

# VOCABULARY

## 1. INGRESS (NOUN): प्रवेश

**Pronunciation:** in•gres

**Meaning:** the action or fact of going in or entering.

**Synonyms:** entry, entrance, access

**Antonyms:** discharge, dismissal

**Sentence:** With limited *ingress* and egress to the freeway, the stadium is a frequent scene of bottlenecks.

## 2. FLOUTED (VERB): उल्लंघन

**Pronunciation:** flaut•uhd

**Meaning:** openly disregard (a rule, law or convention).

**Synonyms:** defy, refuse to obey, Disregarded

**Antonyms:** accepted, approved

**Sentence:** The union had openly *flouted* the law.

## 3. SWANKY (NOUN): दिखावटी

**Pronunciation:** svangk•ee

**Meaning:** Excessive or unnecessary display.

**Synonyms:** Pretentious, Showy, Flashy

**Antonyms:** Simple, Plain, modesty

**Sentence:** The leading lorry was a large and *swanky* affair.

## 4. DELECTATION (NOUN): तुष्टि

**Pronunciation:** dee•lek•tay•shuhn

**Meaning:** pleasure and delight.

**Synonyms:** joy, delight, pleasure

**Antonyms:** unhappiness, misery, displeasure

**Sentence:** Tourists enjoying the *delectations* of this tropical paradise for the first time.

## 5. GELID (ADJECTIVE): ठंढा

**Pronunciation:** JEL-id

**Meaning:** having a low or subnormal temperature.

**Synonyms:** icy, frigid, cold

**Antonyms:** hot, boiling, Warm

**Sentence:** Titanic passengers could not long survive the *gelid* waters of the North Atlantic.

## 6. CONDONE (VERB): ध्यान न देना

**Pronunciation:** kuhn•done

**Meaning:** to dismiss as of little importance

**Synonyms:** ignore, forgive, overlook

**Antonyms:** note, mark, mind

**Sentence:** He is too quick to *condone* his friend's faults.

## 7. URBANE (ADJECTIVE): शिष्ट

**Pronunciation:** uh•bayn

**Meaning:** courteous and refined in manner (typically used of a man).

**Synonyms:** sophisticated, civilized, genteel

**Antonyms:** uncouth, boorish, Rude

**Sentence:** She describes him as *urbane* and charming.

## 8. ADDLEPATED (ADJECTIVE): उलझा हुआ

**Pronunciation:** AD-uhl-pek-tid

**Meaning:** suffering from mental confusion.

**Synonyms:** bewildered, dazed, confused

**Antonyms:** conscious, clearheaded, alert

**Sentence:** The *addlepated* old man wandered into the wrong store, convinced he was at the bakery.

## 9. RENASCENCE (NOUN): नवयुग

**Pronunciation:** re•na•scence

**Meaning:** the revival of something that has been dormant.

**Synonyms:** revival, rebirth, resurgence

**Antonyms:** Decline, decay, destruction

**Sentence:** Both revival and *renascence* are based on the new choice made by ourselves.

## 10. BENEFACTOR (NOUN): दान देने वाला

**Pronunciation:** beh•nuh•fak•tuh

**Meaning:** One that helps another with gifts or money.

**Synonyms:** donor, Contributor, patron

**Antonyms:** Malefactor, Enemy, Opponent

**Sentence:** An anonymous *benefactor* gave the school a dozen new computers.
