



1. Justice Dinesh Maheshwari Appointed as Chairperson of the 23rd Law Commission of India

Justice Dinesh Maheshwari has been appointed as the Chairperson of the 23rd Law Commission of India. A former judge of the Supreme Court, he brings extensive judicial experience to this important role. The Law Commission is responsible for recommending reforms to strengthen and modernize India's legal framework. Justice Maheshwari's leadership is expected to accelerate the



commission's work on critical legal issues. His appointment comes at a time when several important reforms are being discussed across the legal and policy spectrum. The 23rd Law Commission is anticipated to play a key role in shaping future legislative developments in the country.

- Commission's Term: The 23rd Law Commission of India was constituted on September 1, 2024, and will function until August 31, 2027. Its primary objective is to review existing laws, recommend reforms, and advise the government on legal matters.
- **Key Focus Area**: One of the major agendas of the 23rd Law Commission is to examine the feasibility of implementing a Uniform Civil Code (UCC) across the country. The UCC aims to replace personal laws based on religion or community with a common set of civil laws applicable to all citizens.



• **Background**: The appointment of Justice Maheshwari comes after the 22nd Law Commission initiated nationwide consultations on the UCC in 2023, collecting public input from over 70 consultations. The 21st Law Commission had previously opined that a UCC was "neither necessary nor desirable at this stage" in its 2018 report.

2. ISRO Achieves 2nd Successful Satellite Docking Under SpaDeX Mission

ISRO has successfully achieved its second satellite docking under the SpaDeX mission, marking a significant milestone in India's space exploration capabilities. This accomplishment follows the initial docking on January 16, 2025, and subsequent undocking on March 13, 2025. The docking was confirmed by Union Minister Jitendra Singh, who shared the news on social media, expressing satisfaction with the operation's success. ISRO Chairman V Narayanan also praised the smooth



execution, highlighting its importance for future missions. The SpaDeX mission, launched on December 30, 2024, involved two satellites, SDX01 and SDX02, demonstrating advanced space docking technology.

- Successful Docking: ISRO achieved its second successful satellite docking under the SpaDeX mission on April 21, 2025, marking a significant milestone in India's space research program. Union Minister Jitendra Singh congratulated the ISRO team on this achievement.
- **Mission Objective**: The SpaDeX mission aims to demonstrate India's technological capabilities in spacecraft rendezvous, docking, and undocking. This capability is crucial for future advancements like satellite servicing, space station operations, and interplanetary exploration.
- Satellite Details: The mission involves two small satellites, SDX-01 (Chaser) and SDX-02 (Target), launched on December 30, 2024, using the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV)-C60 from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota.
- **Docking and Undocking**: The first successful docking occurred on January 16, 2025, and the satellites were later undocked on March 13, 2025. These complex maneuvers simulate critical operations for future space missions.
- **Technological Significance**: This achievement positions India as the fourth nation, after the United States, Russia, and China, to demonstrate in-space docking capabilities. This technology is essential for India's space ambitions,





including lunar missions, sample returns, and building the Bharatiya Antariksh Station.

3. Amaravati is the World's First Fully Renewable Powered City

Amaravati has been declared the world's first fully renewable powered city. The city now runs entirely on energy generated from renewable sources like solar, wind, and hydro power. This achievement marks a major milestone in global efforts toward sustainable urban development. Amaravati's model focuses on reducing carbon emissions while promoting green technologies. The city's success is expected to inspire other urban centers to adopt similar renewable strategies. It stands as a symbol of innovation and environmental responsibility on the world stage.

