

# VOCABULARY

## 1. CURSORY (ADJECTIVE): तीव्र

**Pronunciation:** kuh•suh•ree

**Meaning:** acting or done with excessive or careless speed.

**Synonyms:** hurried, rushed, hasty

**Antonyms:** deliberate, unhurried, unrushed

**Sentence:** He signed with only a cursory glance at the report.

## 2. FROWNED (VERB): क्रोध से देखना

**Pronunciation:** fraund

**Meaning:** to look with anger or disapproval.

**Synonyms:** glared, stared, scowled

**Antonyms:** smiled, grinned

**Sentence:** The boss just stood there and frowned at his assistant who, once again, was in trouble.

## 3. DELECTATION (NOUN): तुष्टि

**Pronunciation:** dee•lek•tay•shn

**Meaning:** pleasure and delight.

**Synonyms:** joy, delight, pleasure

**Antonyms:** unhappiness, misery, displeasure

**Sentence:** Tourists enjoying the delectations of this tropical paradise for the first time.

## 4. GELID (ADJECTIVE): ठंढा

**Pronunciation:** gel•id

**Meaning:** having a low or subnormal temperature.

**Synonyms:** icy, frigid, cold

**Antonyms:** hot, boiling, ardent

**Sentence:** Titanic passengers could not long survive the gelid waters of the North Atlantic.

## 5. CONDONE (VERB): ध्यान न देना

**Pronunciation:** kuhn•done

**Meaning:** to dismiss as of little importance.

**Synonyms:** ignore, forgive, overlook

**Antonyms:** note, mark, mind

**Sentence:** He is too quick to condone his friend's faults.

## 6. URBANE (ADJECTIVE): शिष्ट

**Pronunciation:** uh•bayn

**Meaning:** courteous and refined in manner (typically used of a man).

**Synonyms:** sophisticated, civilized, genteel

**Antonyms:** uncouth, boorish

**Sentence:** She describes him as urbane and charming.

## 7. ADDLEPATED (ADJECTIVE): उलझा हुआ

**Pronunciation:** ad•dle•pat•ed

**Meaning:** suffering from mental confusion

**Synonyms:** bewildered, dazed, confused

**Antonyms:** conscious, clearheaded, alert

**Sentence:** The addlepatated old man wandered into the wrong store, convinced he was at the bakery.

## 8. UNDERGIRD (VERB): संभालना

**Pronunciation:** uhn•duh•guhnd

**Meaning:** to hold up or serve as a foundation for.

**Synonyms:** sustain, support, carry

**Antonyms:** Undermine, Weaken

**Sentence:** The theory of evolution undergirds virtually all of modern biology.

## 9. RENASCENCE (NOUN): नवयुग

**Pronunciation:** ruh-nas-uhns

**Meaning:** the revival of something that has been dormant.

**Synonyms:** revival, rebirth, resurgence

**Antonyms:** death, extinction, expiration

**Sentence:** While, both revival and renascence are based on the new choice made by ourselves.
