1.AKIN (adj) – सदृश्य

Pronunciation: ə-'kin

Meaning: of similar character.

Synonyms: similar, related, close

Antonyms: different, dissimilar, unlike

Sentence: Something akin to gratitude overwhelmed her.

2.BRASH (adj) – भंगशील

Pronunciation: brash

Meaning: self-assertive in a rude, noisy, or overbearing way.

Synonyms: assertive, arrogant, thrusting

Antonyms: gentle, mild, mousy

Sentence: He could be brash, cocky, and arrogant.

3.ACQUIT (verb) – बरी करना

Pronunciation: ac•quit

Meaning: free (someone) from a criminal charge by a verdict of not guilty.

Synonyms: absolve, clear, exonerate

Antonyms: criminate, charge, impeach

Sentence: She was acquitted on all counts.

4.FUROR (noun) – उत्तेजना

Pronunciation: fu•ror

Meaning: an outbreak of public anger or excitement.

Synonyms: commotion, uproar, outcry

Antonyms: calmness, peace, quiet

Sentence: The article raised a furor among mathematicians.

5.APPEASE (verb) – तुष्ट करना

Pronunciation: ap•pease

Meaning: pacify or placate (someone) by acceding to their demands.

Synonyms: conciliate, placate, pacify

Antonyms: anger, enrage, incense

Sentence: Amendments have been added to appease local pressure groups.

6.LUCRATIVE (adj) – लाभप्रद**Pronunciation:** lu•cra•tive**Meaning:** producing a great deal of profit.**Synonyms:** profitable, profit-making, gainful**Antonyms:** unprofitable, loss**Sentence:** The new manager's mission was to turn the failing store into a lucrative operation.**7.UNRELENTING (adj) – बेदरद****Pronunciation:** un•re•lent•ing**Meaning:** not yielding in strength, severity, or determination.**Synonyms:** implacable, inflexible, uncompromising**Antonyms:** flexible, relenting, yielding**Sentence:** The heat was unrelenting.**8.OCTOGENARIAN (noun) –अस्सी साल का बुढ़ा****Pronunciation:** oc•to•ge•nar•i•an**Meaning:** a person who is from 80 to 89 years old.**Synonyms:** Aged, elderly, long-lived**Antonyms:** Young, youthful, ageless**Sentence:** The octogenarian is making his TV writing debut.**9.LAUDABLE (adj) – प्रशंसनीय****Pronunciation:** laud•able**Meaning:** (of an action, idea, or goal) deserving praise and commendation.**Synonyms:** praiseworthy, commendable, admirable**Antonyms:** discreditable, illaudable, reprehensible**Sentence:** His noble ideas and polite behavior are laudable.**10.PROPEL (verb) – आगे बढ़ना****Pronunciation:** pro•pel**Meaning:** drive, push, or cause to move in a particular direction, typically forward.**Synonyms:** drive, push, shove**Antonyms:** stop, hold, repress**Sentence:** The boat is propelled by using a very long paddle.
