

1. INSOUCIANCE (noun) : लापरवाही

Pronunciation: uhn·soo·see·uhns

Meaning: casual lack of concern; indifference.

Synonyms: nonchalance, unconcern, lack of concern

Antonyms: concern, interest, regard

Sentence: For all her apparent insouciance, she was desperately unhappy.

2. INKLING (noun) : आभास

Pronunciation: ing·kluhng

Meaning: a slight knowledge or suspicion; a hint.

Synonyms: idea, sense, notion

Antonyms: ignorance, oblivion, naivete

Sentence: The records give us an inkling of how people saw the world.

3. ACRIMONIOUS (adj.) : उग्र

Pronunciation: a·kruh·moh·nee·uhs

Meaning: (typically of speech or a debate) angry and bitter.

Synonyms: bitter, rancorous, caustic

Antonyms: caring, gentle, kind

Sentence: Their marriage ended eight years ago in an acrimonious divorce.

4. MISCONCEIVE (verb) : गलत धारणा

Pronunciation: mis·kuhn·seev

Meaning: fail to understand correctly.

Synonyms: misunderstand, misinterpret, misapprehend

Antonyms: comprehend, enlighten, explain

Sentence: His arguments are totally misconceived.

5. ADORATION (adj.) : आराधना

Pronunciation: a·duh·ray·shn

Meaning: deep love and respect.

Synonyms: love, devotion, worship

Antonyms: condemnation, disapproval, disdain

Sentence: He gazed at her with pure adoration.

6. UBIQUITY (noun) : हर जगह पर होना

Pronunciation: yoo·bi·kvuh·tee

Meaning: the fact of appearing everywhere or of being very common.

Synonyms: common, ordinary, omnipresent

Antonyms: rare, seldom, uncommon

Sentence: The ubiquity of mobile phones means you don't really need a watch.

7. OBTRUDE (verb) : हस्तक्षेप करना

Pronunciation: uhb·trood

Meaning: become noticeable in an unwelcome or intrusive way.

Synonyms: intrude, meddle, interfere

Antonyms: disregard, ignore, neglect

Sentence: I don't want to obtrude upon her privacy.

8. QUANTIFIABLE (adj.) : मात्रात्मक

Pronunciation: kvawn·tuh·fai·uh·bl

Meaning: able to be expressed or measured as a quantity.

Synonyms: calculate, cipher, compute

Antonyms: imperceptible, insignificant, undeterminable

Sentence: The number of websites on the Internet is not quantifiable.

9. INFAMY (noun) : बदनामी

Pronunciation: in·fuh·mee

Meaning: the state of being well known for some bad quality or deed.

Synonyms: notoriety, disrepute, disreputableness

Antonyms: esteem, honor, respect

Sentence: Despite her eventual pardons, she could never completely free herself of the infamy of being named a war criminal.

10. CREDULOUS (adj.) : विश्रंभी

Pronunciation: kreh·joo·luhs

Meaning: having or showing too great a readiness to believe things.

Synonyms: gullible, naïve, impressionable

Antonyms: doubting, incredulous, careful

Sentence: Credulous people are easily misled by false advertisements.

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
