### 1. PURVIEW (noun) : परिधि

**Pronunciation:** puh·vyoo

**Meaning:** the scope of the influence or concerns of something.

**Synonyms:** ambit, horizon

**Antonyms:** blindness, ignorance, misconception.

**Sentence:** This matter comes within the purview of the Department of Health.

### 2. MULTIFARIOUS (adj.) : विविध

**Pronunciation:** muhl·tuh·feuh·ree·uhs

**Meaning:** many and of various types.

**Synonyms:** multiform, multiple, different

**Antonyms:** monolithic, alike, identical

**Sentence:** Spain is a composite of multifarious traditions and people.

### 3. ULTERIOR (adj.) : गुप्त

**Pronunciation:** uhl·teeuh·ree·uh

**Meaning:** existing beyond what is obvious or admitted; intentionally hidden.

**Synonyms:** secondary, underlying, undisclosed

**Antonyms:** open, public, overt

**Sentence:** She definitely had an ulterior motive in offering to help.

### 4. EMBROIL (verb) : उलझाना

**Pronunciation:** uhm·broyl

**Meaning:** involve (someone) deeply in an argument, conflict, or difficult situation.

**Synonyms:** involve, ensnare, enmesh

**Antonyms:** emancipated, freed, liberated

**Sentence:** Take care not to get embroiled with those people.

### 5. ENSCONCE (verb) : स्थापित करना

**Pronunciation:** uhn·skawns

**Meaning:** establish or settle (someone) in a comfortable, safe, or secret place.

**Synonyms:** settle, install, establish

**Antonyms:** depart, disarrange, divest

**Sentence:** After dinner, I ensconced myself in a deep armchair with a book.

**6. HAPLESS (adj.) : बदकिस्मत**

**Pronunciation:** hap·luhs

**Meaning:** (especially of a person) unfortunate.

**Synonyms:** unfortunate, unlucky, luckless

**Antonyms:** fortunate, happy, lucky

**Sentence:** All of them were hapless victims of this hurricane.

**7. PUTRID (adj.) : सड़ा हुआ**

**Pronunciation:** pyoo.truhd

**Meaning:** (of organic matter) decaying or rotting and emitting a fetid smell.

**Synonyms:** decomposing, decomposed, decaying

**Antonyms:** fresh, good, undecomposed

**Sentence:** What's that putrid smell?

**8. DILAPIDATED (adj.) : उबड़ खाबड़**

**Pronunciation:** duh·la·puh·dayt·uhd

**Meaning:** (of a building or object) in a state of disrepair or ruin as a result of age or neglect.

**Synonyms:** run-down, tumbledown, ramshackle

**Antonyms:** ameliorated, improved

**Sentence:** The building had been dilapidated by neglect.

**9. SHELLACKING (noun) : पराजित करना**

**Pronunciation:** sheh·lak·uhng

**Meaning:** failure to win a contest

**Synonyms:** beating, defeat, drubbing

**Antonyms:** success, triumph, victory

**Sentence:** We gave their team a real shellacking.

**10. CONSCIENTIOUS (adj.) : ईमानदार**

**Pronunciation:** kuhn·sen·shee·uhs

**Meaning:** (of a person) wishing to do what is right, especially to do one's work or duty well and thoroughly.

**Synonyms:** diligent, industrious, punctilious

**Antonyms:** dishonest, unethical, corrupt

**Sentence:** We are generally very conscientious about our work.

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