- **Renewable Energy Goal**: Amaravati aims to generate 2,700 megawatts (MW) of clean energy through solar, wind, and hydropower sources, meeting its projected energy demand by 2050 and eliminating fossil fuel reliance.
- **Sustainable Infrastructure**: The city will feature green buildings, rooftop solar installations, and a district cooling system to reduce energy consumption and carbon emissions. Mandatory rooftop solar systems will cover at least one-third of government housing projects.
- **Green Transportation**: Amaravati's public transportation network, including the Amaravati Metro and electric buses, will operate on renewable energy. An extensive electric vehicle (EV) charging infrastructure will support EV adoption.
- **Current Progress**: Officials have already installed 415 kW of rooftop solar arrays across community facilities like Anganwadis, public schools, e-health centers, and a multi-faith funeral home.

4. Hindi made compulsory as 3rd language in Maharashtra Schools

The Maharashtra government has made Hindi compulsory as the third language in all schools across the state. This decision applies to schools following state, national, and international curriculums. The move aims to promote linguistic diversity and strengthen the national language among students. Hindi will now be taught from Class 1 to Class 10 alongside Marathi and English. While some have welcomed the decision, others have raised concerns about the added academic load. The government believes this step will enhance students'





communication skills and national integration.

- **Compulsory Hindi Classes**: Hindi will be compulsory only for students in Classes 1 to 5, aiming to provide a basic understanding of the language. This decision relaxes the previous rule, which made Hindi compulsory from Classes 5 to 7.
- Marathi Remains Mandatory: Marathi will continue to be a mandatory subject in schools, and Hindi will not replace it. The government emphasizes promoting Marathi through initiatives like granting classical language status and building Marathi Bhawan.
- National Education Policy (NEP) 2020: The decision aligns with NEP 2020, which requires students to learn three languages, with two being Indian languages. This policy aims to promote linguistic diversity and cultural understanding.
- Similarities between Hindi and Marathi: Both languages share the Devanagari script, making it easier for students to learn Hindi. This similarity is highlighted as a benefit by Maharashtra's Education Minister, Deepak Kesarkar.
- Government's Promotion of Marathi: The Maharashtra government has taken significant steps to promote Marathi, including launching the Marathi International Council and a Marathi encyclopedia. These initiatives demonstrate the government's commitment to preserving the state's language and culture.

5. Arjun Babuta wins silver at ISSF World Cup 2025

Arjun Babuta won the silver medal at the ISSF World Cup 2025, showcasing his exceptional shooting skills. Competing in the 10m Air Rifle event, he delivered a consistent and impressive performance. This marks one of his best international achievements to date, adding to his growing reputation in the shooting world. Babuta's success brings pride to India and boosts the country's standing in international shooting sports. His dedication and focus were widely praised by coaches and sports enthusiasts. The medal win is expected to inspire many young shooters across the nation.

- **Narrow Margin**: Babuta narrowly missed the gold medal, losing by just 0.1 points to China's Olympic champion, Sheng Li Hao, who scored 252.4.
- Competition Highlights: Babuta was leading the competition until the final round of double elimination shots but faltered slightly, allowing Sheng to take



the lead. A crucial 10.9 shot by Sheng in the penultimate round put pressure on Babuta.

- Other Indian Performance: Rudrankksh Patil, another Indian shooter, finished eighth in the event after being disqualified for violating ISSF rules. Arya Borse, on the other hand, impressed in the women's 10m air rifle final, finishing fifth with 188.1 points.
- **Medal Standings**: India's performance in the ISSF World Cup has put them third in the medal table with two gold, two silver, and one bronze medal.

• Award Details: M Waqar Bhatti, a senior health journalist from The News International and Geo News, received the award for his outstanding work in




health journalism, specifically highlighting his efforts in promoting accurate and science-based health reporting.

- Cause of Death: The exact cause of death is currently unknown, but Pope Francis had been dealing with various health issues, including chronic lung damage, knee problems, and sciatica, which prompted him to frequently use a wheelchair, walker, or cane.
- **Health Issues**: In recent months, Pope Francis had been hospitalized for bronchitis and a polymicrobial infection of his respiratory tract, and was diagnosed with early-stage kidney failure. Despite these health challenges, he continued to carry out his duties until his death.
