AIX Connect complete Merger with AI Express

The Air India Group announced that it has completed the merger of AIX Connect (formerly AirAsia India) with Air India Express (AIX), establishing it as its low-cost division. The DGCA stated that all aircraft from AIX Connect have been seamlessly transferred to AIX's Air Operator Certificate, ensuring that the combined entity's airline operations proceed without interruption. An updated air operator certificate was issued to signify the completion of the consolidation.

Foot notes:

- The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) announced the successful completion of the merger between AIX Connect and Air India Express.
- This merger marks a significant milestone in airline consolidation in India.
- The DGCA has granted the necessary regulatory approval for the merger.
- All aircraft from AIX Connect have been seamlessly transferred to AIX's Air Operator Certificate (AOC).
- This ensures that the operations of the combined entity continue without disruption, providing a safe and smooth experience for passengers.

Classical Language Status Granted to Marathi, Bengali, Pali, Prakrit and Assamese

The Union Cabinet granted classical language status to Marathi, Bengali, Assamese, Pali, and Prakrit. This move, which addresses long-standing demands, underscores India's rich linguistic heritage and seeks to preserve and promote these ancient languages.

- The concept of "Classical Languages" was introduced in 2004, with Tamil being the first to receive the status.
- Criteria for classical status include ancient texts over 1500-2000 years old, a rich literary heritage, and a distinct literary tradition.
- In 2024, the Linguistic Experts Committee (LEC) under Sahitya Akademi confirmed that Marathi, Pali, Prakrit, Assamese, and Bengali meet the criteria, leading to their inclusion.
- The decision mainly affects Maharashtra (Marathi), Bihar, Assam (Assamese), West Bengal (Bengali), and regions with Pali and Prakrit speakers like Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh.
- Recognition of these as Classical Languages promotes cultural exploration and preservation.



India Becomes Russia's No. 2 Supplier of Restricted Technology

India has become the second-largest supplier of restricted critical technologies to Russia, supplying microchips, circuits, and machine tools essential to Russia's economy and military during its war efforts. Only China surpasses India in these exports. Indian exports of restricted items surged to \$95 million in July 2024, up from \$60 million in previous months.

Foot notes:

- Officials reported that almost 20% of the sensitive technology used in Russia's military industrial complex comes from India.
- India is the second-largest supplier of sensitive technologies to Russia, after China.
- Nearly 20% of the technology used in Russia's military-industrial complex comes from India, according to officials.
- US and EU restrictions mainly target technologies found in Russian weaponry or crucial for their production.
- Some officials expressed concern over India's limited response when the issue was raised.

HAL Becomes 14th Maharatna Company

Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) has been granted Maharatna status, becoming the 14th Central Public Sector Enterprise (CPSE) to achieve this esteemed classification from the Government of India. This announcement, made on October 12, increases HAL''s operational autonomy and financial capabilities, enabling the company to invest up to 15% of its net worth in projects and up to Rs. 5,000 crore in foreign ventures without requiring government approval.

Foot notes:

- For Q1 FY25, HAL reported a net profit of 1,437.2 crore, marking a 76.5% increase from 814.2 crore in the same period last year.
- Revenue grew by 11% year-on-year, showcasing strong financial health.
- The Maharatna status grants HAL increased autonomy in decision-making.
- It allows HAL to pursue mergers, acquisitions, and strategic investments without prior government approval.
- This status is vital for boosting HAL"s ability to compete globally and undertake major projects in the defence sector.

Abu Dhabi Crowned World's Richest City in Sovereign Wealth Funds

As of October 2024, Abu Dhabi has been declared the world's richest city in terms of sovereign wealth, with an estimated capital of \$1.7 trillion. Other major cities, including Oslo, Beijing, Singapore, Riyadh, and Hong Kong, collectively manage two-thirds of the global sovereign wealth fund. This milestone underscores Abu Dhabi's financial strength and strategic

investments.

Foot notes:

- Abu Dhabi is the world's richest city in sovereign wealth, managing \$1.7 trillion as of October 2024.
- Global sovereign wealth fund assets total \$12.5 trillion as of October 1, 2024.
- Sovereign Wealth Funds (SWFs) are state-owned entities managing reserves for economic stabilization, future savings, and social programs.
- Their main objectives are long-term capital growth, revenue diversification, and economic stabilization.



