

**Pronunciation**: aw·guhst

Meaning: much admired and respected

Synonyms: distinguished, respected, eminent, honored, prestigious, renowned, celebrated

Antonyms: undignified

Usage: Everyone wanted the chance to dine with the <u>august</u> president.

#### 10. FINESSE (noun) – कौशल

**Pronunciation**: fuh·nes

Meaning: impressive delicacy and skill

Synonyms: skill, subtlety, expertise, flair, knack, panache, dash

**Antonyms**: inability, ineptness, stupidity

Usage: The stunning wedding cake showed the baker's finesse and creativity.
