

## 1.ENERVATE (verb):- कमज़ोर करना

**Pronunciation:** ener•vate **Meaning:** cause (someone) to feel drained of energy or vitality; weaken. **Synonyms:** exhaust, tire, fatigue **Antonyms:** invigorate, strengthen, energize **Sentence:** I find this heat very <u>enervating</u>.

#### 2.TREPIDATION (noun) :- घबराहट

Pronunciation: treh•puhd•ay•shnMeaning: a feeling of fear or agitation about something that may happen.Synonyms: fear, apprehension, dreadAntonyms: bravery, courage, daringSentence: With some trepidation, I opened the door.

## 3.ADULTERATE (verb) :- मिलावटी

Pronunciation: adul•ter•ate
Meaning: render (something) poorer in quality by adding another substance, typically an inferior one.
Synonyms: make impure, degrade, debase
Antonyms: refine, purify, clean
Sentence: The food had been <u>adulterated</u> to increase its weight.

## 4.INTEMPERATE (adj.) :- असंयमी

**Pronunciation:** in•tem•per•ate **Meaning:** having or showing a lack of self-control; immoderate. **Synonyms:** immoderate, excessive, undue **Antonyms:** moderate, curbed, controlled **Sentence:** The judge's <u>intemperate</u> outburst almost caused a retrial.

## 5.FINESSE (noun) :- चालाकी

**Pronunciation:** fuh•nes **Meaning:** intricate and refined delicacy. **Synonyms:** skill, subtlety, expertise



**Antonyms:** clumsiness, incompetence, ineptitude **Sentence:** He is a true believer, but sadly lacks <u>finesse</u>.

## 6.WHEEDLED (verb) :- चापलूसी

Pronunciation: whee•dle
Meaning: use flattery or coaxing in order to persuade someone to do something or give one something.
Synonyms: blandished, blarneyed, cajoled
Antonyms: pestered, frankness, directness
Sentence: She wheedled her husband into buying a lottery ticket.

#### 7.RUFFIANS (noun) :- बदमाश

Pronunciation: ruf•fi•an
Meaning: a violent person, especially one involved in crime.
Synonyms: thug, roughneck, scoundrel
Antonyms: moral, decent, virtuous
Sentence: A gang of <u>ruffians</u> preying upon people who ventured into that section of town.

## 8.OSTENTATIOUS (adj.) :- दिखावटी

Pronunciation: os•ten•ta•tiousMeaning: characterized by vulgar or pretentious display; designed to impress or attract notice.Synonyms: showy, pretentious, obtrusive

Antonyms: quiet, understated, unflamboyant

Sentence: Actually, he has a lot of debt, he is just living an ostentatious life.

## 9.AMISS (adj.) :- अनुचित

Pronunciation: ə-'mis
Meaning: not quite right; inappropriate or out of place.
Synonyms: wrong, faulty, incorrect
Antonyms: faultless, flawless, impeccable
Sentence: There was something <u>amiss</u> about his calculations.

#### 10.AMASSING (verb) :- एकत्र करना

#### **Pronunciation:** uh•mas•uhng

**Meaning:** gather together or accumulate (a large amount or number of valuable material or things) over a period of time.

**Synonyms:** gather, collect, assemble **Antonyms:** dispel, disperse, dissipate



Sentence: Starting from nothing he had <u>amassed</u> a huge fortune.
