1.REBOUND (verb) : उछाल

Pronunciation: ruh.bownd

Meaning: to recover in value, amount, or strength after a decrease or decline

Synonym: Recover, Bounce back, recoil

Antonym: Decline, Deteriorate, cause

Sentence: The stock market rebounded quickly after the initial shock of the economic downturn.

2.TRANSIENT (adjective): क्षणिक

Pronunciation: tran.zee.uhnt

Meaning: lasting or continuing for a short period of time

Synonym: Temporary, Fleeting, flying

Antonym: Permanent, Enduring, eternal

Sentence: The pain was transient, fading away as quickly as it had appeared.

3.EXUDE (verb): पसीजना

Pronunciation: uhgz.yood

Meaning: to discharge (moisture or a smell) slowly and steadily

Synonym: Emit, Radiate, discharge

Antonym: Conceal, Withhold, pour

Sentence: He exudes confidence in every situation, which reassures his team.

4.RESILIENT (adjective): लचीला

Pronunciation: ruh.zi.lee.uhnt

Meaning: able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

Synonym: Tough, Hardy

Antonym: Fragile, Vulnerable

Sentence: Resilient communities are those that can bounce back from disasters more quickly.

5.GAUGES (verb): मापना

Pronunciation: gayj.uhz

Meaning: to estimate or determine the magnitude, amount, or volume of

Synonym: Measure, Assess, meter

Antonym: Guess, Estimate, scale

Sentence: The engineer used a device to gauge the pressure inside the tank.

6.SPURRED (verb): प्रेरित

Pronunciation:spuhd

Meaning: motivate or encourage someone to do something

Synonym: Stimulate, Propel, prod

Antonym: Deter, Discourage, disincentive

Sentence: His early success spurred him to take on more challenging projects.

7.SUCCOUR (noun): परेशानी में सहायता

Pronunciation:suk.uh

Meaning: help or sympathy given to somebody who is suffering or has problems

Synonym: Aid, Relief, help

Antonym: Hindrance, Obstacle, frustration

Sentence: The charity provided succour to families affected by the disaster.

8.TAD (noun): थोड़ासा

Pronunciation: tad

Meaning: a small amount or degree; a little bit

Synonym: Bit, Smidgen, little

Antonym: Lot, Whole, plenty

Sentence: He's a tad late, but he'll be here soon.

9.AFFLICTING (verb) : पीड़ादेना

Pronunciation: uh.flikt.uhng

Meaning: cause pain or suffering to; affect or trouble

Synonym: Trouble, Torment, bother

Antonym: Comfort, Relieve, abet

Sentence: The disease has been afflicting the population for years, with no cure in sight.

10. INDEFATIGABLE (adjective) : अथक

Pronunciation:in.duh.fa.tuh.guh.bl

Meaning: never giving up or getting tired of doing something

Synonyms: tireless, untiring, relentless

Antonyms: lazy, indolent, listless

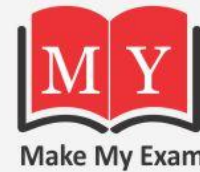
Sentence: One can only salute such indefatigable souls, and wish them success in their efforts.
