





1. Sujata Chaturvedi Appointed as a UPSC Board Member

Sujata Chaturvedi has been appointed as a member of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC). She is a retired Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer from the 1989 batch of the Bihar cadre. Before this appointment, she served as the Secretary of the Department of Youth Affairs in the Government of India. Her vast administrative experience across various ministries makes her a valuable addition to the UPSC. 2. India Remains 4th Largest Economy In World, US at No. 1

India has solidified its position as the world's fourth-largest economy in 2025, with a nominal GDP of \$4.19 trillion, matching Japan's economic output. According to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), India is projected to be the fastest-growing major economy, with an anticipated growth rate of 6.2% this year . The United States maintains its lead with a GDP of \$30.51 trillion, followed by China at



\$19.23 trillion and Germany at \$4.74 trillion. India's robust growth is driven by strong domestic consumption, strategic investments, and a thriving services sector. With this momentum, India is poised to surpass both Germany and Japan to become the world's third-largest economy in the near future.

3. MP Introduced India's First AI-Powered Real-Time Forest Alert System

Madhya Pradesh has become the first state in India to implement an AI-based real-time forest alert system, marking a significant advancement in forest management and conservation. This innovative system utilizes satellite imagery, mobile feedback, and machine learning to detect land encroachment, deforestation, and forest degradation. Currently piloted in five sensitive forest divisions—Shivpuri, Guna, Vidisha, Burhanpur, and Khandwa—the system



provides live monitoring on the Divisional Forest Officer's dashboard, displaying realtime alerts categorized by beat and field posts, with filters for date, density, and area. Field staff receive these alerts through a mobile app, enabling them to verify and take



immediate action on-site, supported by features like GPS-tagged photos and voice notes.

- **Near Real-Time Monitoring**: The Forest Survey of India (FSI) has launched the Forest Fire Alert System (FAST) Version 3.0, which provides near real-time monitoring of forest fires using MODIS and SNPP-VIIRS satellite data. This system allows for timely detection and response to forest fires.
- **Customized Alerts**: The system provides customized alerts for 20 states at the beat level and 2 states at the range level, ensuring that forest officials receive relevant and actionable information.
- Forest Fire GeoPortal: The FSI has also launched a Forest Fire GeoPortal, which provides a centralized platform for visualizing and managing forest fire data.
- **Fire Danger Rating**: The system includes a Forest Fire Danger Rating (FFDR) system, which provides early warnings for potential forest fires. The FFDR is processed and uploaded every Thursday during the fire season and is valid for the ensuing week.

4. Indian boxers win 4 more golds in Asian U-15 and U-17 Championships

Indian boxers concluded their campaign at the inaugural Asian U-15 and U-17 Boxing Championships in Amman, Jordan, with a remarkable haul of 15 gold medals. On the final day, the U-17 girls' team secured four golds, with standout performances from Khushi Chand (46 kg), Ahaana Sharma (50 kg), Jannat (54 kg), and Anshika (80+kg). Overall, India amassed 15 gold, 6 silver, and 22 bronze medals, finishing second in the overall standings



behind Kazakhstan. The U-15 girls' team was particularly dominant, winning 10 out of 15 available golds and sweeping every final they contested. This impressive performance underscores the depth and promise of India's young boxing talent on the continental stage.

10. India's Coal Production Increases by 3.63% to 81.57 Million Tonnes in April 2025

India's coal production reached 81.57 million tonnes in April 2025, reflecting a 3.63% increase from the 78.71 million tonnes produced in April 2024. This growth was significantly driven by captive and non-Coal India Limited (CIL) mines, which saw a 26.6% rise in output, producing 14.51 million tonnes compared to 11.46 million tonnes the previous year. Coal dispatches also experienced a steady



uptick, reaching 86.64 million tonnes in April 2025, up from 85.11 million tonnes in the same month last year . As of April 30, 2025, coal stockpiles stood at 125.76 million tonnes, with CIL alone accounting for 105 million tonnes, marking a 22.1% increase from the previous year's figures.

- Coal Production Growth: Coal India Limited (CIL) has been experiencing growth in coal production, with a notable increase of 8% to 189.3 million tonnes (MTs) in the first quarter of FY 2025, compared to 175.5 MTs in the same period of FY 2024.
- **Production Targets**: CIL has been meeting its production targets, with a goal to produce 838 MTs in FY 2025. In FY 2024, CIL produced 773.6 million tonnes (MTs) of coal, registering a 10% growth over the previous year.



- **Supply to Power Sector**: CIL's supplies to the power sector have also increased, with a 4% growth to 160 MTs during Q1 FY 2025, compared to 154 MTs in the same period of FY 2024.
- **Non-Power Sector Growth**: The company has seen significant growth in supplies to the non-power sector, with a 16% growth to 38.4 MTs during Q1 FY 2025, compared to 33 MTs in the same period of FY 2024.