Russia is Largest crude supplier to India

India's imports of Russian crude increased by 2.5% from April to September compared to the same period last year, reinforcing Russia's position as the largest seaborne crude supplier to India. Russia holds a 39% share of India's crude supply, followed by Iraq at 18% and Saudi Arabia at 13%.

Foot notes:

- Total oil imports to India increased by 4% this year, indicating a rise in demand.
- Russian oil supplies to India grew by 6.4% month-on-month in September, reaching 1.88 million barrels per day.
- As the third-largest oil consumer globally, India imports over 85% of its oil needs from more than 30 countries.
- Discounted crude prices from Russia significantly boost refiners' demand, according to analyst Serena Huang from Vortexa.
- The top three suppliers (Russia, Iraq, Saudi Arabia) have retained their rankings but have lost about 0.5% of their market share compared to last year.

Centre of Excellence Inaugurated by BCCI in Bengalore

The BCCI (Board of Control for Cricket in India) has inaugurated state-of-the-art facilities known as the Centre of Excellence on the outskirts of Bengaluru, also referred to as the New National Cricket Academy to enhance cricketing infrastructure. This world-class facility, envisioned by Board Secretary Jay Shah, aims to nurture the future of cricket.

The plant, set up in collaboration with Indian Oil Corporation, can produce three tonnes of natural gas daily from 100 tonnes of cow dung. Modi also launched development projects worth Rs 685 crore.

Sanskrit to Become Mandatory in 416 Uttarakhand Madrasas

The Uttarakhand Madrasa Education Board (UMEB) has proposed making Sanskrit a compulsory subject in 416 madrassas to strengthen the educational curriculum and support students' academic growth. The board is planning to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the state's Sanskrit department to formalize the change. This initiative will impact over 70,000 students, with discussions already underway and a formal proposal drafted.

Bihar Government to Establish Kaimur Wildlife Sanctuary as State's Second Tiger Reserve

The Bihar government is set to establish the Kaimur Wildlife Sanctuary (KWLS) as the state's



second tiger reserve. With the Valmiki Tiger Reserve (VTR) already at capacity, the government is finalizing plans to translocate some tigers to KWLS. The sanctuary covers an area of 1,504.96 square kilometers. Currently, VTR is home to 54 tigers. The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) has granted in-principle approval for developing KWLS into a tiger reserve during its 12th technical committee meeting.

- Paytm's onboarding was paused earlier in 2024 due to RBI directives.

India and the United States have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to expand and diversify critical minerals supply chains. The agreement aims to leverage the strengths of both countries for the exploration, extraction, processing, recycling, and related activities of critical minerals. It was signed by India's Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal and US Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo during the 6th India-US Commercial Dialogue in Washington, DC.

- Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal spoke about the MOU at the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington.
- He held individual meetings with William E. Conway Jr. of Carlyle Group and Julian Nebreda of Fluence Energy during the dialogue.



- At the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), he discussed India's aim to become a leading manufacturing destination and strengthen ties with global supply chains.
- The partnership focuses on fostering open supply chains, technology development, and investment flows.

India, Nepal and Bangladesh Sign Trilateral Agreement for Electricity Export

India, Nepal, and Bangladesh have signed a trilateral agreement to trade 40 megawatts of electricity, marking Nepal's first opportunity to sell electricity to a third country. The deal, finalized in Kathmandu on October 3, was signed by Kulman Ghising of the Nepal Electricity Authority, Mohammad Rezaul Karim of the Bangladesh Power Development Board, and Renu Narang of India's NTPC Vidyut Vyapar Nigam.

Foot notes:

- The signing of the agreement was witnessed by Nepal's Energy Minister Deepak Khadka.
- State Minister for Energy Purna Bahadur Tamang, and Bangladeshi Water Resources Minister Syeda Rizwana Hasan.
- Bangladesh will import 40 megawatts of electricity from Nepal, transmitted through Indian territory due to the lack of direct connection between Nepal and Bangladesh.
- Nepal plans to sell 144,000 MWh of electricity annually from mid-June to mid-November at a rate of 6.4 US cents per unit.
- Officials from all three countries hailed the agreement as historic, with Minister Khadka calling it a significant milestone for Nepal's energy sector development.

BPCL Partners with Mumbai Port Authority to launch India's first Green Fuel Ecosystem Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) has signed a memorandum of understanding with the Mumbai Port Authority and the Mumbai Port Sustainability Foundation (MPSF) to develop a state-of-the-art green fuel ecosystem at Mumbai Port. This initiative marks a significant step in India's transition to cleaner energy, aiming to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and support the country's climate goals. The press statement emphasized the commitment of BPCL and MPSF to promote sustainable practices in line with India's environmental stewardship.

