5. ENSCONCE (verb) : स्थापित करना

Meaning: establish or settle (someone) in a comfortable, safe, or secret place.
Synonyms: settle, install, establish
Antonyms: depart, disarrange, divest



Sentence: After dinner, I ensconced myself in a deep armchair with a book.

6. HAPLESS (adj.) : बदकिस्मत

Meaning: (especially of a person) unfortunate.
