National News

1. EChO Network launched to catalyze cross-disciplinary leadership in India.

- ♣ EChO Network, a national program to provide a template for cross-disciplinary leadership in India with the specific focus of increasing research, knowledge, and awareness of Indian ecology and the environment was launched yesterday in New Delhi by Prof. K VijayRaghavan, Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India.
- 4 India recently took national-level efforts to promote ecological and environmental research on the subcontinent.
- The program will train postdoctoral leaders in research and outreach on these topics incorporating current public and private efforts into a national network. International distributed institute comprising individuals housed within the industry, government, private, and academic sectors, combining their expertise and resources collectively to tackle significant scale problems.

2. Chilai-Kalan: 40-day period of extreme cold begins in Kashmir.

- The traditional 40-day period of harshest winter in Kashmir known in the local parlance as 'Chillai-Kalan' began with the upper reaches of valley receiving snowfall. Chillai-Kalan period which is known for sub-zero temperatures, frozen lakes and river, will end on 31 January 2020.
- ♣ These 40 days are when the chances of snowfall are highest and the maximum temperature drops considerably.
- During Chillai-Kalan, the weather in Kashmir valley continues to remain dry and cold with minimum temperatures hovering below freezing point and the snow during this 40-day period freezes and lasts longer.

3. Assam Cabinet nod to make Assamese the state language.

- → On December 23, 2019, the Assam Cabinet nodded to make Assamese language the state language of Assam. This will exclude BTAD (Bodoland Territorial Administrative Districts), Barak Valley and Hill districts of Assam.
- The cabinet has also suggested that Assamese will be made compulsory in all schools of Assam. The move comes in the wake of rising insecurities among Assamese population in the state. After the passing of Citizenship Amendment Bill, there has been an increased wave of insecurity in the Brahmaputra Valley.
- ♣ In order make the move successful, the Central Government will now have to amend Article 345. If amended, the article will remove fears of people fighting for their rights to culture and language in the region.

- During his visit, the chief has scheduled to visit operational and training establishments of the Egyptian Air Force. Also, he will interact with senior officials of the Egyptian armed forces.
- India is the fourth largest trading partner of Egypt following US, Italy and Saudi Arabia. The trade between the countries has been tradition. India imported 1.29 billion USD worth goods (2017-18) and exported 2.39 billion USD worth goods.

5. Oxygen Parlour opened at Nashik Railway Station to combat Air Pollution.

The initiative seeks to provide an experience of breathing clean air to the commuters. It has been set up by Indian Railways in collaboration with Airo Guard, a one of the leading consultancies in field of plant nurseries based in Nashik.
- The objective behind setting up Parloue is to expand this initiative to every railway station as well as every home.
- There are nearly 1500 plants in Oxygen Parlour, so, these plants can directly and effectively bring down the pollution in the air at the railway station and allow the people to breathe cleaner air. The concept of Oxygen Parlour is based on recommendation of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA).

7. Cabinet approves creation of the post of Chief of Defence Staff in the rank of four star General

- The Cabinet approved creation of post of Chief of the Defence Staff, CDS which was announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his Independence Day address this year.
- The post of Chief of Defence Staff will be the rank of 4-Star General with salary equivalent to Service Chiefs and will head the Department of Military Affairs to be created under Ministry of Defence and will function as its Secretary.
- The Cabinet also gave ex-post facto approval for official amendments to the Arms (Amendment) Bill, 2019 moved and passed by the Lok Sabha.

8. CM of Delhi Arvind Kejriwal introduced a new policy to make Delhi the capital of Electric vehicles.

- Lunder the policy, the government has planned to provide subsidies to electric vehicles.
- The goal of the policy is to ensure that 25% of new vehicles registered are electric by 2024. Along with electric vehicles, the government has also planned to construct 250 charging stations. It also includes 20% of the parking enabled for electric vehicles.
- The policy has been drafted after feedback from UNEP (United Nations Environment Programme) experts, International Transport Council. The draft of the policy was already made public in November 2018.

9. PM Modi launches Atal Bhujal Yojana, names Rohtang tunnel after former Prime Minister.

- ♣ Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the Atal Bhujal Yojana, a scheme aimed at improving groundwater management, on the occasion of 95th birth anniversary of former prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee. He said this scheme will help in supplying water to every house hold by 2024.
- ♣ Under Atal Bhujal scheme, the government will promote Panchayat led ground water management and behavioural change with primary focus on demand side management.
- The central government scheme stresses on the need to use technology to prevent wastage of water in various spheres, including agriculture.
- The Cabinet also approved a decision to honour the contribution of ex-PM Atal Bihari Vajpayee by naming the strategic tunnel under Rohtang Pass after him.