- The agreement was signed in the presence of G. Krishnakumar, BPCL's chairman and managing director; Rahul Tandon, business head (I&C) of BPCL and Rajiv Jalota,
- chairperson of the Mumbai Port Authority.
- The MoU was formalized during the inauguration of the Cruise Bharat Mission, led by

Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal.

- Krishnakumar stated that the MoU aligns with BPCL's commitment to sustainability and aims for net zero emissions for Scope 1 and Scope 2 by 2040.
- He emphasized that promoting sustainable energy solutions like LNG and EV for the maritime sector reflects BPCL's social responsibility and partnership with the communities it serves.

India Signs Host Country Agreement with Global Biofuels Alliance

Shri Dammu Ravi, Secretary (ER) of the Ministry of External Affairs, and Shri Pankaj Jain, Secretary of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, signed the Host Country Agreement (HCA) between India and the Global Biofuels Alliance (GBA) today. The Union Cabinet approved the signing and ratification of the HCA, which will allow GBA to establish its Secretariat in India with both Indian and international staff.

- The HCA will grant GBA necessary legal status, including immunities and privileges under the United Nations (Privilege & Immunities) Act of 1947, facilitating its operations in compliance with Indian laws.
- The GBA, a unique multi stakeholder initiative, was launched during India's G20 Presidency by the Hon"ble Prime Minister and leaders from eight other countries
- India has emerged as the beacon of renewable energy and has already the International Solar Alliance (ISA) headquarters in Gurugram.

India Launches First Indigenous Multi-Purpose Vessel 'Samarthak'

On October 14, 2024, the Indian Navy achieved a key milestone with the launch of,,Samarthak," the first ship under the Multi-Purpose Vessel (MPV) project at L&T Shipyard in Kattupalli, Chennai. Shashi Tripathi, President of the Navy Welfare and Wellness Association, launched the vessel, with Admiral Dinesh K. Tripathi, Chief of Naval Staff, presiding over the ceremony. This launch underscores the Navy"s dedication to indigenous shipbuilding, supporting the Government of India"s "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" and "Make in India" initiatives.

- The Ministry of Defence signed a contract with L&T Shipyard to build two MultiPurpose Vessels (MPVs).
- The project aims to strengthen the Indian Navy's operational capabilities using advanced indigenous technologies.
- It is designed for various roles, including ship towing, target launching/recovery,

operating uncrewed autonomous vehicles, and testing indigenous weapons and sensors.

• The launch of "Samarthak" highlights the Navy"s commitment to indigenous shipbuilding and collaboration with private shipyards for enhanced national security.

India-Kazakhstan joint military exercise KAZIND-2024 begins

The Eighth edition of the India-Kazakhstan Joint Military Exercise, KAZIND-2024, began today in Uttarakhand. The Indian Armed Forces, represented by a battalion from the KUMAON Regiment, comprise 120 personnel. This exercise aims to improve joint military capabilities for counter-terrorism operations, focusing on semi-urban and mountainous terrains. It will also promote the sharing of best practices and enhance defence cooperation, interoperability, and camaraderie between the two armies.

Foot notes:

- The Indian Armed Forces are represented by 120 personnel, primarily from a battalion of the KUMAON Regiment, along with additional personnel from other services and the Indian Air Force.
- The Kazakh contingent mainly includes personnel from the Kazakhstan Land Forces and Airborne Assault Troopers, highlighting their commitment to strengthening bilateral military relations.
- KAZIND has been an annual exercise since 2016, facilitating tactical knowledge sharing and improved coordination between the two nations' military forces.
- The joint drills focus on counter-terrorism strategies, peacekeeping efforts and humanitarian assistance during natural disasters.

Arti Sarin became 1st Woman Officer as DG of AFMS

Surgeon Vice-Admiral Arti Sarin became the first woman to assume the role of Director-General of the Armed Forces Medical Services, responsible for military medical policies, the Defence Ministry announced. Sarin has served in all three branches of the Indian Armed Forces, starting as a Lieutenant in the Army, advancing to Surgeon Vice-Admiral in the Navy and also serving as an Air Marshal in the Air Force.

