1. RECONCILER (noun) : सुलहकर्ता

Pronunciation: *reconciler*

Meaning: a person who brings about peace, especially by reconciling adversaries.

Synonyms: conciliator, peacemaker, arbitrator

Antonyms: rabble-rousers, protesters, agitators

Sentence: He is the great reconciler and harmonizer.

2. FLEECE (verb) : फ़ायदा उठाना

Pronunciation: flees

Meaning: obtain a great deal of money from (someone), typically by overcharging or swindling them.

Synonyms: swindle, cheat, defraud

Antonyms: undercharge, gutlessness, linger

Sentence: Swindlers who use the telephone to fleece senior citizens out of their savings.

3. VAMOOSE (verb) : जल्दी से निकल जाना

Pronunciation: va·moos

Meaning: depart hurriedly.

Synonyms: depart, exit, walk out

Antonyms: arrive, come

Sentence: We'd better vamoose before we're caught.

4. COLLUDE (verb) : सांठगांठ

Pronunciation: kuh·lood

Meaning: cooperate in a secret or unlawful way in order to deceive or gain an advantage over others.

Synonyms: combine, conspire, collaborate

Antonyms: differ, disagree, split

Sentence: He accused his opponents of colluding with one another.

5. EMOLUMENT (noun) : वेतन

Pronunciation: uh·maw·lyoo·muhnt

Meaning: a salary, fee, or profit from employment or office.

Synonyms: payment, fee, charge

Antonyms: debt, loss, penalty.

Sentence: The annual emolument for the director of the charity is officially only one dollar.

6. MULTIFARIOUS (adj.) : विविध

Pronunciation: muhl·tuh·feuh·ree·uhs

Meaning: many and of various types.

Synonyms: multiform, multiple, different

Antonyms: monolithic, alike, identical

Sentence: Spain is a composite of multifarious traditions and people.

7. FORGERY (noun) : जालसाजी

Pronunciation: fawj·uh·ree

Meaning: the action of forging or producing a copy of a document, signature, banknote, or work of art.

Synonyms: counterfeiting, fraudulent copying, fraudulent imitation

Antonym: original

Sentence: He spent 5 years in prison for forgery.

8. DOWNTRODDEN (adj.) : उत्पीड़ित

Pronunciation: dawn·trawd·uhn

Meaning: oppressed or poorly treated by people in power.

Synonyms: oppressed, subjugated, persecuted

Antonyms: invigorated, gladdened, encouraged

Sentence: In the year 1789 the downtrodden French peasantry turned upon their oppressors.

9. MANUMITTED (verb) : रिहा करना

Pronunciation: ma·nyoo·mit·uhd

Meaning: release from slavery; set free.

Synonyms: freed, liberated, released

Antonyms: enslaved, fettered, unfree

Sentence: Old Angus had never manumitted a single slave.

10. SULTRY (adj.) : उमसदार

Pronunciation: suhl·tree

Meaning: (of the air or weather) hot and humid.

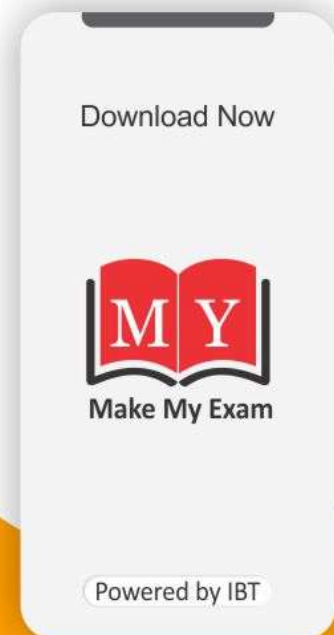
Synonyms: humid, tropical, torrid

Antonyms: algid, arctic, cool

Sentence: On really sultry days we go to the mall to hang out and cool off.

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
