1. AMASSING (verb) – एकत्र करना

Pronunciation: uh·mas·uhng

Meaning: gather together or accumulate (a large amount or number of valuable material or things) over a period of time.

Synonyms: gather, collect, assemble

Antonyms: dispel, disperse, dissipate

Sentence: Starting from nothing he had amassed a huge fortune.

2. DISARRAY (noun) – उधेड़-बुन

Pronunciation: dis·uh·ray

Meaning: a state of disorganization or untidiness.

Synonyms: disorder, confusion, chaos

Antonyms: order, orderliness

Sentence: This left the Liberal Party in total disarray.

3. DESIST (verb) – बंद कर देना

Pronunciation: duh·zist

Meaning: cease; abstain.

Synonyms: abstain, refrain, forbear

Antonyms: actualize, appear, star

Sentence: The shopping center agreed to desist from false advertising.

4. SLUMP (noun) – मंदी

Pronunciation:sluhmp

Meaning: a sudden severe or prolonged fall in the price, value, or amount of something.

Synonyms: steep fall, plunge, drop

Antonyms: development, growth, progress

Sentence: The economy is in a slump.

5. PROBITY (noun) – ईमानदारी

Pronunciation – proh·buh·tee

Meaning: the quality of having strong moral principles; honesty and decency.

Synonyms: integrity, honesty, uprightness

Antonyms: deceit, deceitfulness, dishonesty

Sentence: Probity and purity will command respect everywhere.

6. CHARY (adj) – चौकस

Pronunciation: cheuh·ree

Meaning: cautiously or suspiciously reluctant to do something.

Synonyms: cautious, circumspect, heedful

Antonyms: careless, heedless, incautious

Sentence: Banks were chary of lending the company more money.

7. COALESCE (verb) – सम्मिलित

Pronunciation: koh·uh·les

Meaning: come together to form one mass or whole.

Synonyms: unite, join together, combine

Antonyms: separate, sever, split

Sentence: There they coalesce to form a single nucleus.

8. ANIMOSITY (noun) – बैर

Pronunciation: a·nuh·maw·suh·tee

Meaning: strong hostility.

Synonyms: antipathy, hostility, antagonism

Antonyms: amity, cordiality, friendliness

Sentence: There is no personal animosity between the party leaders.

9. RANSACK (verb) – लूटना

Pronunciation: ran·sak

Meaning: go hurriedly through (a place) stealing things and causing damage.

Synonyms: plunder, pillage, steal from

Antonyms: give, offer, neglect, order

Sentence: Burglars ransacked her home.

10. NAIVE (adj) – अनाड़ी

Pronunciation: nai·eev

Meaning: (of a person or action) showing a lack of experience, wisdom, or judgment.

Synonyms: childish, immature, inexperienced

Antonyms: cosmopolitan, experienced, sophisticated

Sentence: The rather naive young man had been totally misled.



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