- Surgeon Vice-Admiral Arti Sarin will oversee medical policy matters for the armed forces.
- She is an alumna of the Armed Forces Medical College (AFMC) and was commissioned in December 1985.

- Sarin holds an MD in radiodiagnosis from AFMC and a Diplomate National Board in radiation oncology from Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai.
- She also received training in gamma knife surgery from the University of Pittsburgh.
- She was honoured with the Ati Vishisht Seva Medal in July 2024.

Safran Set to Launch Its First Electronics Unit in India

French defence conglomerate Safran Group plans to establish its first Defence Electronics unit outside France in India. This decision emerged during a strategic dialogue between India's NSA Ajit Doval and top French officials, including Emmanuel Bonne and Fabien Mandon. France will collaborate with India on advanced materials and metallurgy for military and civilian engine components.

Foot notes:

- The unit will focus on producing sensors and vital electronic components for military platforms, although the exact location is yet to be determined.
- French aircraft manufacturer Dassault Aviation SA is also expanding in India by acquiring land in Jevar, Uttar Pradesh, for a maintenance, overhaul, and repair (MRO) facility for Rafale fighters and civilian aircraft.
- These developments highlight the strengthening defence and aerospace partnership between India and France.



Kaksar Bridge Renamed in Honor of Kargil War Hero Capt. Amit Bhardwaj

Kaksar Bridge was renamed Capt. Amit Bhardwaj Setu in honor of Capt. Amit Bhardwaj"s sacrifice during the Kargil War. The renaming ceremony was attended by key military and civil officials, including CEC Dr. Mohd Jaffer Akhoon and Major General K. Mahesh, SM. **Foot notes:**

- Dr.Akhoon praised the Indian Army"s contributions in Kargil, including education and humanitarian efforts through the Sadbhavana Scheme.
- Capt. Bhardwaj"s sister, Sunita Dhonkaria, inaugurated a memorial at the bridge in his honor.



- Capt. Bhardwaj, from the 4 JAT Battalion, died heroically during a 1999 rescue operation against infiltrators in Kaksar.
- The bridge renaming serves as a lasting tribute to his courage and service.

ICMR signed MOU with NTPC Vidyut Vyapar Nigam

NTPC & Indian Army to Set Up Solar Hydrogen Microgrid in Ladakh

NTPC and the Indian Army have partnered to establish a solar hydrogen-based microgrid in Chushul, Ladakh. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated the project's foundation stone through video conferencing. This green hydrogen microgrid will replace diesel generators, providing sustainable energy for off-grid Army posts and is designed to operate reliably even in harsh winter conditions.

- **Microgrid Design**: NTPC has developed an innovative microgrid system that will generate 200 kW of power year-round using hydrogen for energy storage.
- **Replacement of Diesel Generators**: This project aims to replace existing diesel generators in remote Army locations at an altitude of 4,400 meters, where temperatures can drop to -30°C.
- Long-term Maintenance: NTPC will maintain the microgrid for 25 years, ensuring a reliable and sustainable power supply for soldiers in challenging environments.

- Advantages of Solar-Hydrogen Microgrid: The system integrates renewable energy, offers stable power in adverse conditions, reduces carbon emissions, and promotes a cleaner energy ecosystem with scalability for various applications.
- **Self-sufficiency in Ladakh**: Given Ladakh's high solar irradiance and low temperatures, the project enhances energy self-sufficiency and eliminates reliance on fuel logistics in remote areas.
- Additional Initiatives: NTPC has initiated a trial run of a hydrogen bus in Leh, along with plans for a hydrogen fueling station, a solar plant, and five fuel cell buses for intracity routes in Leh to support its renewable energy and carbon neutrality goals.

GRSE launches 7th Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft

The seventh Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW SWC), Abhay, was launched on October 25 at L&T, Kattupalli. Built by GRSE, Abhay is part of an eight-ship contract with the Ministry of Defence, set to replace the older Abhay-class ASW corvettes. With over 80% indigenous materials, the project supports Aatmanirbhar Bharat, boosting local production, employment, and self-reliance in defense shipbuilding.

