

1. CAPER (noun) : शरारत

Pronunciation: kay · puh

Meaning: an activity or escapade, typically one that is illicit or ridiculous.

Synonyms: escapade, stunt, prank

Antonyms: inactivity, idleness, inaction. **Sentence:** I'm too old for this sort of caper.

2. ARTICULATE (verb) : स्पष्ट

Pronunciation: ar-TIC-yuh-lit

Meaning: express (an idea or feeling) fluently and coherently.

Synonyms: express, vocalize, put in words

Antonyms: falter, grunt, hesitate

Sentence: They were unable to <u>articulate</u> their emotions.

3. PROPENSITY (noun) : झुकाव

Pronunciation: pruh pen suh tee

Meaning: an inclination or natural tendency to behave in a particular way.

Synonyms: tendency, inclination, predisposition **Antonyms:** aversion, disfavor, disinclination

Sentence: He has a <u>propensity</u> for drinking too much alcohol.

4. BLUSTER (noun) : धमकी

Pronunciation: bluh·stuh

Meaning: talk in a loud, aggressive, or indignant way with little effect.

Synonyms: rant, thunder, boast **Antonyms:** quiet, silence, calm

Sentence: I knew that it was all <u>bluster</u> and he wasn't really angry with me.

5. ALACRITY (noun) : तत्परता

Pronunciation: uh·la·kruh·tee

Meaning: brisk and cheerful readiness.

Synonyms: eagerness, willingness, readiness **Antonyms:** lowness, sluggishness, apathy

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Sentence: She accepted the invitation with <u>alacrity</u>.

6. UBIQUITOUS (adj.): सर्वव्यापक

Pronunciation: yoo·bi·kvuh·tuhs

Meaning: present, appearing, or found everywhere.

Synonyms: omnipresent, ever-present, present everywhere

Antonyms: bounded, circumscribed, confined

Sentence: We were plagued by the <u>ubiquitous</u> mosquito.

7. BAFFLE (verb) : उलझाना

Pronunciation: ba·fl

Meaning: totally bewilder or perplex. **Synonyms:** perplex, puzzle, bewilder

Antonyms: enlighten, clear, comprehensible

Sentence: One of the exam questions <u>baffled</u> me completely.

8. BAMBOOZLE (verb) : धोखा देना

Pronunciation: bam·boo·zl

Meaning: fool or cheat (someone). **Synonyms:** trick, deceive, delude

Antonyms: expose, reveal

Sentence: She was <u>bamboozled</u> into telling them her credit card number.

9. PARSIMONY (noun) : बचत

Pronunciation: paa·suh·muh·nee

Meaning: extreme unwillingness to spend money or use resources.

Synonyms: meanness, miserliness, parsimoniousness **Antonyms:** diseconomy, wastefulness, lavishness

Sentence: Due to official parsimony, only one machine was built.

10. FLEETING (adj.) : क्षणभंगुर

Pronunciation: fleet·uhng


Meaning: lasting for a very short time. **Synonyms:** rushed, transient, rapid

Antonyms: ceaseless, dateless, deathless

Sentence: Hoping to get a <u>fleeting</u> glimpse of a whale underwater.

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