12. Govt of India to launch 'Digital Radio' by 2024.

- ♣ Centre government is planning to revamp 'All India Radio' officially known as 'Akashvani' by introducing Digital Radio in India by 2024, when the country will be technologically equipped for it.
- The announcement in this regard was made by Union Information and Broadcasting (I&B) Minister Prakash Javadekar at the 2019 Akashvani Annual Awards in New Delhi.
- AIR was established in 1936 and is officially known as Akashvani since 1956. It is the national public radio broadcaster of India and is a division of Prasar Bharati, which is India's largest public broadcasting agency. AIR is sister service of Prasar Bharati's Doordarshan television Network.

13. Tamil Nadu tops 'Good Governance Index' launched by Govt of India.

- The Central Government has released the "Good Governance Index" on the occasion of Good Governance Day.
- The "Good Governance Index" was launched to assess the state of governance in Indian States and Union Territories.
- The prime objective of the GGI is to provide quantifiable data to compare the state of governance in all states and Union Territories, enable them to formulate and implement suitable strategies for improving governance and shift to result oriented approaches and administration. The Index was launched by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, and the Centre for Good Governance.

- Among the "Big States", Tamil Nadu topped the Good Governance Index. The poor performers are Odisha, Bihar, Goa, and Uttar Pradesh with Jharkhand finishing last in the group.
- Among the "North-East and Hill States", Himachal Pradesh topped the index, followed by Uttarakhand, Tripura, Mizoram and Sikkim.
- > The worst performers in this group are Jammu and Kashmir, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland, with Arunachal Pradesh finishing last in the group.
- Among the "Union Territories", Puducherry topped the index followed by Chandigarh and Delhi. Lakshwadeep is the worst performing UT.

16. All new Railway recruits to be inducted through UPSC civil services exams.

- The Railway Board has now decided that all new recruits in railways will be inducted through UPSC (Union Public Service Commission) Civil Services Exams under five specialities.
- The decision comes days after the Union Cabinet approved big-ticket reforms in the railways by merging its eight cadres and department services into one single entity- the Indian Railway Management Service (IRMS).
- This decision to merge services was to ensure that officers put railways first instead of their service which had become the case under the present system.

- Turkey's Constitutional Court ruled that the government's ban on access to online encyclopedia Wikipedia violated freedom of expression.
- → The ban imposed by Turkey's Information and Communication Technologies Authority (BTK) has remained in place since April 2017.
- Turkish officials said at the time the measure was needed as Wikipedia had failed to remove content deemed false from its pages that linked Turkey with terror groups.

20. India ranks 47th in house price appreciation during July, September.

- India ranks 47th in the world in terms of appreciation in housing prices as rates grew by only 0.6 percent during the July-September quarter over the year-ago period on slow demand, global property consultant Knight Frank.
- ♣ India stood at 11th position in the April-June quarter of 2019, with a 7.7 percent year-on-year rise in home prices.
- Hungary leads the index this quarter with 15.4 percent annual price growth, followed by Luxembourg at 11.4 percent and Croatia at 10.4 percent Slovakia is at number four with the home price rising by 9.7 percent, followed by Latvia (9 percent), Czech Republic (8.7 percent), China (8.5 percent), Jersey (8.5 percent), Mexico (8.4 percent) and Russia (8.1 percent).

21. Nepal bans Indian vehicles on Pokhara roads ahead of new year.

- Nepal banned vehicles with Indian number plates from running in the tourist hub of Pokhara ahead of the new year.

1. Eight West African countries rename common currency to Eco.

- The eight West African nations have agreed to change the name of their common currency from 'CFA franc' to 'Eco', after they jointly severed the CFA franc's links to former colonial ruler France.
- 4 The announcement was made during a visit by French President Emmanuel Macron to Ivory Coast, who hailed the decision as a historic reform. Even though the deal took six months in making, common currency Eco will see the light of day in 2020.
- The 8 West African countries namely- Ivory Coast, Mali, Burkina Faso, Benin, Niger, Senegal, Togo and Guinea-Bissau currently use CFA France as their currency. All these countries, except Guinea-Bissau, are former French colonies.

2. Archaeologist R. Nagaswamy honoured at the Silver Jubilee International Conference of Art in Dhaka.

- Archaeologist R. Nagaswamy was honoured at the Silver Jubilee International Conference of Art in Dhaka by Bangladesh culture minister K.M.Khalid for his contribution to art, archaeology, history and culture.

3. India-Brazil MoU on Bio energy Cooperation gets Cabinet approval.

Union Cabinet has given its approval for signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Republic of India and Federative Republic of Brazil on Bio energy Cooperation.

In 2016, during the meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President of Brazil in India, the two sides agreed to cooperate on research and development (R&D) of renewable energies, and in field of 2nd-generation biofuels.