- Vessel Series: The ship is the seventh in an eight-ship ASW SWC series, part of a 2019 contract between the Ministry of Defence (MoD) and GRSE.
- **Replacement Initiative**: Arnala-class ships will replace the existing Abhay-class ASW corvettes in service with the Indian Navy.
- **Operational Capabilities**: Designed for anti-submarine operations in coastal waters, these vessels also conduct Low-Intensity Maritime Operations (LIMO) and mine-laying activities.
- **Specifications**: Each 77-meter-long and 10-meter-wide warship is engineered for subsurface surveillance, capable of tracking surface and underwater targets, and conducting coordinated anti-submarine operations with aircraft.
- **Performance**: The ASW SWCs are waterjet-propelled, reaching speeds up to 25 knots, providing agility in tactical situations.
- Armament: Equipped with an advanced anti-submarine warfare suite, including lightweight torpedoes, ASW rockets, mines, a 30 mm Close-in Weapon System (CIWS), and 12.7 mm Stabilized Remote-Control Guns.
- **Surveillance Systems**: Fitted with Hull Mounted Sonar and Low-Frequency Variable Depth Sonar for comprehensive underwater detection and engagement in anti-submarine operations.



• **INS Abhay**: The lead vessel of the Abhay-class ASW corvettes, commissioned in 1989, is set for decommissioning after 35 years of service, making way for the new technologically advanced ASW platforms.

Indian weightlifter Maibam Martina Devi shatters national record

Competing at the junior world championships, teenage Indian weightlifter Maibam Martina Devi made headlines by breaking the senior national record in clean and jerk, as well as in total lift, in the women's +87kg weight category with an impressive performance in Leon. The 18-year-old from Manipur also improved her own junior national record in the snatch. However, she did not finish on the podium in any of the three categories.

- This lifted her to sixth place in the competition, a significant achievement for an 18yearold competing against some of the best junior weightlifters globally.

win the gold medal, breaking his previous record from earlier this year by more than seven seconds.

Top-ranked Jannik Sinner defeated Novak Djokovic in straight sets to claim the Shanghai Masters title on Sunday, marking his tour-leading seventh title of the season. Sinner outperformed the 24-time Grand Slam champion with a score of 7-6 (4), 6-3 in just 1 hour and 37 minutes, never facing a break point throughout the outdoor hard-court tournament. He recorded eight aces and 22 winners compared to Djokovic's four aces and 12 winners.

- Djokovic aimed for his 100th tour-level title and a fifth Shanghai title; only Jimmy Connors (109) and Roger Federer (103) have reached the century mark in men's tennis.
- The 23-year-old is now 8-2 against top-five opponents on hard courts this year, with both losses to Alcaraz, who attended the final.



- Djokovic, 37, was playing in China for the first time in five years and had also lost to Sinner in the Australian Open semifinals.
- His only title of the year came at the Paris Olympics, where he defeated Alcaraz for the gold medal.

Akhil Sheoran Wins Bronze medal in 50m rifle at ISSF World Cup Final

Akhil Sheoran secured the bronze medal in the men's 50m rifle 3-positions event, defeating Paris Olympics gold medallist Liu Yukun. Hungary's Istvan Peni clinched the gold. This marks India's 2nd medal in the year-ending ISSF World Cup. India had won a silver medal through Sonam Maskar in women's 10m air rifle. India's Simranpreet Kaur, who also made the eightshooter final, finished sixth.

The 35-yearold reached the landmark after scoring a half-century in India's second innings. In a recent series against Bangladesh, Kohli also became the fastest to reach 27,000 international runs, doing so in just 594 innings.

Pubudu Dasanayake appointed as mentor for Nepal's cricket team in ICC World Cricket League-2. The triangular series (Nepal, USA, Scotland) will be held in the USA from Oct 25 to Nov 4. Nepal''s first match is against the USA on Oct 27, followed by matches against Scotland on Oct 29 and Nov 4.

Bollipalli-Kadhe wins first ATP 250 Titles in Almaty

The pair of Rithvik Choudhary Bollipalli and Arjun Khade won the Almaty Open men's doubles title. The Indian pair fought with Colombia's Nicolas Barrientos and Skander Mansouri of Tinusia 3-6 7-6 14-12 to win their first ATP 250 title. Nagal, an Olympian and India's top singles player lost 6-4 7-6(2) against James Duckworth of Australia in the qualifiers in Basel. **Foot notes:**

• It was the maiden ATP doubles title for both players, and the win will move them into the top 100 of the world rankings on Monday.

- The title earned them \$54,780 and 250 ATP points, while the runner-up team received 150 points and \$29,310.
- The second set was tightly contested, with no service breaks until 6-6, and the Indian pair won the tie-breaker.
- Kadhe and Bollipalli saved five championship points and fought back from 6-9 down in the super tiebreak to claim the victory in 1 hour and 41 minutes.

