



1. India dominates Asian Yogasana Sport Championship with record 83 gold

India achieved a historic milestone at the 2nd Asian Yogasana Sport Championship, securing a record-breaking 83 gold medals. The championship, held at the KD Jadhav Arena within the Indira Gandhi Sports Complex in New Delhi, witnessed participation from over 21 countries, including Japan, Mongolia, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Uzbekistan. India's dominance was evident as it topped the medal tally, followed by Japan with 3 golds, 3 silvers, and 4 bronzes, while Mongolia, Oman, and Nepal rounded out the top five. The event concluded with a



grand closing ceremony attended by dignitaries such as Shri Harsh Malhotra, Minister of State for Corporate Affairs, and Shri Ajay Chaudhary, Additional Commissioner of Police, Delhi, along with senior officials from the Asian and World Yogasana federations.

2. Kamla Persad-Bissessar's Comeback as PM of Trinidad and Tobago

Kamla Persad-Bissessar has made a remarkable political comeback, reclaiming the position of Prime Minister of Trinidad and Tobago after a decisive victory in the 2025 general elections. Her party, the United National Congress (UNC), in alliance with the Coalition of Interests, secured 26 out of 41 seats in the House of Representatives, defeating the ruling People's National Movement (PNM), which won 13 seats. This election was prompted by the dissolution of Parliament by Prime Minister Stuart Young, who had recently



succeeded Keith Rowley, amid public discontent over his unelected appointment. At 73, Persad-Bissessar, the nation's first female prime minister who previously served from 2010 to 2015, has pledged to address the country's escalating crime and economic challenges.

- **Election Victory**: Kamla Persad-Bissessar's United National Congress (UNC) secured a decisive victory in the snap elections, winning 26 out of 41 seats in the House of Representatives.
- Comeback After a Gap: Persad-Bissessar, 73, previously served as Prime Minister from 2010-2015 and has now made a remarkable comeback, marking a significant shift in the country's politics.
- **Key Challenges**: Persad-Bissessar has pledged to address pressing issues such as crime and economic instability, promising reforms in salaries and pension protections for public workers and the elderly.
- **Economic Revival Plans**: Her administration plans to revive Petrotrin, Trinidad and Tobago's defunct state-owned oil company, which was shuttered in 2018 due to governance concerns.
- **International Congratulations**: Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated Persad-Bissessar on her election victory, looking forward to working with her to strengthen the partnership between the two nations for shared prosperity and well-being.

3. Amazon Launches First Kuiper Satellites to Rival Starlink





Amazon has officially entered the satellite internet arena with the successful launch of its first 27 Project Kuiper satellites on April 28, 2025. These satellites were deployed aboard a United Launch Alliance Atlas V rocket from Cape Canaveral, Florida, marking the commencement of Amazon's ambitious \$10 billion initiative to establish a 3,236-satellite constellation aimed at providing global broadband coverage. This move positions Amazon as a direct competitor to SpaceX's Starlink, which currently leads the market with over 8,000 operational satellites.

- Competition with Starlink: Project Kuiper aims to rival SpaceX's Starlink network, which currently dominates the satellite internet market with over 8,000 satellites in orbit and millions of customers. Amazon's entry into the market could potentially disrupt the status quo and offer more options for consumers.
- **Satellite Constellation**: Amazon plans to deploy a constellation of 3,236 satellites in low-Earth orbit, spread across 98 different paths around Earth at three specific heights: 590 km, 610 km, and 630 km. Each satellite will fly at an altitude of about 280 miles (450 kilometers), providing faster and more responsive internet connections.
- Customer Service and Pricing: Amazon expects to begin delivering service to customers later this year, with coverage expanding towards the equator as more satellites are launched. However, pricing details have not been announced yet, although Amazon has emphasized affordability as a key principle of Project Kuiper.

4. Kokborok Language Demanded to be Included in 8th Schedule

The Kokborok language, spoken by indigenous communities in Tripura, is at the center of a movement advocating for its inclusion in the Eighth Schedule of the Indian Constitution. The Kokborok Sahitya Parishad, a prominent tribal literary organization, has formally petitioned Chief Minister Manik Saha, emphasizing the language's rich cultural heritage and its role in preserving tribal identity. Despite being one of Tripura's official languages and taught from primary to university levels, Kokborok lacks constitutional recognition, which supporters argue is essential for its preservation and national promotion .

- **Demand for Inclusion**: Tripura's Education Minister, Ratan Lal Nath, has strongly advocated for including Kokborok in the 8th Schedule, emphasizing that it will ensure the language's proper development.
- Current Status: Kokborok is already one of the official languages of Tripura and is spoken by 19 tribes, including Tripuri, Reang, Jamatia, Uchoi, and Koloi.
- **Development Initiatives**: The state government has introduced Kokborok language education from primary to university levels, with around 10,000 students currently studying in Kokborok. Tripura University has also introduced a Ph.D. course in Kokborok, with four students pursuing their Ph.D. in the language.
- **Government's Objective**: The state administration is working to add Kokborok to the Constitution's 8th Schedule, which recognizes 22 different languages. This move aims to promote the language's development and preservation.

5. Pankaj Advani Won In CCI Billiards Classic

Pankaj Advani, India's ace cueist, clinched the title at the prestigious CCI Billiards Classic tournament. He showcased remarkable skill and consistency throughout the competition, reaffirming his dominance in the sport. Advani outplayed his opponents with tactical brilliance and precision, earning applause from fans and fellow players alike. The win adds another feather to his already illustrious career, which includes multiple world titles. His victory at the Cricket Club of India (CCI) event is seen as a significant achievement in the



domestic billiards circuit. With this triumph, Advani continues to inspire young players and elevate the profile of cue sports in India.

• **Consistency and Dominance**: This victory marked Advani's fourth successive triumph at the CCI Billiards Classic, solidifying his position as India's most decorated green baize player with 27 World titles.

6. President Honored 71 Individulas With Padma Awards

On April 28, 2025, President Droupadi Murmu conferred the prestigious Padma Awards to 71 distinguished individuals during the Civil Investiture Ceremony held at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi. The awards were distributed across three categories: four Padma Vibhushan, ten Padma Bhushan, and fifty-seven Padma Shri, recognizing exceptional contributions in various fields such as art, public affairs, science, sports, and social work. Notable recipients included violinist Dr. L. Subramaniam and gastroenterologist Dr. D.



Nageshwar Reddy, both honored with the Padma Vibhushan for their outstanding achievements in music and medicine, respectively.

- **Strong Danish Performance**: Denmark dominated the match, winning four out of five matches. Their top players, including world No. 3 Anders Antonsen and world No. 1 pair Kim Astrup-Anders Rasmussen, proved too strong for India's lineup.

- **Theme**: Each year, International Dance Day may have a specific theme, highlighting different aspects of dance, such as its role in culture, education, or community building.


10. Veteran filmmaker Shaji N Karun passed away

Veteran Malayalam filmmaker Shaji N. Karun passed away on April 28, 2025, at the age of 73 after a prolonged battle with cancer. He died at his residence in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, leaving behind his wife Anasuya Devaki Warrier and sons Anil and Appu .





Shaji N. Karun was renowned for his contributions to Indian cinema, particularly in Malayalam filmmaking. His debut film, Piravi (1988), garnered international acclaim, winning the Caméra d'Or – Mention d'honneur at the Cannes Film Festival. He was the inaugural chairman of the Kerala State Chalachitra Academy and the executive chairman of the International Film Festival of Kerala from 1998 to 2001.