Therefore, in this regard, an MoU was also signed between two sides to provide a framework to cooperate as well as to promote investment in biofuel, bioelectricity and biogas supply-chains including industrial conversion, feedstock, distribution and end use sectors.

4. Russia 'only country in world' with hypersonic weapons: Prez Putin.

- ♣ President Vladimir Putin that Russia is the only country in the world that has hypersonic weapons. Speaking at a meeting with top military brass, Putin said that for the first time in history Russia has an edge in designing a new class of weapons unlike in the past when it was catching up with the United States.
- He said that the first unit equipped with the Avangard hypersonic glide vehicle is set to go on duty this month, while that the air-launched Kinzhal hypersonic missiles already have entered service.
- Putin said that the missile flies 10 times faster than the speed of sound, has a range of more than 2,000 kilometers (1,250 miles) and can carry a nuclear or a conventional warhead.

6. UN gives green light to draft treaty to combat cybercrime.

- **UN** General Assembly approved it will start the process of drafting a new international treaty to combat cybercrime over objections from the European Union, the United States, and other countries.
- Russian-drafted resolution was approved by the 193-member world body by a vote of 79-60 with 33 abstentions. The resolution establishes an expert committee representing all regions of the world to elaborate a comprehensive international convention on countering the use of information and communications technologies for criminal purposes. It says the committee will meet in August 2020 to agree on an outline of its activities.

1. Manuel Marrero Cruz appointed as Cuba's first PM in more than 40 years.

- Cuban President Miguel Diaz-Canel has appointed Manuel Marrero Cruz as the country's first Prime Minister in more than four decades (40 years).
- Marrero Cruz who was named Prime Minister for a five-year term, has served as Cuban tourism minister for 16 years. He is an architect by trade and has helped boost Cuba's economy by making tourism one of the engines of growth.
- The post of Prime Minister was scrapped in 1976 by the then-revolutionary leader and Cuba's last Prime Minister Fidel Castro. In December 1976, Fidel Castro took the title of president of the State Council, which replaced the posts of President and Prime Minister.

2. Asia's richest man Mukesh Ambani adds \$18 billion to his fortune in 2019.

- Narendra Modi government approved the appointment of Indian ambassador to the United States Harsh Vardhan Shringla as the next foreign secretary. He replaced Vijay Gokhale. He is the 33rd foreign secretary of the country.
- Harsh Vardhan Shringla would take over next month after the completion of Vijay Gokhale's two-year term on January 28, 2020.
- 4 A 1984-batch Indian Foreign Service (IFS) officer and a fluent French speaker, Harsh Vardhan Shringla served as an ambassador to Bangkok from 2014 to 2016 and later as a High Commissioner to Dhaka for two years.
- Harsh Vardhan Shringla has also served at UNESCO in France, the UN in New York besides Vietnam, Israel, and South Africa.

1. Gross NPA ratio improves to 9.1% at Sept end from 11.2% y-o-y: RBI.

As the bad loan recognition process nears completion, the health of the banking system has improved with the gross non-performing loan ratio remaining stable at 9.1 per cent as of September-end, the same level as in FY19, according to the RBI.



- However, the numbers indicate major improvement on a full-year basis, as in FY18 the ratio stood at a high of 11.2 per cent and slipped to 9.1 per cent in FY19, the RBI said in its annual report on trends and progress of banking in 2018-19.
- ➡ "The gross NPA (Non Performing Asset) ratio of all banks declined in FY19 (to 9.1 per cent from 11.2 per cent in FY18) after rising for seven consecutive years, as recognition of bad loans has neared completion," RBI said in the report.

1. India successfully test-fires Quick Reaction Surface to Air Missile (QRSAM) system.

- 4 Quick Reaction Surface to Air Missile System (QRSAM) developed by DRDO has been successfully flight tested from Integrated Test Range in Odisha's Chandipur.
- The missile was flight tested with full configuration in deployment mode intercepting the target in midair and meeting mission objectives. The entire event was monitored by Ground Telemetry Systems, Range Radar Systems, Electro Optical Tracking System, etc.
- ♣ QRSAM weapon system, which operates on the move, comprises of fully automated Command and Control System, Active Array Battery Surveillance Radar, Active Array Battery Multifunction Radar and Launcher. Both radars are four walled having 360-degree coverage with search on move and track

2. NPL scientists develop ink to stop fake passports and currency notes.

- The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and National Physical Laboratory (NPL) developed an ink to combat the problem of fake printing of passports and counterfeiting of currency notes. The ink has a new security feature of protecting itself against duplicity.
- The ink was produced based on single excitable dual emissive luminescent pigment. It was developed based on the concept of fluorescence and phosphorescence phenomena. Currently, the currency notes display only one color with the emission of wavelength. However, in the ink developed by the scientists, features change in pigment color after the notes are printed.