New Zealand clinches historic Test win in India after 36 years

New Zealand secured their first Test win on Indian soil in 36 years, defeating the hosts by eight wickets on the final day of the opening match in Bengaluru. With a target of 107, the Black Caps overcame a fierce opening spell from Jasprit Bumrah (2/29 in 8 overs). Will Young (48) and Rachin Ravindra (39) put together an unbeaten 75-run partnership for the third wicket, guiding New Zealand to victory in 27.4 overs and giving them a 1-0 lead in the three-Test series.

- New Zealand's last Test win in India was in 1988 at Wankhede, Mumbai, where they beat India by 136 runs. India won that series 2-1.
- The second Test of the current series will be held in Pune from 24 October.
- India collapsed for 46 in 31.2 overs, their lowest-ever home Test total, with five batters dismissed for ducks.
- This was the first time India failed to cross 50 runs in a home Test innings. The previous lowest home Test total for India was 75 against the West Indies in 1987.



• India's overall lowest Test score remains 36, recorded against Australia in Adelaide in 2020.

Bala Devi Becomes First Indian Woman to Score 50 International Goals

Ngangom Bala Devi, born on February 2, 1990, has made history in Indian football by becoming the first Indian woman to score 50 international goals. As a forward for the Manipur Police and the Indian national team, Devi's journey showcases her commitment and vital contributions to women's football in India. Her recent milestone was celebrated after scoring against Pakistan in the 2024 SAFF Women's Championship, further establishing her as a trailblazer in Indian sports.

He accomplished the feat 785 balls faster than the previous record holder, Waqar Younis. Rabada's strike rate of 39.2, as of the end of Bangladesh's first innings in the ongoing Test in Mirpur, is the best among the 39 bowlers with 300-plus Test wickets. Dale Steyn follows with a strike rate of 42.3. **Foot notes:**



- Rabada's bowling average against the lower order (Nos. 8-11) is the best among 31 bowlers with at least 30 such wickets in the past 10 years, with a strike rate of 17.54 balls per wicket.
- Bumrah's average of 11.35 is the second-best against lower-order batters.
- Against the top seven batters, Rabada averages 27.17, ranking seventh among 42 bowlers with at least 60 such wickets in the last decade.
- The six bowlers ahead of him are Kyle Jamieson, Bumrah, James Anderson, Vernon Philander, Pat Cummins, and Morne Morkel.
- Rabada, with 11,817 deliveries to 300 wickets, surpassed Waqar Younis as the fastest bowler to reach this milestone in terms of balls bowled.

Deepika Kumari secures Silver Medal at Archery World Cup

India's top recurve archer, Deepika Kumari, claimed her fifth silver medal at the World Cup Final after a 0-6 loss to China's Li Jiaman in the gold medal match. Returning to the competition after a three-year break following the birth of her daughter in December 2022, the four-time Olympian was seeded third among the eight archers. Despite a smooth run to the semifinals, the pressure of the final seemed to affect Deepika against fourth-seed Li Jiaman, a team silver medalist from the Paris Olympics. This was Deepika's ninth appearance at the World Cup Final, where she has also won a bronze.

- The Archery World Cup final featured eight male and female archers in recurve and compound categories.
- Deepika defeated Yang Xiaolei of China 6-0 in the quarterfinals, followed by a narrow win over Mexico's Alejandra Valencia in the semifinals.



- India has won only two gold medals in the history of the U23 World Wrestling Championships: Aman Sehrawat (men's 57 kg) in 2022 and Reetika Hooda (women's 76 kg) last year.
- Reetika competed under the United World Wrestling flag last year due to a sanction on the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI).



- In addition to Reetika's gold, Indian wrestlers secured eight more medals last year, consisting of two silver and six bronze.
- This year's competition is expected to be tougher, as Iran, the third-most successful country in the event's history, returns after missing the previous edition.

Ravichandran Ashwin become highest wicket-taker in ICC WTC

In a remarkable display during the second Test against New Zealand in Pune, Ravichandran Ashwin achieved a new milestone by becoming the highest wicket-taker in the ICC World Test Championship (WTC). Starting the match just one wicket shy of Australian spinner Nathan Lyon, who led with 187 wickets, Ashwin's exceptional bowling performance allowed him to surpass Lyon, concluding the day with 189 WTC wickets.

