




# DAILY VOCAB DOSE

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Exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. ### 1. HUFFY (adjective) – क्रोधी

Pronunciation: huh-fee

**Meaning**: annoyed or irritated and quick to take offence at petty things **Synonyms**: irritable, annoyed, cross, grumpy, crotchety, crabby, crabbed

Antonyms: cheerful, friendly

**Usage**: I told her she had made a mistake and she got <u>huffy</u> with me.

### 2. STOUT (adjective) – मोटा; बलवान

**Pronunciation**: stawt

Meaning: rather fat or of heavy build

Synonyms: fat, plump, rotund, hefty, bulky, heavily built, abdominous

**Antonyms**: thin, slender

Usage: He was a tall, stout man with gray hair.

### 3. PRODIGAL (verb) - खर्चीला

**Pronunciation**: pro·duh·gl

Meaning: spending money or using resources freely and recklessly

Synonyms: wasteful, extravagant, spendthrift, improvident, imprudent, profligate

Antonyms: thrifty, economical

Usage: Jack's prodigal actions left him penniless and without a home.

### 4. JEJUNE (adjective) - सरल

**Pronunciation**: juh·joon

Meaning: naive, simplistic, and superficial

Synonyms: naive, simple, innocent, guileless, unworldly, childlike, ingenuous

Antonyms: sophisticated, mature

Usage: I am very jejune and refuse to eat anything I can not spell.

### 5. CAJOLE (verb) – फुसलाना

Pronunciation: kuh-jowl

Meaning: persuade someone to do something by sustained coaxing or flattery

Synonyms: persuade, wheedle, coax, lure, beguile, blarney, flatter

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**Antonyms**: bully, dissuade

Usage: The candidate managed to <u>cajole</u> many voters into choosing his name on the ballot.

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#### 6. LARGESSE (noun) – उदारता

Pronunciation: laa.jes

**Meaning**: generosity in bestowing money or gifts upon others

Synonyms: generosity, liberality, munificence, bounty, benefaction, altruism, charity

Antonym: meanness, miserliness

Usage: The <u>largesse</u> provided by local corporations will support the building of a

neighborhood park.

### 7. FLAUNT (verb) – इठलाना

**Pronunciation**: flawnt

**Meaning**: display ostentatiously, especially in order to provoke envy or admiration

Synonyms: show off, parade, exhibit, flourish, brandish, wave, dangle

Antonyms: hide, conceal

**Usage**: Eric loves to <u>flaunt</u> his flashy clothes.

### 8. DOGMATIC (adjective) – কহ্বৰ

**Pronunciation**: dog·ma·tuhk

**Meaning**: inclined to lay down principles as undeniably true

Synonyms: opinionated, peremptory, assertive, imperative, insistent, emphatic

Antonyms: tentative, open-minded

**Usage**: You can't be <u>dogmatic</u> in matters of taste.

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### 9. AFFECTATION (noun) – दिखावा

Pronunciation: a.fek.tei.shn

**Meaning**: behaviour, speech, or writing that is pretentious and designed to impress **Synonyms**: pretension, artificiality, insincerity, posturing, posing, pretence, ostentation

Antonyms: naturalness, frankness

Usage: Her posh accent is pure affectation.

### 10. ODDITY (noun) - विचित्रता; अनोखा आदमी

Pronunciation: o.duh.tee

**Meaning**: a strange or peculiar person or thing

Synonyms: eccentric, crank, misfit, eccentricity, maverick, weirdo, kook

Antonym: conformist, familiarity

Usage: The oddity of the situation didn't seem to bother her at all.



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