- Ashwin entered the match with 186 WTC wickets and quickly made an impact by dismissing New Zealand captain Tom Latham for 15 runs, marking the ninth time he had removed Latham in his Test career.

- With these three wickets, Ashwin not only surpassed Nathan Lyon in the WTC but also moved ahead of him in the all-time Test wicket-takers list, boasting 531 wickets in 104 Tests compared to Lyon's 530 in 129 Tests.
- Washington Sundar, returning to Test cricket after three years, delivered a stellar performance, taking 7 wickets for 59 runs and helping bowl New Zealand out for 259 on day one.
- Ashwin's achievement as the highest wicket-taker in the WTC underscores his consistency and skill since the tournament's inception in 2019, excelling in various conditions and enhancing his legacy as one of India's all-time great spinners.

Indian Football Team Climbs to 125th in FIFA Rankings

The Indian men's football team has made slight progress in the FIFA rankings, moving up one spot to 125th, according to the latest update released on Thursday. This improvement is credited to their resilient 1-1 draw in a recent international friendly against Vietnam. Under new coach Manolo Marquez, the team is still seeking its first win, with one loss and two draws since his tenure began. Nonetheless, India's points have risen to 1133.78, boosting their position in the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) standings to 22nd, now just ahead of Vietnam.

• **Top FIFA Rankings**: Argentina remains in the lead with 1883.5 points, followed by France, Spain, England, and Brazil in the top five.

Phoebe named captain of Sydney Thunder in WBBL

Phoebe will lead the Sydney Thunder this season, making her the youngest full-time captain in WBBL history at 21 years and 193 days old. Previously, Hannah Darlington held the record for the youngest player to captain a WBBL match, stepping in for Rachael Haynes in 2021 at just 19 years and 262 days, also with the Thunder. Phoebe takes over the captaincy from Heather Knight, who led the team last year but is currently working to regain full fitness for the first game and will miss the latter part of the season due to international commitments.

- Phoebe made her WBBL debut on October 18, 2019, scoring 26 runs off 22 balls and followed it with a record 52, becoming the youngest player to achieve a half-century in WBBL history.
- She scored a total of 187 runs in 11 matches that season, solidifying her position in the team. To date, Phoebe has played 63 matches, amassing 1,212 runs with an average of 24.24 and a strike rate of 111.91.
- Last season, she achieved a personal best of 68 runs and totaled 309 runs over 14 matches, marking her highest season performance.
- In international play, Phoebe has quickly become a regular across formats since her debut in December 2022, averaging 40.75 in white-ball formats.
- She has scored 326 runs from 16 T20I innings at a strike rate of 148.18 and accumulated 652 runs from 19 innings, including two centuries and two fifties.
- The Thunder will begin their 10th WBBL campaign against the Hobart Hurricanes on October 28, followed by a rematch at North Sydney Oval on October 31.

David Baker won half of the 2024 Nobel Prize in Chemistry for his work on computational protein design, while the other half was awarded jointly to Demis Hassabis and John Jumper for their breakthroughs in protein structure prediction.

Urmila Chaudhary Receives Global Anti-Racism Championship Award 2024

Urmila Chaudhary from Nepal has been awarded the Global Anti-Racism Championship Award 2024, presented by Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken. This award recognizes six civil society leaders for their outstanding courage, leadership, and commitment to promoting racial equity, justice, and human rights. She is an abolitionist and labor activist who was rescued from child servitude at the age of 17. She co-founded the Freed Kamlari Development Forum and established 42 cooperatives to empower former bonded laborers. Currently, she is studying law to strengthen her fight against injustice.

- The Kamalari system in the Western Terai of Nepal involved the sale of girls and young women into indentured servitude for one-year contracts to wealthier, higher-caste buyers.
- On September 10, 2006, the Supreme Court of Nepal declared the Kamalari practice illegal, entitling former kamlaris to government compensation, education, and rehabilitation.
- Despite the ruling, the interim government failed to implement it, allowing the practice to persist.
- The suspicious death of 12-year-old Srijana Chaudhary in March 2013 reignited the movement, leading to mass protests demanding an end to the practice.
- In June 2013, the government officially abolished the Kamalari system and agreed to a 10-point plan for compensation, rehabilitation, and justice for abuse victims.

US-based Turkish preacher Gulen passed away
